1. Proposal Summary

Addition of two NURS electives for the RN to BSN program. The recently approved curriculum revision added a NURS elective to the program and included two course options: NURS 300 and NURS 314. This proposal is to add two more electives to increase the options for RN to BSN students:

NURS 316 Transcultural Nursing has been created to be offered as a study abroad or an in-country transcultural nursing experience. The School of Nursing has implemented a study abroad option for the past four years in Finland and has recently added New Zealand as an option. This course would serve as the official mechanism for students to take advantage of this experience or an in-country cultural diversity experience.

NURS 318 Advanced Health Assessment has been created to provide the opportunity for students in the program to acquire advanced health assessment skills. In the previous proposal cleanup, NURS 312 Health Assessment was deleted from the program because it no longer met the needs of the majority of students in the program. This new course will be taught at a higher level, which is the appropriate focus for students in a BSN program now that most ADN programs have included a more basic health assessment course. In addition, this course is a laboratory experience, which makes it difficult to offer to students in the new online format. For this reason it will now be a program elective.

Course Description:

Experiential practicum in transcultural nursing provides the professional nursing student with the opportunity to study the influence of cultural and health policy on the health of populations. May involve domestic or international travel.

Course Outcomes:

1. Applies knowledge and selected concepts from nursing and social sciences in analysis of cultural concepts in care of culturally defined populations.
2. Uses diversity concepts to analyze the concepts related to culturally competent nursing and health care.
3. Uses appropriate transcultural nursing models to examine one or more specific cultures.
4. Demonstrates the use of effective collaboration skills in exploring transcultural nursing with colleagues in a variety of health care settings.
5. Examines culturally competent health care within an ethical framework.
6. Critically examines the influence of health policy on the health of populations.

Course Outline including Time Allocation:**Total hours = 90**

1. Pre-practicum preparation. (10 Hours)
 Examines and selects appropriate transcultural nursing model as framework for practicum experience.
 Studies the culture to be visited using the model selected.
 Prepares personal learning objectives for practicum.
 Practicum Experience (70 hours)
 Interacts with professional peers in selected settings.
 Observes health care facilities and practices in a variety of settings.
 Takes part in selected activities to increase awareness of culture under study.
2. Post practicum synthesis (10 hours)
 Selects an appropriate method to demonstrate attainment of course and personal goals for practicum.

Course Description:

This course will build upon health assessment skills developed in the professional nurse's basic educational program. It provides an opportunity to develop the knowledge, skills, and processes required for advanced health assessment (e.g., identifying abnormal heart sounds). Laboratory practice with feedback is provided.

1. Conduct a focused and comprehensive physical examination and health history utilizing advanced health assessment techniques.
2. Develop advanced skills in health assessment important to the student's area of practice.


