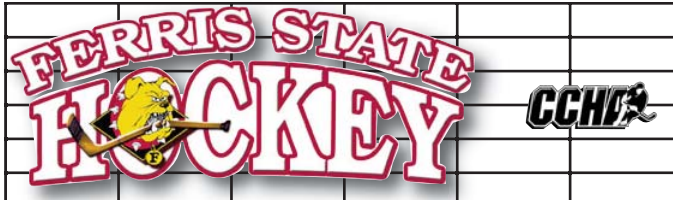

THE BROADCAST: All of Ferris State's 2008-09 CCHA games will be carried live by radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports. **VIDEO WEBCASTS:** A live video and audio webcast is available for all 2008-09 Ferris State home hockey games through B2Networks for a charge of \$6 per contest. Just click on the B2Networks icon which is located at www.ferris.edu/sports to access.

RECORDS: Ferris State wrapped up the regular season at 12-17-7 overall and posted a ninth-place 9-14-5-2 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were swept in a league home-and-home series against nationally-ranked Michigan last weekend (Feb. 27-28). Ferris State suffered a 6-1 series-opening loss to the Wolverines last Friday (Feb. 27) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs then closed out the regular season with a 4-0 setback to Michigan at UM's Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich. This season, Ferris has compiled a 6-6-4-(1) record in away encounters. ● Ferris State concluded the 2007-08 season with an 18-16-5 overall record, which included a fifth-place 12-12-4 (28 points) CCHA mark.

Nebraska-Omaha concluded the regular season at 13-15-8 overall with an eighth-place 8-13-7-3 CCHA record. The Mavericks skated to a 2-2 non-conference overtime tie against Minnesota State last Tuesday (Feb. 24) in their most recent action at the Qwest Center Omaha in Omaha, Neb. UNO is 0-9-5 in its past 14 outings with the last triumph occurring Jan. 9 in a 4-3 home league victory over Northern Michigan. The Mavericks are 8-6-5 at home this campaign. ● Nebraska-Omaha compiled a 17-19-4 overall mark, which included an eighth-place 11-13-4 CCHA mark last season.

THE COACHES: Ferris State - **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 17th season, 269-319-63 (.462) - (9-14-3 vs. Nebraska-Omaha - 4-8-0 Away, 5-6-3 Home, 0-0-0 Neutral). **Nebraska-**

Omaha - Mike Kemp (Gustavus Adolphus, 1975), 12th season, 192-221-57 (.469) - (14-9-3 vs. Ferris State). Kemp, who was the 2004-05 CCHA Coach of the Year, has been the only head coach in the program's 12-year history. He was a finalist for the CCHA Coach of the Year and the Spencer Penrose Trophy for National Coach of the Year honors in 1999-00. Kemp was a finalist for national coaching honors in three of his first eight seasons. He directed the Mavericks to their first-ever NCAA Tourney berth in the 2005-06 season.

SCOUTING NEBRASKA-OMAHA: The Mavericks are led in scoring by junior defenseman Eddie Del Grosso's 31 points (5-26=31) while senior forward Dan Charleston (9-16=25) and senior forward Tomas Klempa (14-9=23) are also among the team's top points producers. Del Grosso ranks 19th nationally in assists (0.74 avg.). Senior Jerad Kaufman (7-8-3, 2.35 GAA, .915sv%) and junior Jeremie Dupont (6-7-5, 2.68 GAA, .909sv%) are in goal. The Mavs rank 42nd nationally in scoring offense (2.50 gpg.), 19th in scoring defense (2.64 gpg.), 30th in power play (16.2), and 33rd in penalty killing (83.7).

➤ **On The Road** – Ferris State is averaging 2.38 goals in its 16 away encounters this season (38 total) to the opposition's 2.69 goals an outing (43 total), a difference of 0.31 goals an outing. The Bulldogs have compiled a 6-6-4 road mark this campaign. FSU is operating at 18.2% (14-77) efficiency on the power play and 84.0% (84-100) in penalty killing.

➤ **Opponents See Red** – Sophomore defenseman **Zach Redmond (Traverse City)** is midst his most productive season at Ferris State this campaign with a team second-best 24 points (3-21=24) in 36 contests. Redmond, who has notched at least a point in 19 games to date this season, produced 19 points (6-13=19) in 37 outings a season ago.

➤ **Best For Last** – Senior left wing **Brendan Connolly's (Canmore, Alberta)** squad-high 26 points (8-18=26) in 33 games this season represents a career single-season high, surpassing his 24 points (13-11=24) in 38 appearances last season. Connolly now has amassed at least 20 or more points in his last three seasons to date, which started in 2006-07 with 22 points (11-11=22) in 38 contests.

