The actors say, "Our great hope in writing the show was to use it as a catalyst to reunite our cultures. The black and Jewish communities in America share a history of pain, oppression, pride, and a deep commitment to civil rights and justice. In the past several decades our communities have slowly drifted apart."

The audience was extremely disappointing. In spite of a great deal of publicity and inclusion in the Festival booklet there were less than 20 people who showed up. There were no obvious minorities in the audience.
