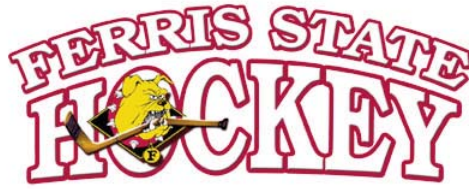

GAMES 37-39 ▲ CCHA PLAYOFFS QUARTERFINAL ROUND ▲ 2007-08 SEASON

THIS WEEKEND: The nationally-ranked Ferris State University men's ice hockey team has advanced to the quarterfinal round of the 2008 Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Playoffs this weekend (March 14-16) as the Bulldogs battle the nationally-ranked University of Notre Dame Fighting Irish in a best-of-three series at Notre Dame, Ind. Ferris State is the tourney's fifth seed while the Fighting Irish, who received a first-round bye, are the fourth seed. The series winner will advance to the 2008 CCHA Championships (March 21-22) at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich.

THE BROADCAST: All of Ferris State's 2007-08 CCHA games will be carried live by radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM with Bill Beckwith** calling the action. **VIDEO WEBCASTS:** A live free video webcast is available on Notre Dame's Athletic website at this address <http://und.cstv.com/sports/m-hockey/sched/nd-m-hockey-sched.html> to access.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State improved to 17-14-5 overall this season after sweeping 12th-seed Western Michigan in two games last weekend (March 7-8) in a best-of-three CCHA Playoff First-Round series at FSU's Ewingleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs, who are 7-2-1 in their last 10 outings, are ranked 18th this week (March 9) by *Inside College Hockey.com*. Ferris is listed in both the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* (March 10) and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* polls (March 10) as other teams receiving votes. The Bulldogs completed the 2007-08 CCHA regular season with a fifth-place 12-12-4 record (28 league points). FSU is 7-8-2 in away contests this campaign.

☛ Ferris State compiled a 14-22-3 overall record a season ago, which included a ninth-place 10-16-2 CCHA mark.

Notre Dame is 22-12-4 overall to date this season and was idle last weekend as a result of receiving a playoff first-round series bye. The Fighting Irish, who posted a fourth-place 15-9-4 CCHA mark, are 9-3-3 at home this season. UND concluded the regular season with a home-and-home league series split against Western Michigan two weeks ago (Feb. 29-March 1). The Irish dropped a 3-0 series opening decision to WMU Friday (Feb. 29) in Kalamazoo, Mich., before registering a 3-1 triumph over the Broncos in Saturday's (March 1) series finale at the Joyce

Center in Notre Dame, Ind. Notre Dame is 5-3-3 in its last 11 decisions. The Irish are listed 12th this week in all three national collegiate hockey polls – *Inside College Hockey.com*, *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV*, and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine*.

☛ A season ago, Notre Dame posted a 32-7-3 overall record which included a first-place 21-4-3 CCHA mark. The Irish claimed their first-ever CCHA regular-season and tournament championship titles along with making their second NCAA Tournament appearance in the program's history.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 16th season, 256-300-56 (.464) – (25-16-5 vs. Notre Dame – 16-10-4 Away, 7-6-1 Home, 2-0-0 Neutral). **Notre Dame** – **Jeff Jackson** (Michigan State, 1978), 3rd season, 67-38-11 (.625); Career: 9th season, 249-90-36 (.712) – (4-3-1 vs. Ferris State). Jackson, who was named the 2007 Spencer Pensore Award recipient as the national coach of the year, was 17-1-3 against Ferris State in his six seasons (1990-96) as head coach at Lake Superior State.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 16th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-08 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004 and recorded his 250th win this season (Feb. 8) after producing a 5-3 victory at Notre Dame.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

➤ **30th Anniversary** - The 2007-08 season represents the 30th anniversary for the Ferris State men's ice hockey program competing at the NCAA Division I level. The Bulldogs registered a 10-24-0 overall record in the 1978-79 season which marked their NCAA Division I debut.

