Admission requirement for transfer students:

1. Transfer students with fewer than 12 transferable credits at the time of application, must meet the current freshman admission criteria.
2. Transfer students with 12 or more transferable credits at the time of application (including both English and Algebra) must have a minimum CGPA of 2.0. Students without an English and Algebra class will be required to submit an ACT/SAT score.

Graduation Requirements:

1. Admission to candidacy (see A&S section of the FSU catalog under Social Work for details)
2. 2.0 cumulative grade average in all courses
3. Minimum 120 credit hours
4. Minimum of 40 credits numbered 300 or higher
5. Residency requirements: 30 minimum FSU semester credits.
