

The Business Administration-Professional Track degree program provides graduates with an associate degree containing an *occupational emphasis* (i.e. Accounting, Business Administration, Management, Marketing and many others) from any community college the option of completing a bachelor's degree. The degree is designed to prepare individuals for the rapidly changing nature of the work environment in business, government and other nonprofit organizations. Building upon a core of business courses, the program features a tight sequence of major courses; however, the program also provides the flexibility to specialize in an area of interest for the student.

General Admission Criteria

To be admitted to this program, you must have a minimum of 48 transferable credits from an accredited college or university and be pursuing the completion of an Associate degree in a technical area. A minimum 2.35 grade point average is required and transfer courses must be a 2.0 or higher. You must have previously completed (with a 2.0 or better) or be ready to complete the equivalent of Ferris' ENGL150 or MATH115. You will need to submit official transcripts from all accredited colleges/universities with your application. Financial aid is available and includes dual enrollment in classes at Ferris and LCC.
