2006-07 Ferris State Record: 10-17, 8-10 GLIAC

BULLDOG BITES

✓**FSU BASKETBALL AT A GLANCE:** The Ferris State men's basketball team visits nationally-ranked archrival Grand Valley State for a Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) Tournament Quarterfinal game Tuesday (Feb. 27) evening. Tipoff is set for 8 p.m. (EST) inside GVSU's Fieldhouse Arena at Allendale, Mich.

✓**MEDIA COVERAGE:** Tuesday's game will be carried live locally by News Talk 1460 AM WBRN in Big Rapids with Rob Bentley providing the play-by-play coverage. A live audio-only webcast will be available on FSU's Athletics Website at www.ferris.edu/sports. In addition, live stats via Gametracker will be available over the internet at www.gvsulakers.com. GVSU will have live audio of Tuesday's game at www.gvsulakers.com.

✓**TICKET INFO:** Tickets are available through the Grand Valley State Athletics Ticket Office or Star Tickets Plus (800-585-3737). Adult tickets are \$8, kids through high school students and senior citizens are \$5. College students with a valid college ID are \$2. Grand Valley State's women's team will host Michigan Tech in tournament quarterfinal-round action prior to the men's game at 6 p.m. (EST).

✓**REMATCH SET:** Grand Valley State defeated the Bulldogs in Saturday's (Feb. 24) regular-season finale 75-68 at Jim Wink Arena. The game was played in front of the largest crowd (2,120) in the eight-year history of the facility Saturday was "Senior Night" as the Bulldogs honored guard **Julius Vines (Muskegon Heights)**, forwards **Terrance Shaw (Saginaw/Bridgeport)** and **Michael Daniels (Detroit/Murray-Wright)** along with director of operations **Frank Dye** prior to the final regular-season home contest.

✓**THE RECORDS:** The Bulldogs, who presently have won three of their last five outings, own a current 10-17 overall record and posted a third-place tying 8-10 GLIAC regular-season mark. GVSU holds a 24-3 overall mark and won the North Division with a 15-3 league record this campaign. FSU finished tied with both Saginaw Valley State and Michigan Tech in the divisional standings. Based on the GLIAC's tiebreaker formula, the Bulldogs received the final postseason bid over SVSU.

✓**FSU TOURNEY NOTES:** The Bulldog men, who defeated Northern Michigan 73-68 in the quarterfinal round (2/28/06) at Wink Arena last campaign, are 7-10 all-time in eight previous tournament appearances and advanced to the GLIAC Tournament Championship game last season before dropping an 80-58 decision in the title contest (3/3/06) at Grand Valley State. Ferris captured the 1997-98 league tourney title and will be making its fourth consecutive appearance in the tournament. FSU is 0-2 all-time versus GVSU in GLIAC Tournament action.

✓**GLIAC TOURNEY FIELD:** The other quarterfinal round games include Michigan Tech (#3 seed North) at Northern Michigan (#2 seed North), Ashland (#4 seed South) at Findlay (#1 seed South) along with Wayne State (#3 seed South) at Mercyhurst (#2 seed South). The WSU-MC game will take place Tuesday at 7 p.m. (EST) with the other two games starting at 7:30 p.m. The semifinals and finals will be held Friday and Saturday, March 2-3, at the site of the highest remaining seed. Findlay is the top overall seed in the tournament.

✓**LAST CAMPAIGN:** Ferris State posted an 18-13 overall mark en route to making its second consecutive NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament berth during the 2005-06 campaign. FSU posted a second-place 13-5 mark in GLIAC North Division regular-season action after claiming back-to-back league crowns in 2003-04 and 2004-05. Ferris also received GLIAC Tournament runner-up accolades last season.

