### FERRIS STATE BATTLES MICHIGAN IN HOME-AND-HOME SERIES THIS WEEKEND

**THIS WEEK:** The nationally-ranked Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will go up against the nationally-ranked University of Michigan Wolverines this weekend (Jan. 31-Feb. 1) in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) home-and-home series. This Friday's (Jan. 31) contest will be played in Ann Arbor, Mich., with Saturday's (Feb. 1) rematch to be held at Big Rapids, Mich.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST)/Yost Ice Arena (6,637); Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben Ice Arena (2,493).

**TELEVISION COVERAGE:** This Friday's contest at Michigan is this week's televised CCHA Game of the Week and can be viewed live on FOX Sports Net – Detroit.

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is 18-7-1 overall and 13-4-1 in the CCHA following a league road series split with Miami (Ohio) last weekend (Jan. 24-25) at MU's Goggin Ice Arena in Oxford, Ohio. The Bulldogs, who are 6-2-1 in their last nine outings, were dealt a 6-3 loss by the RedHawks last Friday (Jan. 24) but rallied to post a 4-2 triumph in Saturday's (Jan. 25) series finale. This week, FSU is ranked ninth in both the *Inside College Hockey.com* and *U.S. College Hockey Online* polls. The Bulldogs are listed 11th by *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine*. FSU is 9-2-0 on the road, 9-4-1 at home, and 0-1-0 at neutral sites this season.

➤ A season ago, Ferris State was 15-20-1 overall with a ninth-place 12-15-1 CCHA record. FSU was 10-6-0 at home, 5-13-1 on the road, and 0-1-0 at neutral sites.

Michigan stands at 17-6-1 overall and 11-4-1 in the CCHA following a league series sweep of Lake Superior State last week (Jan. 23 and Jan. 25). The Wolverines registered a 4-1 victory over the Lakers last Thursday (Jan. 23) at LSSU's Taffy Abel Arena in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. UM then claimed a 5-0 win Saturday (Jan. 25) at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich. The Wolverines, who are 5-1-0 in their last six appearances, are ranked fifth this week by *Inside College Hockey.com*, seventh in the *U.S. College Hockey Online* poll, and eighth by *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine*. UM is 10-1-0 at home, 4-3-1 on the road, and 3-2-0 at neutral sites this season.

➤ Michigan concluded the 2001-02 campaign at 28-11-5 overall while capturing both the CCHA

regular-season title (19-5-4) and CCHA Tournament Championship crown. The Wolverines made their 12th straight NCAA Tourney appearance and competed in the NCAA Frozen Four for the second straight season.

**BOB DANIELS:** The sixth head coach in the program's history, Daniels became FSU's winningest coach following a 7-0 regular-season finale (3/4/00) win at Western Michigan to surpass the program's inaugural coach Rick Duffett (1975-82; 119-83-7). Daniels is first among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 123-153-30 (.451) league mark.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 11th season, 167-204-33 (.454) – (6-22-1 – Away 3-12-0, Home 3-9-0; Neutral 0-1-1). Michigan – **Gordon "Red" Berenson** (Michigan, 1962), 19th season, 493-237-51 (.665) – (44-17-1 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT MICHIGAN:** Freshman forward Jeff Tambellini (15-8-23) along with senior forwards John Shouneyia (5-16-21) and Jed Ortmeyer (9-11-20) are the Wolverines' leading scorers. Frosh goaltender Al Montoya (17-6-1, 2.17 GAA, .915sv%) is the regular in net. UM ranks first nationally in penalty killing (.917) and is seventh in both scoring offense (4.04 gpg.) and scoring defense (2.25 gpg.).

**BULLDOG BITES:** Sophomore goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** established a single-season school record for most victories in Saturday's win at Miami. Brown improved to 18-7-1 this season and surpassed Dave Swierpel (1976-77; 17-4-1) . . . FSU has outscored its opponents by a 54-goal margin this season (116-62), including a 30-goal margin in the third period (44-14). A season ago at this time, the Bulldogs held a 14-goal lead (80-66) in 24 games . . . Senior left wing **Chris Kunitz (Regina, Sask.)** moved into third place among FSU's all-time goal scorers with a three-goal output in the Miami series. Kunitz has 84 career markers in 136 outings and moved ahead of Steve Banonis (1977-81, 83 goals) on the charts with a goal Saturday. He's nine tallies away from tying Rod Schluter (1984-89) for second place . . . Ferris' 18-7-1 overall record is second best in the program's NCAA Division I history as the 1979-80 squad posted a 20-6-0 mark after its initial 26 games. The '79-80 season was the school's first in the CCHA as the team finished 26-11-1 overall, which included a third-place 11-9-0 league mark . . .

Junior center **Brett Smith (Guelph, Ont.)** tallied his first career game winner Saturday at Miami. Smith has already set career highs in goals (seven), assists (six) and points (13) in 26 games this season . . . Ferris' 13-4-1 (27 pts.) CCHA mark to date following 18 league outings is the best ever in the program's history, bettering the 10-3-5 (25 pts.) record set in 1990-91 . . . **Chris Kunitz (7-9-16)** and sophomore center **Jeff Legue (5-6-11)** are FSU's top scorers in January this season while **Mike Brown** is 5-2-1 with a 2.79 goals-against average and a .901 save percentage in eight contests . . . With his win at Miami last Saturday, **Brown** moved into a three-way tie with Ted Ykema (1978-81) and Pat Mazzoli (1990-93) for sixth place on the Bulldogs' career wins leader list and is 28-20-1 in 51 career appearances to date. **Brown** was tied for eighth place with Jeff Blashill (1994-98) prior to last weekend . . . **Kunitz** has accumulated 20 points (9-11-20) in his last nine games, which includes seven multiple-point game efforts . . . Senior defenseman **Troy Milam (Lake Orion)** is two assists shy of tying Clark Davies (1986-90) for 10th place in career assists on FSU's all-time defensemen assists list. **Milam** has totaled 68 career points (18-50-68) in 139 contests.

**HOBEBY BAKER AWARD CANDIDATE:** **Chris Kunitz**, a CCHA First-Teamer last season as a result of scoring a league-high 25 goals, is a 2002-03 Hobey Baker Memorial Award candidate. A season ago, he totaled 38 points on a career-best 28 goals and 10 assists in 35 games. He has a league-best 48 points with 20 goals and 28 assists in 26 contests this season. **Kunitz** currently ranks first with 3,842 points in phase two of the voting for the Hobey Baker Award. Once the nominating phase is completed, fans will be casting ballots along with the 60 NCAA Division I college hockey head coaches to determine the Top 10 Finalists, which will be announced in March. Fans can log on to [www.voteforhobey.com](http://www.voteforhobey.com) and follow the prompts to nominate their choice.