➤ **Warming Trend** - Ferris State is 7-3-2 (.667) since the start of February after compiling a 1-3-2 mark (.250) in six January contests. The Bulldogs are averaging 3.2 goals a game (39 total) while the opposition has scored 2.7 goals per contest (32 total) in their last 12 outings. FSU is operating at 27.8% (15-54) on the power play and at 87.1% (61-70) in penalty killing. Sophomore left wing **Blair Riley (Kamloops, British Columbia)** leads the Bulldogs with 13 points (6-7=13) in 12 games while sophomore right wing **Cody Chupp (Big Rapids)** has 11 points (5-6=11) in 12 outings. Junior goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almonte, Ontario)** is 4-1-2 between the posts with a 2.57 goals-against average (19 goals allowed) and a .914 save percentage (202 saves) in seven appearances during that 12-game span.

➤ **Close Encounters** - Ten of the Bulldogs' last 14 games have been determined by one goal or less with Ferris sporting a 4-3-3 record in those encounters, which includes a 1-3-2 road ledger.

➤ **Better Than Before** - Ferris State's 17 victories (17-14-5 overall) this season not only exceeds its win total of a season ago (14-22-3 overall), but matches the 17-win total (17-15-8 overall) in the 2005-06 campaign which is the Bulldogs' most successful season since the historic 2002-03 season. Ferris has won at least 10 games per campaign for 30 straight seasons to date.

➤ **Notable League Finish** - Ferris State's fifth-place CCHA finish this season (12-12-4 CCHA - 28 league points) represented the program's highest placing since the 2002-03 CCHA regular-season championship season in which the Bulldogs were 22-5-1 in the CCHA (45 league points). Besides the 2002-03 campaign, the 1990-91 squad finished with a third-place 15-12-5 league mark (35 league points). The 2007-08 squad bettered the 2005-06 team's sixth-place tying 27 league points (10-11-7 CCHA).

➤ **A Key To Recent Success** - The Bulldogs have converted 37.% (9-24) on their power play in last four games while limiting the opposition to a 14.3% (3-21) success rate in man-advantage situations.

➤ **Defensive Stoppers** - Ferris State has allowed an average of 2.47 goals a contest (89 total) in 36 games this season compared to 3.22 goals per outing (116 total) in its initial 36 encounters a season ago. The Bulldogs have given up 31 power-play goals this campaign to date after allowing 45 such tallies last season.

➤ **A Worthy Distinction** - The Bulldogs earned the distinction of being the only CCHA team this season to post wins over three nationally-ranked league teams in Michigan (4-3 OT - 3/1), Miami (6-5 and 3-1 - 2/15-16), and Notre Dame (3-0 - 10/27 and 5-3 - 2/8). FSU went 5-2-1 (.688) against these opponents. Ferris has posted a 5-4-1 mark (.550) against nationally-ranked teams this regular season.

➤ **Hot Hand** - Junior right wing **Justin Lewandowski (Naperville, Ill.)** has registered a combined six points (3-3=6) in his last four contests after generating nine points (8-1=9) in his initial 27 games this season. Lewandowski has racked up a career single-season best 15 points (11-4=15) in 31 outings this season. He recorded a combined nine points (3-6=9) in 42 games in his initial two seasons (2005-06 and 2006-07). Lewandowski's older brother (Phil) was a member of the Bulldogs' 2002-03 CCHA Regular-Season Championship team and played at FSU from 1999-03.

☛ **On The Road** – Ferris is averaging 2.47 goals a game (42 total) to its opponent's 2.24 goals average (38 total) in 17 away contests. The Bulldogs have converted 14.3% (10-70) of their power-play chances while operating at 87.4% (83-95) efficiency in penalty-kill situations. FSU has outscored the opposition in each of the first two periods – 17-13 in the first and 14-11 in the second. FSU has a 511-457 shots lead.

☛ **CCHA Playoff History** – Ferris is currently 19-47-3 (.297) all-time in CCHA Playoff action. The Bulldogs are 10-0-0 at home, 7-43-0 on the road, and 2-4-0 at neutral sites. The Bulldogs are making their second quarterfinal-round appearance in the last three seasons to date. FSU suffered a pair of losses (6-4 and 3-2) to Michigan in the 2005-06 season (3/10-11) at UM's Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich., after registering a two-game home sweep of Ohio State in first-round action (3/3-4) in Big Rapids, Mich.

