GAMES 5-6 ▲ 2007-08 SEASON

THIS WEEKEND: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will begin Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) for the 2007-08 season this weekend (Oct. 26-27) with a two-game series against nationally-ranked Notre Dame Fighting Irish in Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EDT)/Ewigleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

THE BROADCAST: All of Ferris State's 2007-08 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports. **VIDEO WEBCASTS:** A live video and audio webcast is available for all 2007-08 Ferris State home hockey games through B2Networks for a charge of \$6 per contest. Just click on the B2Networks icon which is located at www.ferris.edu/sports to access.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 1-2-1 overall and 0-0-0 in the CCHA to date after going 1-0-1 in a two-game non-league series against Wayne State last weekend (10/19-20) in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs are 1-0-1 at home, 0-2-0 on the road, and 0-0-0 at neutral sites this season. Ferris State compiled a 14-22-3 overall record a season ago, which included a ninth place 10-16-2 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 9-8-1 in home contests for the 2006-07 campaign.

Notre Dame improved to 3-2-0 overall and 1-0-0 in the CCHA to date with a 4-2 league-opening victory over Bowling Green State Tuesday (10/23) at the BGSU Ice Arena in Bowling Green, Ohio. Prior to that tilt, the Fighting Irish split a non-league series with nationally-ranked Denver last weekend (10/18-19) at UND's Joyce Center in Notre Dame, Ind. ND skated to a 4-3 win over the Pioneers last Thursday (10/18) before suffering a 3-1 loss in Friday's (10/19) series finale. The Irish are ranked 11th by *Inside College Hockey.com (INCH)* while being listed 12th in both the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* polls. UND is 1-0-0 on the road, 1-1-0 at home, and 1-1-0 at neutral sites to date this campaign.

A season ago, Notre Dame posted a 32-7-3 overall record with a first-place 21-4-3 CCHA mark. The Irish claimed their first-ever CCHA regular-season and tournament championship titles along with making its second NCAA Tourney appearance in the program's history.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 16th season, 240-288-52 (.459) – (23-15-4 vs. Notre Dame – 6-5-1 Home, 15-10-3 Away, 2-0-0 Neutral). **Notre Dame – Jeff Jackson** (Michigan State, 1978), 3rd season, 48-28-7 (.620); Career: 9th season, 230-80-32 (.719) – (3-1-0 vs. Ferris State). Jackson, who was named the 2007 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the national coach of the year, was 17-1-3 against Ferris State in his six seasons (1990-96) as head coach at Lake Superior State.

ABOUT NOTRE DAME: The Irish are presently led in scoring by freshman forward Ben Ryan (1-5=6) along with senior center Mark Van Guilder (4-0=4), junior left wing Garrett Regan (3-1=4), and junior right wing Erik Condra (1-3=4), a 2006-07 honorable mention All-CCHA pick. Ryan is tied for 18th nationally in assists (1.00 app.). Junior goaltender Jordan Pearce (3-2-0, 2.21 GAA, .906sv%), who has played exclusively in net this season, is 26th in goals-against average and is 37th in save percentage on the national charts. Notre Dame is listed 11th in power plays (21.9%), tied for 10th in penalty-killing (95.8%), 22nd in scoring offense (2.80 gpg.), and 23rd in scoring defense (2.40 gpg.).

• **Balanced Scoring** – Eight different Ferris State skaters tallied a goal in the Bulldogs' two-game set against Wayne State last weekend (10/19-20), which featured the first collegiate lamplighters for freshmen **Zach Redmond (Traverse City)** and **Justin Menke (Shamrock, Saskatchewan)** in last Friday's victory.

• **Nearing The Top 10** – Junior goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almonte, Ontario)**, who has amassed 1,504 career saves in 63 appearances, is 57 stops shy from tying Glenn Raeburn (1985-87; 1,561 career saves) for 10th place on FSU's all-time saves leaders chart. The 2005-06 FSU Rookie of the Year Award winner made a career season-best 828 saves in 33 2005-06 outings and then followed with 654 saves in 29 games a season ago.

• **Firepower** – The Bulldogs registered a combined 84 shots on goal in their two-game non-league series with Wayne State last weekend (10/19-20) and averaged 42 shots on net per contest. FSU outshot the Warriors (39 total shots) by 22.5 shots per outing in the series.

• **Drought Ends** – Sophomore right wing **Blair Riley's (Kamloops, British Columbia)** game-tying power-play goal in the third period of last Saturday's (10/20) tilt versus Wayne State represented his first lamplighter in his last 26 outings dating back to last season. Riley's last goal prior to that one was in a home affair against Michigan (11/17/06).

• **Down On The Farm** – **Justin Menke's** parents live on a 6,000 acre farm with 200 cattle. The farm is located nine miles from his hometown of Shamrock, Saskatchewan which has 25 residents.

• **Bulldogs Gain Strength** – **Dave Cencer**, FSU's director of hockey operations and video coordinator, added another position to his job title this offseason by becoming the program's new strength and conditioning specialist after receiving his certification by the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA) Certification Commission in early April 2007.

• **30th Anniversary** – The 2007-08 season represents the 30th anniversary for the Ferris State men's ice hockey program competing at the NCAA Division I level. The Bulldogs registered a 10-24-0 overall record in the 1978-79 season which marked their NCAA Division I debut.

• **Exclusive 'C' Club** – Senior defenseman **Adam Welch (Hastings, Minn.)** is presently serving as Ferris State's team captain this 2007-08 campaign for the third consecutive season. In doing so, Welch holds the distinction of being only the fourth Bulldog skater in the program's history to serve in that capacity for more than two seasons. He's also the community involvement chairperson for FSU's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) and has been a co-recipient of the Bulldog hockey program's Blue Line Competitive Award the last two seasons (2005-06 and 2006-07).

• **Moving Up The Charts** – **Mitch O'Keefe** is one victory shy of moving into a tie for 11th place among Ferris' all-time goaltending leaders with Marc Felicio (1987-01; 22 career victories) and Glenn Raeburn (1985-87; 22) in career wins. O'Keefe has currently compiled a 21-31-11 mark between the posts in 63 contests.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 16th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-08 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