✓**TWO YEARS AGO:** Ferris State capped off a banner 2004-05 season with a runner-up finish in the NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament (March 12-15) held in Findlay, Ohio. FSU reached the regional championship game for only the third time in school history. The Bulldogs, who won their second-straight GLIAC North Division Championship in 2004-05, concluded the year with a 24-7 overall record and fell one game shy of advancing to the NCAA-II Elite Eight for the second time ever. FSU's 24 victories represented the third-most wins in school history.

✓**HEAD COACH BILL SALL:** A 1994 Calvin graduate, fifth-year FSU head coach **Bill Sall** previously held assistant coaching positions at Calvin (1992-95), Ferris State (1995-98) and Hillsdale (1998-02) prior to being named Ferris State's 11th head coach. The Zeeland, Mich., native served as Ferris' interim head coach for a portion of the 1995-96 campaign and led the Bulldogs to a 5-8 mark. Before joining the coaching ranks, Sall was a standout player at Calvin from 1985-90. He twice (1989-90) received second-team National Association of Basketball Coaches Division III All-America honors and led Calvin to three Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAA) championships, four NCAA-III Tournament bids and the 1990 NCAA-III Final Four. Sall has a current 82-74 (.526) career mark.

✓**THE BULLDOG TRADITION:** The 2006-07 campaign marks the 79th season of Bulldog men's basketball. The program began in 1925 although Ferris did not field a team from 1942-45 due to World War II. FSU has compiled a 944-873 (.520) all-time mark. The Bulldogs have won 11 GLIAC titles, made eight NCAA Division II Tournament appearances and reached the 1988 NCAA-II Elite Eight. Ferris captured a league-record four consecutive GLIAC titles from 1986-90.

✓**THE TEAM CAPTAINS:** The senior trio of forwards **Terrance Shaw** and **Michael Daniels** along with guard **Julius Vines** are serving as FSU's team captains this year.

✓**THE BULLDOG ROSTER:** Ferris' 2006-07 roster includes three seniors, four juniors, two sophomores and six freshmen. Eight of the 15 players are guards while the remaining seven are frontcourt players. All 15 players on the Bulldogs' 2006-07 roster hail from Michigan.

MORE BULLDOG NOTES

✓ **BULLDOG HISTORY:** Ferris State's impressive basketball tradition includes 11 GLIAC titles, eight NCAA Division II Tournament appearances and a berth in the 1988 NCAA-II Elite Eight. Ferris, which last won the GLIAC Tournament championship during the 1997-98 campaign, captured a league record four consecutive conference titles from 1986-90. FSU has won more GLIAC Championships (11) than any other league member.

✓ **RANKINGS INFORMATION:** FSU was listed among other teams receiving votes with four points in the National Association of Basketball Coaches Division II Preseason Top 25 Poll. Defending NCAA-II National Champion Winona State (Minn.) is presently ranked first nationally in the latest poll (Feb. 20). GLIAC members Findlay and Grand Valley State are listed 3rd and 10th, respectively, in the current rankings. Southern Indiana was ranked 5th in the poll from the Great Lakes Region Findlay is ranked first in the most recent (Feb. 21) NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Rankings with GVSU listed third.

✓ **TURNING IT AROUND:** The Bulldogs had posted only a 21-82 (.204) mark in the four seasons prior to head coach **Bill Sall's** arrival, but have since went 77-66 (.538) and claimed two divisional titles while making two NCAA-II Tournament appearances in his four previous seasons at the helm. FSU won only four games (4-22) the year before Sall arrived in 2001-02.

✓ **BULLDOG BITES:** Freshman guard **Anthony Sydnor (Muskegon Heights)** was honored as the GLIAC North Division Player of the Week once this year (Jan. 29) **Terrance Shaw** became only the 25th player in school history to notch his 1,000th career point at Mercyhurst (Jan. 18) Ferris needs six wins to record the school's 950th all-time win **Michael Daniels** notched his 550th career board in Saturday's game and is only 55 points shy of becoming the 26th player in school history to score 1,000 career points.

