### FSU WRAPS UP HOMESTAND AGAINST LAKE SUPERIOR STATE THIS WEEKEND

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team concludes its four-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) homestand this weekend (Nov. 2-3), hosting the Lake Superior State University Lakers in a two-game series at Big Rapids, Mich.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (pronounced A-VAH-glave-in) Ice Arena (2,450).

**FSU TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2001-02 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Office hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (EST) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (EST).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is presently 2-3-0 overall and 0-3-0 in the CCHA following a pair of league losses to Miami (Ohio) last weekend (Oct. 26-27) in the Bulldogs' home-opening series at the Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids. FSU lost a 5-4 decision in the series' opener last Friday (Oct. 26) and was dealt a 3-2 setback in Saturday's (Oct. 27) finale.

☛ Ferris State registered a 13-20-5 overall record last season while finishing eighth place in the CCHA with a 9-15-4 league mark. FSU was 8-6-4 at home (5-5-4 CCHA), 4-13-1 on the road (4-10-0 CCHA) and 1-1-0 at neutral sites a season ago.

**Lake Superior State** is currently 2-4-0 overall and 1-3-0 in the CCHA after gaining a home league series split with Alaska Fairbanks last weekend (Oct. 26-27) at LSSU's Taffy Abel Arena in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. The Lakers dropped a 3-2 decision to the Nanooks last Friday (Oct. 26) before rallying to register a 4-1 victory in Saturday's (Oct. 27) finale.

☛ Lake Superior State was 13-23-0 overall and 8-20-0 (12th place) in the CCHA last year.

**HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS:** Bob Daniels is currently in his 10th year at Ferris State this season, which represents the longest tenure of any Bulldog hockey coach. The sixth head coach in the program's history, Daniels became FSU's winningest coach on March 4, 2000, in a 7-0 regular-season finale win at Western Michigan to surpass the program's inaugural coach Rick Duffett (1975-82; 119-83-

7). In the last nine years, Daniels is tops among all-time FSU coaches in CCHA wins (98) and CCHA Tournament victories (five).

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 10th season, 136-180-31 (.437) – (6-19-3 vs. Lake Superior State; Home–2-9-2; Away–4-9-1; Neutral–0-1-0).

Lake Superior State – **Frank Anzalone** (SUNY-Buffalo, 1978), 9th season, 193-112-22 (.624) – (20-11-3 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT LAKE SUPERIOR STATE:** Leading the way offensively for the Lakers are three individuals – senior left wing Chris McNamara (2-1-3), junior center-left wing Aaron Davis (1-2-3) and sophomore center Adam Nightingale (1-2-3). Junior Scott Murray is 1-2-0 in goal with a 2.34 goals against average and a .929 saves percentage in five outings. Freshmen Terry Denike is 1-2-0 in net with a 4.68 goals against average and a .897 saves percentage in three games. LSSU is operating at 5.3% (1-19) efficiency in power-play situations and is 72.7% (16-22) on the penalty kill. Head coach Frank Anzalone, who guided the Lakers to a NCAA title in 1987-88, returns to the LSSU bench after an 11-year absence (1989-90).

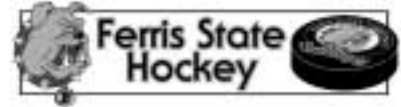

**BULLDOG BITES:** Junior left wing **Chris Kunitz (Regina, Sask.)** has recorded a point in four of FSU's five contests to date this season. He has notched a point in 13 of his last 23 outings, which



includes seven multi-point games in that period. Kunitz garnered a point in nine of his last 18 outings a season ago and posted six multi-point games in that span . . . Senior center **Rob Collins (Kitchener, Ont.)** has compiled three multi-point games in five contests this campaign, including a pair of three-point single-game performances at Wayne State (1-2-3) and versus Miami (1-2-3). FSU has outshot the opposition (144 to 139) in four of its five contests this year and is averaging 28.8 shots on goal per game . . . **Chris Kunitz (four)** and **Rob Collins (three)** have combined for 43.8% (7-of-16) of the team's goal-scoring production this campaign. The two accounted for 34.1% (31-of-91) of the squad's total goals
