Apprentice Facilitator Role

Who can be an apprentice facilitator?

- People who have applied for SLA facilitator positions and:
 - o meet all the SLA facilitator requirements
 - o have been interviewed (for the purpose of becoming a facilitator)
 - o have been offered an apprentice facilitator position

What is the difference between an apprentice facilitator and a tutor?

- Responsibilities and functions (beyond the tutor role):
 - o review materials/concepts prior to workshop
 - o develop student awareness habits
 - o promote collaborative learning environments
 - o conduct brief, end-of-day, workshop reviews with main facilitator (as needed)
 - o attend planning and review sessions with main facilitator
 - o act as a "substitute" facilitator in the absence of the assigned facilitator for various subject matter related workshops (as needed)
- Pre-facilitator training (with stipend):
 - o SLA history and approach
 - o SLA policies and procedures
 - o facilitation skills
 - o skills integration (study, notes, tests, memory, disabilities, etc.)
 - o administrative details
 - o conducting workshops
 - o conflict resolution
- On-the-job training:
 - o maintain workshop attendance policies (not just taking attendance)
 - o enforce workshop rules
 - o attend some lectures (as assigned)
 - o brief group presentations (as assigned)
 - o present workshop materials (as assigned)
 - o responsible for tracking and enhancement of specific skills (as assigned)
 - o assist students in understanding course material
 - o exposure to working with course faculty

What are the goals of apprentice facilitation?

- To mentor individuals who will become SLA facilitators upon successful completion of the apprenticeship experience.
- To allow potential facilitators the opportunity to practice skills before conducting workshops individually.
- To observe the apprentice facilitator before assigning him/her to a workshop.
- To give potential facilitators the opportunity for more exposure to the workshops before they decide to accept the responsibility of a workshop (*more informed decisions*).