✓ **GLIAC TOURNEY NOTEBOOK:** The tournament remains on campus sites this season for the fifth year in a row. Prior to the 2002-03 season, the four previous tournaments were held at a neutral site location, with the final three taking place at the DeltaPlex in Grand Rapids, Mich. The winner of this season's GLIAC Tournament will receive the league's automatic berth into the NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament slated for March 10-13 at a site to be determined.

✓ **WHAT A CHANGE:** Ferris State has notched its fifth-straight 10-plus win campaign this year. Prior to the current stretch under fifth-year head coach **Bill Sall**, the Bulldogs had not won more than eight games in the previous four seasons.

✓ **MOVING INTO THE TOP 10:** FSU's **Jessie York (Muskegon Heights)** moved into 10th place on the school's all-time three-point chart at Lake Superior State (Feb. 17). York presently has 108 career made treys. In addition, he presently ranks 11th in career three-point shooting percentage (.376) on the school's all-time list.

✓ **HARD TO MISS:** FSU's **Julius Vines** currently ranks first on the school's all-time list in free throw percentage (.845) based on a minimum of 100 attempts. In addition, his current .873 (55-63) effort from the line this year is listed second on the program's seasonal list.

✓ **THIS IS OUR MONTH:** Ferris State has won 22 of its last 28 games held in the month of February dating back to the 2003-04 season. The Bulldogs, who are presently 3-3 overall this month, tallied a perfect 8-0 record in February two years ago (2004-05).

✓ **FERRIS PICKED SECOND:** Ferris State was picked to finish second in the 2006-07 GLIAC Men's Basketball Coaches Preseason North Division Poll. The Bulldogs totaled 27 points but had no first-place votes in the balloting, which was conducted by the conference's head coaches. Defending GLIAC North Division Champion Grand Valley State was selected as the divisional favorite as the Lakers recorded 36 points along with six first-place votes. Findlay took the top spot in the South Division. The league's 13 head coaches voted for the division in which they play.

FERRIS STATE VS. GRAND VALLEY STATE NOTEBOOK

✓ **SCOUTING GRAND VALLEY STATE:** Grand Valley State, which claimed a second consecutive GLIAC North Division title this season, is led in scoring by junior guard Jason Jamerson (14.0 ppg). The Lakers, who are guided by third-year head coach Ric Wesley, were 17-4 overall during the 2005-06 campaign and advanced to the NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament. Grand Valley State was ranked 10th nationally in last week's (Feb. 20) National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division II Top 25 poll. The Lakers have currently won 18 of their last 19 outings to date this season.

✓ **SERIES INFORMATION:** Ferris, which has won five of the last 10 series' contests, holds a 46-40 advantage heading into Tuesday's 87th encounter. The Lakers, however, have won four-straight meetings and also recorded a 70-63 triumph earlier this year (Dec. 7) at Allendale, Mich. Ferris' last win was a 79-63 win in last year's initial contest (12/8/05) at Jim Wink Arena. FSU head coach **Bill Sall** currently holds a 5-7 career coaching mark versus Grand Valley State.

✓ **LAST TIME IN ALLENDALE:** Grand Valley State pulled out a 70-63 GLIAC win over visiting Ferris State in the last game (Dec. 7) between the two teams at the GVSU Fieldhouse Arena in Allendale, Mich. The Lakers took a two-point halftime advantage and then outscored Ferris 39-34 in the final frame to earn the victory. Ferris led by as many as four points with 18:44 to play before the Lakers came back. GVSU was paced by Dan Redder's game-high tying 22 points. **Terrance Shaw** led FSU with 22 points and nine rebounds. The Bulldogs also received 14 points from **Julius Vines** along with 12 rebounds by **Michael Daniels**. The Bulldogs turned the ball over 18 times compared to GVSU's 15 miscues in the rivalry matchup. Grand Valley State was also aided by 22 fouls called against FSU as the Lakers had only 13 fouls.
