SCHOLAR Program **Winter 2006 - Executive Summary**

- ❖ Mentees provided verbal feedback that the mentor program helped them so tremendously that they want to mentor to a freshman student.
- ❖ Twenty-three (23) mentees from Fall 2005 expressed an interest in continuing the program for Winter 2006; 17 of the 23 followed through with program continuation.
- ❖ There appears to be a strong correlation between mentoring and the programming available to students. If both the mentor & mentee decides not to participate in the available programs, it is noted that their “relationship” is also affected or either non-existent.
- ❖ The programs offered to the mentors & mentees has allowed them to enhance their relationship.
- ❖ The evaluations made available via WebCT provided more feedback for the open-end questions. This allows the program to view comments strategically than verbal feedback.
- ❖ Campus wide recognition is increasing through word of mouth advertisement. Students are responding of their interest in the program; based upon their contact with someone who was actively involved.

- ❖ Mentor feedback suggests that the program makes a difference in student lives, their leadership, and this type of experience should be continued.
- ❖ Mentors would like an opportunity to network with peer mentors at other universities and participate in more leadership functions.
- ❖ Students expressed above average satisfaction regarding the selection of the SCHOLAR events.
- ❖ Over 50% of the mentees who completed the survey, felt the mentoring program promoted their decision to return to FSU.
- ❖ Seventy-five (75%) of the mentees who completed the survey indicated they would recommend the program to an incoming freshmen.
- ❖ Educational programs coordinated through SCHOLAR (i.e. Financial Seminar, Massage Therapy, and Network Lunches) continue to be strong assets to the program.

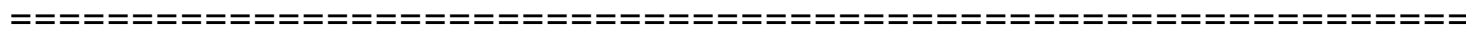