☛ **Daniels In The CCHA Playoffs** – Ferris State head coach **Bob Daniels** has compiled a 14-26-0 (.350) bench mark in CCHA Playoff competition dating back to his first season (1992-93) at the helm. Daniels is 4-24 in road contests, 8-0 in home encounters, and 2-2 at neutral sites. He guided the Bulldogs to a 1993 CCHA Championship semifinal appearance (3/20 – 4-3 overtime loss to Miami) at Detroit's Joe Louis Arena and then to the 2003 CCHA Super 6 Championship title game (3/22 – 5-3 loss to Michigan) at Joe Louis Arena.

☛ **The Top Three Scorers** – Ferris State's current top three points leaders this season, **Cody Chupp** (10-19=29), **Adam Miller** (8-17=25), and **Brendan Connolly** (13-11=24) have combined for 29.3% (78-266) of the team's points production and 30.1% (31-103) of the Bulldogs' goal-scoring output.

☛ **March Magicians** – **Adam Miller** (2-5=7, 14 GP) along with **Cody Chupp** (2-4=6, 5 GP) and

Justin Lewandowski (2-4=6, 6 GP) are Ferris State's career points leaders in March contests.

Mitch O'Keefe is 4-3-0 with a 2.58 goals-against average (19 goals allowed) and a .912 save percentage (198 saves) in seven appearances.

☛ **Strong Starts** – The Bulldogs have scored the game's first goal in 10 of their last 17 outings and are 5-3-2 in those 10 matchups. **Mike Fillinger** has tallied the game's initial marker in three of those contests.

☛ **Rookie Trio Earns CCHA Honors** – Three Ferris State freshmen skaters – forward **Justin Menke (Shamrock, Saskatchewan)**, defenseman **Zach Redmond (Traverse City)**, and goaltender **Pat Nagle (Bloomfield)** have all earned 2007-08 CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention recognition. With their selection, the FSU ice hockey program has 34 individuals in its history earn either league all-rookie or rookie honorable mention plaudits. Nagle was tabbed fourth by *Inside College Hockey.com* among the top 10 incoming collegiate goaltenders in the 2007-08 preseason rankings.

☛ **Give It Up For Chupp** – **Cody Chupp** has compiled 11 points (5-6=11) in his last 10 contests and has a current four-game point streak (2-3=5). Chupp, who has at least a point in 21 games this season, has a career season and team-leading 29 points (10-19=29) in 36 games this season. The assistant captain has 52 points (18-34=52) in 73 career contests to date.

☛ **Best Season** – Seven of team's 16 returning

skaters from the 2006-07 campaign have established career single-season bests in points this campaign. **Blair Riley** is tops with 23 points (14-9=23) in 33 games compared to nine points (3-6=9) in 34 contests last season. **Justin Lewandowski's** career season-best 15 points (11-4=15) in 31 outings surpasses his five points (1-4=5) set in 17 encounters a season ago.

☛ **Young Guns** – Ferris State's 12 underclassmen (seven freshmen and five sophomores) have accounted for 57.3% (59-103) of the team's goal production this season. Sophomore **Blair Riley's** 14 goals leads the way.

☛ **Might Mitch** – **Mitch O'Keefe** is presently tied for fifth place among FSU's all-time goaltending wins leaders with Mike Williams (1986-90) and Craig Lisko (1990-94). O'Keefe, who is 30-37-15 in 83 career contests, is two shy of tying Dave Swierpel (1975-77) for fourth place.

☛ **A Helping Glove** – **Mitch O'Keefe** has chalked up a career season-high four assists this season marking the first helpers of his three-year collegiate career. The FSU netminder has posted assists at Ohio State (11/4), vs. Michigan State (12/7), vs. Western Michigan (1/26), and at Notre Dame (2/8).

☛ **Lewicki Named FSU's CCHA Scholar Athlete** – Sophomore center **Aaron Lewicki (Livonia)** has been named FSU's 2007-08 CCHA Scholar-Athlete. He has 13 points (4-9=13) in 36 games this season