➤ **Best Season** – Nine of the team's 17 returning skaters from the 2007-08 campaign have established career single-season bests in points this campaign. Junior center **Casey Haines (Indiana, Pa.)** is tops with 16 points (6-10=16) in 36 games this season compared to eight points (4-4=8) in 33 outings last season. Sophomore left wing **Mike Embach's (Orland Park, Ill.)** career season-best 13 points (9-4=13) in 32 contests this campaign surpasses his seven points (1-6=7) in 25 games a season ago.

➤ **March Magicians** – Senior right wing **Justin Lewandowski (Naperville, Ill.)**, junior right wing **Cody Chupp (Big Rapids)**, and **Brendan Connolly** are Ferris State's career points leaders in March contests. Lewandowski has totaled a team-high nine points (4-5=9) in 10 appearances while Chupp has recorded eight points (3-5=8) in nine outings and Connolly has produced seven points (2-5=7) in 13 encounters.

➤ **Second-Half Scoring Surge** – The sophomore class has accounted for 36.9 of the team's scoring since the start of the 2009 CCHA regular-season. In those 14 league matchups, the eight sophomores have 27 of FSU's 73 points while also producing 55.6% (15 goals) of the squad's 27 total goals. The five-member senior group has produced 31.5% (23-73) of the Bulldogs' points production and 22.2% (6-27) of their goal-scoring output. The six-member junior class has totaled 21.9% (16-73) of FSU's scoring and 11.1% (3-27) of the team's goal production in the second-half of the 2008-09 season.

➤ **Overtime Break Ends** – Ferris State's 15 overtime game unbeaten streak (3-0-12 record) came to an end with a 3-2 overtime loss at Alaska on Feb. 21. Prior to that outcome, the Bulldogs' last extra-session setback was Feb. 9, 2007 at Michigan State (2-1). FSU is 1-1-6-(1) on the road and 2-0-5-(1) at home in its last 16 overtime games.

➤ **Closing In** – **Justin Lewandowski** is one point shy of matching his career season-high 16 points (11-5=16) set last season in 34 games. The forward has presently compiled 15 points (8-7=15) in 34 outings this campaign. Senior defenseman **Evan Case's (Grosse Pointe Woods)** six points (1-5=6) in 36 contests this season is one away from equalling his career-best seven points (2-5=7) in 39 appearances a season ago. Meanwhile, sophomore center-left wing **Justin Menke (Shamrock, Saskatchewan)** is within two points of tying his career season high of 21 points (8-13=21) set in 39 games last season. Menke has generated 19 points (5-14=19) in 34 contests to date this season.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association

(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 17th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-



place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2008-09 campaign, Daniels ranked tied for 14th among active NCAA Division I men's hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004 and recorded his 250th win this season (Feb. 8) after producing a 5-3 victory at Notre Dame.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

• **Shootouts** – Ferris State has been involved in six shootouts to date this season with latest being a 2-1 victory at Michigan State (2/6). FSU has posted a 3-3-0 record in shootouts this campaign – losing 1-0 at Western Michigan (10/24) and Miami (11/7) while winning 2-1 versus Colgate (1/3) in the third-place game of the Sheraton/TD Banknorth Catamount Cup in Burlington, Vt. The Bulldogs have won their last two shootouts to date, prevailing 2-1 over Nebraska-Omaha (1/31) at home and then skating to a 2-1 five-round decision at Michigan State (2/6). Prior to those two CCHA shootout victories, Ferris suffered a 1-0 home setback to Ohio State (1/17).

• **Scoring Leaders** – Ferris State presently has 13 skaters this campaign with double-figure points totals, led by senior left wing **Brendan Connolly's** team-high 26 points (8-18=26) in 33 games and **Zach Redmond's** 24 points (3-21=24) in 36 appearances. The 13 individuals have combined to currently produce 89.3% (208-233) of the squad's points production and 88.6% (78-88) of the Bulldogs' goal-scoring output.

• **Close Encounters** – Twenty-seven of Ferris State's 36 games to date this season have been decided by two goals or less with the Bulldogs posting an 8-12-7 record in those games.

☛ **Kudos For Couturier** – Senior right wing **Corey Couturier (Traverse City)** has totaled a career single-season high 16 points (7-9=16) in 36 games this season, which eclipsed his 15 points (8-7=15) in 35 contests as a freshman in the 2005-06 campaign. Couturier has presently posted double-digit points in three of his four seasons at FSU, which included 11 points (5-6=11) a season ago in 25 matches.

☛ **A Season's Comparison** – Ferris State has netted 88 goals in its initial 36 outings this season while allowing 97 lamplighters. A season ago following their first 36 contests, the Bulldogs generated 103 goals while giving up 89 markers. The 2008-09 squad currently features 13 individuals with double-figure points totals while last season's team had 11 skaters in double-digit points at this point in the season. Junior left wing-center **Casey Haines (Indiana, Pa.)** has eight more points this season (6-10=16; 35 GP) than a season ago (4-4=8; 30 GP). On the flip side, junior right wing **Cody Chupp (Big Rapids)** has 17 less points this campaign (7-5=12; 32 GP) than last season (10-19=29; 36 GP).

