Robert F. Williams taught English and Black Literature at Ferris State University for a decade.

Since coming to Ferris in 1970, Williams had been active outside the classroom, counseling students and helping organize and advise a variety of student activities.

Among his major loves was music. A former minister, Williams organized and led the Black gospel group. The Voices of Freedom Chorus, which for several years gave concerts both on and off campus.

His long-standing concern for students was perhaps best indicated by the 1974 Ferris Homecoming book dedicated to him, which said, “He counsels, and counsels, and counsels.”
