ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

Admission to TDMP required a minimum 2.00 college grade point average and can be entered any semester.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Transfer students must be admitted (apply & be accepted) 21 days prior to the first day of the semester they plan to attend.

TRANSFER PLAN

Transfer of credit is awarded on a course-by-course basis.
Transferable courses are those with grades of "C" (2.00 on a 4.00 scale) or better.