☛ **The Good, Bad & Ugly** – Goaltender **Taylor Nelson** is 1-5-2 with a 2.23 goals-against average (19 goals allowed) and a .926 save percentage (239 saves) in 510:06 of action in his 10 2009 appearances. Nelson went 4-2-2 with a 2.71 goals-against average (22 goals allowed) and an .896 save percentage (189 saves) in 487:40 between the pipes in eight 2008 encounters. Nelson was honored as the CCHA's Rookie of the Week (2/2) for his performance versus Nebraska-Omaha (1/30-31) in which posted a .970 save percentage (64 saves) and a 0.96 goals-against average (two goals allowed) in 125 minutes of action.

☛ **Happy New Year** – Sophomore defenseman **Zach Redmond** has been Ferris State's top points leader since the start of the 2009 New Year with a squad-best 12 points (2-10=12) in 16 games. The FSU assistant captain has tallied at least a point in eight outings, which includes a trio of multi-point game performances. **Brendan Connolly** (3-7=10) ranks second among the team's top 2009 points producers in 14 appearances while generating at least a point in eight of those encounters.

☛ **In The Bulldog Annals** – Goaltender **Pat Nagle**, who presently ranks 16th among Ferris State's all-time saves leaders, is 14 stops shy of tying Derek MacIntyre (2004-08; 914 saves) for 15th place. Nagle has accumulated 900 career stops to date in 37 appearances. Nagle is currently tied with MacIntyre for 15th place on the program's career wins list. Nagle has recorded a 15-17-3 mark and

his seven victories (7-10-3) this campaign are one shy of matching his eight wins last season (8-7-0) in 16 games.

☛ **Winning and Losing** – The Bulldogs have tallied 50 goals (50 to 24) in their 12 victories this season while scoring 23 markers (23 to 58) in the team's 17 losses. Ferris State has outscored its opponent 13-6 in the first period when victorious and have been outscored 23-5 in the second period when the outcome favors the opposition. Individually, **Brendan Connolly** has a team-best 15 points (5-10=15) while **Zach Redmond** has 13 points (1-12=13) in the FSU wins. Connolly also leads the Bulldogs with nine points (1-8=9) in the Ferris State losses.

☛ **Giant Of A Person** – **Cody Chupp**, FSU's 2008-09 team captain, has been nominated for a Giant Steps Award through the annual National Student-Athlete Day, America's day to celebrate outstanding student-athletes on April 6, 2009. Giant Steps Awards recognize individual student-athletes, professional athletes, athletic administrators, civic leaders, coaches, parents, organizations and other individuals who exemplify the ideals of balancing academics, athletics, life pursuits and giving back to the community through the spirit of athletics.

☛ **Sweet Lou** – Junior center **Aaron Lewicki (Livonia)** is turning in his most productive season at Ferris State this campaign with career season bests in points (18) and goals (10). His 10 markers leads the team while his points total ranks fourth highest on the squad. Lewicki has generated at least a point in 17 contests this campaign. Lewicki was Ferris State's 2007-08 CCHA Scholar-Athlete of the Year representative and was the 2007-08 team's Scholar-Athlete Award recipient.

☛ **Specialties** – Ferris State has presently allowed just three power-play goals in its last seven contests. Michigan tallied a power-play goal apiece in last weekend's (2/27-28) home-and-home regular-season finale series against the Bulldogs while Bowling Green State converted on a man-advantage situation in a home tilt (2/13) versus FSU. Ferris State is operating at 93.5% efficiency (43-46) on the penalty kill during that seven-game span. On the offensive side, Ferris State hasn't scored a power-play marker in its last eight contests to date with the last such tally coming in a 1-1 overtime tie against Nebraska-Omaha (1/31).

☛ **League Road Play** – Ferris State concluded the 2008-09 regular season with a 6-5-3 mark in CCHA road play. The Bulldogs are averaging 2.38 goals per game (31 total) to their opponent's 2.23 goals

an outing (29 total). Goaltender **Pat Nagle** has posted a 4-2-2 record with a 1.72 goals-against average (14 goals allowed) and a .944 save percentage (234 saves) in 487:37 of action. Netminder **Taylor Nelson** is 2-3-1 with a 2.96 goals-against average (18 goals allowed) and a .899 save percentage (161 saves) in 364:22 of action. FSU was paced in scoring by **Zach Redmond** (0-8=8) and **Brendan Connolly** (3-5=8) in 14 and 13 outings, respectively. The Bulldogs have outscored their opponent a combined 20-14 advantage in the opening two periods, but have been outscored 18-11 in the final 20 minutes of a regulation contest.

