### **SCHOLAR Program** **Fall 2005 - Executive Summary**

- ❖ Mentees provided verbal feedback that the mentor program helped them so tremendously that they want to mentor to a freshman student.
- ❖ There were 46 mentors and 59 mentees who participated in the program.
- ❖ Twenty-three (23) mentees from Fall 2005 expressed an interest in continuing the program for Winter 2006; 17 of the 23 followed through with program continuation.
- ❖ There appears to be a strong correlation between mentoring and the programming available to students. If both the mentor & mentee decides not to participate in the available programs, it is noted that their “relationship” is also affected or either non existent.
- ❖ The programs offered to the mentors & mentees has allowed them to enhance their relationship.
- ❖ The SCHOLAR events which were limited to participants in the program received over 90% attendance rating.
- ❖ Campus wide recognition is increasing through word of mouth advertisement. Students are responding of their interest in the program; based upon their contact w/another who was actively involved.
- ❖ The Bulldog Prevention Week (BPW) Program involved collaboration with departments on campus.

- ❖ BPW received recognition from Prevention Network as a model program for 2005 and was awarded a plaque at the December 2005 banquet.
- ❖ An event that was targeted to Freshmen students during BPW drew approximately 500 students to a “Drinking For Fun to Dependence” workshop.
- ❖ BPW was highlighted in the Prevention Network January/February 2006 Newsletter.
- ❖ Midnight Madness continues to be a highly attended evening program on campus which allows campus & Big Rapids community to enjoy positive entertainment.
- ❖ Educational programs coordinated through SCHOLAR (i.e. Financial Seminar, Massage Therapy, and Network Lunches) continue to be strong assets to the program.
- ❖ SCHOLAR is presenting at the International Mentoring Association (IMA) Conference for a third year on the usage of WebCT.

Eight of the 29 UNCP students did not fully meet the contract guidelines by participating in 50% of the program activities; by only attending between 1 to 4 activities throughout the semester. Eight of the 29 UNCP students failed to participate in any program activities.***
