### FERRIS STATE RESUMES LEAGUE PLAY WITH SERIES AT ALASKA FAIRBANKS

**THIS WEEK:** The nationally-ranked Ferris State University men's ice hockey team resumes Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) action this weekend (Oct. 24-25) as the Bulldogs take on the University of Alaska Fairbanks Nanooks at Fairbanks, Alaska.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday and Saturday – 11:05 p.m. (EDT)/Carlson Center (4,350).

**FSU TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for the 2003-04 regular-season home games are available by contacting the FSU Athletics Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m.

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is 2-2-0 overall and 1-1-0 in the CCHA to date following a non-league series split against Colgate last weekend (Oct. 17-18) at CU's Starr Rink in Hamilton, N.Y. The Bulldogs suffered a 5-3 loss to the Red Raiders in last Friday's opener before registering a 3-1 win in the finale. Ferris State ranks 14th place in both the *U.S. College Hockey Online* and *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* polls while being listed 16th in the *Inside College Hockey.com* poll.

◆ A season ago, Ferris State registered its most successful season in the program's 25-year NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain the 30-win season plateau.

**Alaska Fairbanks** is 1-3-0 overall and 0-0-0 in the CCHA after being swept by nationally-ranked Colorado College last weekend (Oct. 17-18) in a non-league series at the Colorado Springs (Colo.) World Arena. The Nanooks dropped a 6-2 decision in the first game and then were dealt an 8-3 setback in the finale.

◆ A season ago, UAF compiled a 15-14-7 overall mark and finished tied for eighth place with a 10-11-7 CCHA record.

**BOB DANIELS:** The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also

honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 133-155-30 (.465) league mark.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 12th season, 182-209-33 (.468) – (18-11-1 vs. Alaska Fairbanks – Away 8-10-1, Home 10-1-0). **Alaska Fairbanks** – **Guy Gadowsky** (Colorado College, 1989), 5th season, 53-73-21 (.432) – (3-9-0 vs. Ferris State). Gadowsky was honored as the 2001-02 CCHA Coach of the Year.

**ABOUT ALASKA FAIRBANKS:** The Nanooks are paced in scoring by senior forward Ryan Campbell (1-3-4), who ranked third in team scoring last year with 25 points (14-11-25). Senior defenseman Felipe Larranaga (0-3-3), senior forward Cam Keith (1-0-1) and junior forward Jared Sylvestre (0-0-0) are other notable JAF returnees from a season ago. Junior Keith Bartusch (1-3-0, 4.67 GAA, .821sv%) has been the Nanook's primary goaltender this season.

**BULLDOG BITES:** Junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** posted his 42nd career victory at Colgate last Saturday to move into a tie with Rob Hughston (1981-85; 42-53-7) as the school's all-time winningest netminder. Brown has compiled a 42-25-1 career mark in 70 net appearances. He's also 22 saves shy of tying Marc Felicio's (1987-91) fifth-place 1,876 career save total among Ferris' all-time saves leaders list . . . Junior right wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ont.)**

surpassed the 75 career point barrier with a pair of assists in last Saturday's game and is now 29-47-76 in 82 career outings . . . Ferris State snapped a 0-for-21 power-play drought as a result of junior center **Jeff Legue's (Cornwall, Ont.)** first goal of the season in Saturday's second period action . . . Sophomore right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** had his season-opening three-game point string snapped at Colgate Saturday. Rallo posted a team-high five points (1-4-5) in the Bulldogs' first three outings this campaign . . . Senior center **Trevor Large (Brampton, Ont.)** has five points (4-1-5) in 10 career contests against Alaska Fairbanks . . . Freshman right wing **Zac Pearson (White Lake)** tallied his first college goal in his collegiate debut last Saturday which proved to be the game-winning tally . . . Frosh left wing **Eric Vesely (Woodstock, Ill.)** assisted on Pearson's goal in his collegiate debut . . . The Bulldogs play six of their first eight conference games this season against 'cluster' opponents. Playing against Bowling Green State, Notre Dame and rivalry partner Western Michigan last season, FSU compiled a cluster-leading 21 points with a 10-1-1 mark . . . Ferris' top three points leaders this season - **Greg Rallo** (1-4-5), senior center **Brett Smith** (2-2-4) and **Jeff Legue** (2-1-3) have combined for 38.7% (12-31) of the squad's total points production to date . . . FSU enters this weekend's series at Alaska Fairbanks having won 10 of its last 11 CCHA regular-season games. The Bulldogs wrapped up league regular-season play in 2002-03 with a nine-game winning streak . . . **Jeff Legue** has totaled multiple-point game efforts in five (5-8-13) of his last 10 outings dating back to last campaign. Legue, who had a team-high 11-game point streak (7-10-17) last winter, amassed 11 points (3-8-11) in his final six games a season ago. His 19 multi-point game performances ranked second among the team's leaders in 2002-03 . . . The Bulldogs are making their fifth straight trip to Fairbanks in as many seasons. FSU sports a 5-3-0 mark in its last eight meetings at UAF.