☛ **Midseason Accolades** – **Zach Redmond** was recently selected to the *Inside College Hockey.com's* First Half All-CCHA Team in its 2008-09 CCHA Midseason Review. Redmond was tabbed as the CCHA's Defenseman of the Week earlier this season (10/27) and was also a 2008-09 CCHA Preseason All-Conference Honorable Mention Team selection.

☛ **Talented Blueliner** – **Zach Redmond**, a 2007-08 CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention Team pick and FSU's 2007-08 Rookie of the Year Award winner, led all Bulldog defensemen in scoring last season with 19 points (6-13=19) in 37 contests. He placed sixth in team scoring and produced the second-highest points total among Ferris' freshmen a season ago. Redmond, a seventh-round 2008 NHL Draft pick (184th overall) by the Atlanta Thrashers, earned honorable mention honors on the 2008-09 CCHA Preseason All-Conference Team.

☛ **Impressive Frosh Class** – The Bulldogs' 2008-09 freshman class was ranked 15th in the nation by *Inside College Hockey.com (INCH)*. Freshman goaltender **Taylor Nelson** was rated the fourth-best incoming rookie netminder.

☛ **Shooting Gallery** – FSU has outshot its opponents in 19 contests this season, which includes 14 home encounters. The Bulldogs have a commanding 644-to-536 shots advantage inside Ewigleben Ice Arena compared to a 479-to-439 disadvantage on the opposition's home ice. Ferris is averaging 35.8 shots at home (644 total) and 27.4 on the road (439 total).

☛ **Scoring By Period** – Ferris State has a 29-28 (+1) edge in the first period, but has been outscored 33-29 (-4) in the middle frame and 35-30 (-5) in the third period. The Bulldogs have allowed multiple second-period and third-period goals on nine occasions, respectively. FSU gave up a season-high four goals at Robert Morris (10/17) in the third period. Ferris has allowed seven multi-goals to be scored in the opening 20 minutes of action.

♦ **CCHA Playoff History** – Ferris State is currently 20-49-3 (.299) all-time in CCHA Playoff action. The Bulldogs are 8-45-0 on the road, 10-0-0 at home, and 2-4-0 at neutral sites. FSU's opening-round playoff matchup against Nebraska-Omaha will represent the first-ever between the two teams. A season ago (3/7-8), the Bulldogs swept Western Michigan in a best-of-three first-round playoff series at Big Rapids, Mich. Ferris State registered a 4-3 overtime decision in the series' opener (3/7) and then posted a series-clinching 6-3 triumph over the Broncos (3/8).

♦ **Daniels In The CCHA Playoffs** – Ferris State head coach **Bob Daniels** has compiled a 15-28-0 (.349) bench mark in CCHA Playoff competition dating back to his first season (1992-93) at the helm. Daniels is 5-26 in road contests, 8-0 in home encounters, and 2-2 at neutral sites. He guided the Bulldogs to a 1993 CCHA Championship semifinal appearance (3/20 – 4-3 overtime loss to Miami) at Detroit's Joe Louis Arena and then to the 2003 CCHA Super 6 Championship title game (3/22 – 5-3 loss to Michigan) at Joe Louis Arena.

♦ **Playoff Scoring** – In its last 21 CCHA Playoff First-Round contests to date since the 1999-00 season, the Bulldogs are averaging 3.24 goals per game (68 total) while the opposition has averaged 3.19 goals (67 total) during that period for a 0.05 goals margin.

♦ **Did You Know?** – The Bulldogs have outshot their opponent this season in each of the three regulation periods. FSU has a 37 shots advantage (376-to-339) in the first period and a five shot lead (402-to-397) in the second 20 minutes of action. In the third period, the Bulldogs hold a 19-shots margin (353-to-334).

♦ **CCHA Weekly Recognition** – Ferris State had five skaters during the 2008-09 regular season earn weekly honors by the CCHA. Sophomore defenseman **Zach Redmond** was chosen as the CCHA's Defenseman of the Week (Oct. 27) while freshman defenseman **Chad Billins (Marysville)** was tabbed the Rookie of the Week (Dec. 15). Sophomore left wing **Mike Embach** achieved CCHA Offensive Player of the Week accolades (Jan. 12). Senior left wing **Brendan Connolly** and freshman goaltender **Taylor Nelson** were recognized as the CCHA's Offensive Player of the Week and Rookie of the Week (Feb. 2), respectively.

♦ **Thumps Up For The CCHA** – Sophomore defenseman **Scott Wietecha (Wolverine Lake)** recorded nine (4-5=9) of his 11 points this campaign (5-6=11) in 24 2008-09 season outings. **Justin Lewandowski** (8-7=15; 34 GP) had all but three of his points (5-7=12) in 27 league matchups as did **Evan Case** (1-5=6; 36 GP) with three points (1-2=3) in 28 CCHA appearances.
