2002-03: A dynamic skater . . . Should receive a lot of ice time this season and is coming off most productive season in his collegiate career . . . Has a high-skill level and possesses the ability to make players around him better . . . Instinctive in rushing the puck and jumping into the attack at the most opportune time . . . One of the top penalty-kill performers in the CCHA . . . Solid special-teams player.

2001-02: Chalked up a career-high 10 points while appearing in all 36 games on the blueline . . . Scored two goals against Alaska Fairbanks (11/16) for lone multiple-point game effort of the campaign . . . Tallied a goal apiece versus Lake Superior State (11/3), at Nebraska-Omaha (11/23) and at Alaska Fairbanks (3/9) in CCHA Tournament contest . . . Goal against Lake Superior State (11/3) was an empty netter . . . Credited with an assist at Wayne State (10/13), at Notre Dame (11/9), Western Michigan (12/29), Bemidji State (1/25) and at Ohio State (2/16).

2000-01: Received action in 37 contests and registered four points . . . Both of his goals were against Bowling Green State (2/16 and 3/3) . . . Picked up an assist in home outings versus Colgate (11/4) and Findlay (12/16).

PRIOR TO FSU: Spent two seasons (1998-00) with the Brampton (Ont.) Capitals of the Provincial Junior A Hockey League . . . Coached by Mario Chicillio . . . Teammate of current FSU winger Trevor Large . . . Scored 12 goals with 50 assists for 62 points in 40 games as the Capitals registered a 32-12-6 record in 1999-2000 . . . Totaled 42 points on seven goals and 35 assists in 40 outings at the forward position as Brampton posted a 25-20-5 mark in the 1998-99 campaign . . . Honored as MVP of the 1999-00 Provincial Junior A Hockey League's All-Star Game and had his hockey stick sent to the Canadian Hockey Hall of Fame.

PERSONAL: Son of George and Fay Mangos . . . Born 2/15/80 in Brampton, Ont. . . His parents own a restaurant . . . Graduated in 1998 from Notre Dame Secondary School in Brampton, Ont. . . 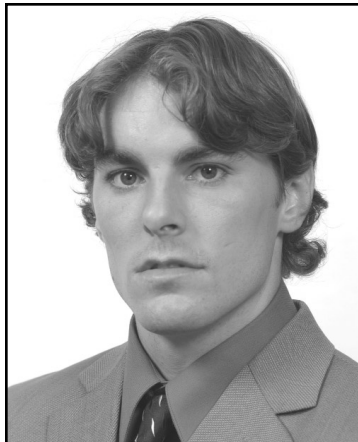

2002-03: Strong, physical winger . . . Has developed into a capable offensive contributor and provides team with another scoring threat . . . Will serve as an assistant captain . . . Adds toughness to the lineup . . . Will receive considerable ice time in all situations . . . Extremely strong and holds distinction of being the team's best-conditioned athlete . . . Solid forechecker with good defensive instincts . . . Has progressed even faster than coaching staff expected . . . Relishes open-ice contact . . . A former walk-on.

2001-02: A CCHA All-Academic Honorable Mention Team pick . . . Received FSU's Scholar-Athlete Award and was co-recipient of the team's Blueline Competitive Award . . . Recognized as a recipient of both the FSU

President's and Dean's Academic Awards for having the team's highest grade point average . . .

Was fifth among squad's top point getters with a career-best 23 points in all 36 games . . . Tied for fourth place with four multi-point outings . . .

Compiled nine points (4-5-9) in a seven-game point span . . . Scored a goal and had an assist in contests versus Alaska Fairbanks (11/16), Michigan (11/30), at Minnesota (12/28), Bemidji State (1/25) and at Northern Michigan (2/1).

2000-01: Named FSU's Rookie of the Year . . .

Placed tied for eighth among the team's top scorers with nine points . . . Recorded two points apiece in back-to-back games at Notre Dame (1/6) and versus Miami (Ohio) (1/13) . . . Picked up two assists at Notre Dame and had a pair of goals against Miami (Ohio) . . . Tallied game-winning goal versus Michigan (11/11) . . . Scored a goal against Findlay (12/15).

PRIOR TO FSU: Competed for the Thunder Bay (Ont.) Flyers of the United States Hockey League . . . Coached by Todd Jones . . . Recorded 46 points on 17 goals and 29 assists in 1999-2000 season . . . Totaled 16 goals along with 27 assists for 43 points in 55 outings during the 1998-99 campaign.

6-2 ♦ 210 ♦ Senior ♦ Defenseman
Lansing, Michigan



2002-03: Switched to defense and supplies needed depth . . . Supplies a strong, physical presence to the ice . . . Possesses excellent speed for his size . . . Must stay out of the penalty box to be truly effective, which will also dictate his amount of playing time . . . Should continue playing on the team's penalty-kill unit . . . Has shown improvement with passing of each season . . . Has the versatility to play on the forward line.

2001-02: Registered a career-high seven points in 22 games . . . Skated in the first three outings of the season before missing the next 14 contests due to an injury . . . Scored one goal each at Wayne State (10/12), Bemidji State (1/25) and at Western Michigan (2/22) . . . Had two points in a two-game series on

three occasions – at Wayne State (10/12-13), against Bemidji State (1/25-26) and versus Bowling Green State (2/8-9) . . . Produced a game-best +2 efficiency rating versus Bemidji State (1/25) and Bowling Green State (2/8).

2000-01: Played in 36 contests . . . Finished tied for 10th place among team's points leaders . . . Winner of the FSU Steve Banonis Most Improved Player Award . . . Notched a three-game point streak (10/27-11/3), which included a goal each in series at Nebraska-Omaha (10/27-28) . . . Had a short-hander at Nebraska-Omaha (10/28) . . .

Credited with an assist against Colgate (11/3), at Michigan State (12/9), Alaska Fairbanks (2/2) and Bowling Green State (2/17) . . . Tied for sixth in team power-play points (1-3-4) . . . Finished second on the squad in penalties (30) and third in penalty minutes (60).

1999-00: Didn't receive ice time during the season.

PRIOR TO FSU: Spent the 1997-98 and 1998-99 campaigns with the Soo Indians (Sault Ste. Marie, Mich.) of the North American Hockey League . . . Coached by Joe Schawn . . . Served as team captain for the 1998-99 season.

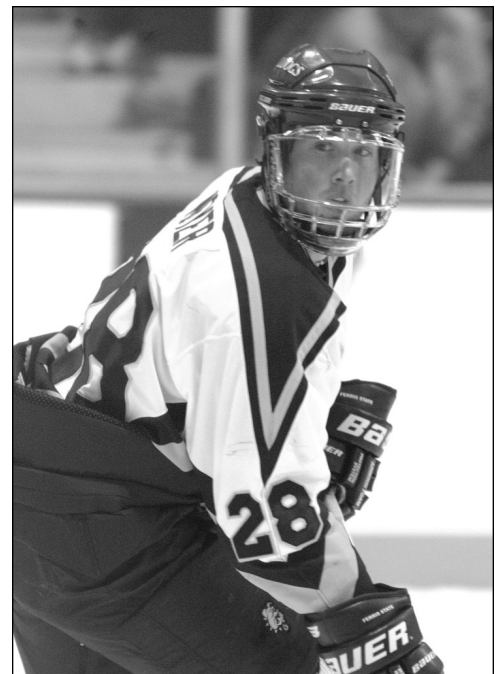
