

Summer Financial Aid Information

- No summer application required. The Financial Aid Office will award students automatically upon being enrolled for summer classes.
- Generally, students must be enrolled at least half-time in order to receive summer financial aid. Half-time for undergraduate students is 6 credits. Graduate students must be enrolled in at least 5 credits.

➤ New for Summer 2010

Students who are eligible for Pell Grant on the 2009/2010 FAFSA will be able to receive a Pell award for summer if they enroll and attend at least half-time.

- Loan eligibility can be determined by knowing your grade level and knowing the loans received during the fall/spring semesters.
 - Your grade level is freshman if after spring semester you have less than 26 earned credits.
 - Your grade level is sophomore if after spring semester you have at least 26 earned credits.
 - Your grade level is junior if after spring semester you have earned at least 56 credits and are in a bachelor degree program.
 - Your grade level is senior if after spring semester you have earned at least 86 credits and are in a bachelor degree program.
