FERRIS BEGINS THE NEW YEAR HOSTING ALASKA FAIRBANKS

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will attempt to extend its current seven-game unbeaten streak this weekend (Jan. 2-3) as the Bulldogs begin the 2004 portion of their schedule with a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) home series against the University of Alaska Fairbanks Nanooks at Big Rapids, Mich.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State evened its overall record to 8-8-2 and is 4-7-1 in the CCHA following a pair of non-league victories at last weekend's (Dec. 27-28) 15th annual Badger Hockey Showdown in Madison, Wis. FSU advanced to the championship game after registering a 7-4 semifinal-round victory over Massachusetts-Lowell before knocking off nationally-ranked Wisconsin, 3-1. The Bulldogs received votes in both this week's *The USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and *Inside College Hockey.com* polls.

• A season ago, Ferris State enjoyed its most successful season in the program's NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

Alaska Fairbanks, which is 8-8-0 overall and 7-5-0 in the CCHA, returns to the ice following a two week plus layoff. In their most recent action (Dec. 12-13), the Nanooks split a league series against Lake Superior State at Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. UAF suffered a 7-2 loss to the Lakers in the opener (Dec. 12) before notching a 7-4 victory in the series' finale (Dec. 13). The Nanooks, who are 1-7-0 on the road, have won three of their last four outings.

• A season ago, UAF compiled a 15-14-7 overall mark and finished tied for eighth place in the CCHA with a 10-11-7 league record.

BOB DANIELS: The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 136-161-31 (.462) league mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State - **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 12th season, 188-215-35 (.469) - (18-13-1 vs. Alaska Fairbanks - Home 10-1-0, Away 8-12-1). **Alaska Fairbanks - Guy Gadowsky** (Colorado College, 1989), 5th season, 60-78-21 (.443) - (5-9-0 vs. Ferris State). Gadowsky was the 2001-02 CCHA Coach of the Year.

ABOUT ALASKA FAIRBANKS: Sophomore left wing Kelly Czuy (7-10-17) leads six players in double-digit scoring. Senior wings Cam Keith (8-6-14) and Ryan Campbell (5-9-14) along with frosh center Curtis Fraser (7-7-14) are other top scorers. Senior Preston McKay (5-4-0, 3.35 GAA, .897sv%) and junior Keith Bartusch (3-4-0, 3.95 GAA, .855sv%) are the primary goaltenders this campaign.

GAMES THIS WEEK

Friday, January 2

BULLDOG BITES: Ferris State captured its first tournament title since 1999 and ended the longest undefeated streak in the nation as the Bulldogs topped Wisconsin, 3-1 in the championship game of the 15th annual Badger Hockey Showdown. The host Badgers had gone 15 games (11-0-4) without a loss. FSU won the 1999 Silverado Shootout in Duluth, Minn., as the Bulldogs bested Boston University skated to a 4-3 tourney-opening triumph over Boston University and then recorded a 4-0 win against Northeastern in the round-robin format tourney . . . Junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** was selected the Most Outstanding Player of the Badger Hockey Showdown while senior defenseman **Simon Mangos (Caledon, Ont.)** and junior center **Mike Kinnie (Shelby Township)**, who had four points (2-2-4) in the tourney, were named to the all-tournament team . . .

Senior center **Brett Smith** (5-7-12) and **Simon Mangos** (2-8-10) are the Bulldogs' top points leaders during the season's current seven-game unbeaten streak (5-0-2). **Mike Brown** has posted a 1.96 goals against average (14 goals allowed) with a .935 save percentage (202 saves) during that period . . . Junior left wing **Carter Thomson (Milden, Sask.)** tallied his fourth goal of the season at Wisconsin, which represented a career season high surpassing his three markers in 35 games a season ago . . . **Mike Brown's** 72 saves last weekend moved him ahead of Vince Owen (1997-01; 2,229 saves) into third place on FSU's career saves list with 2,246 stops . . . **Brett Smith** has compiled 13 points (5-8-13) in his last eight games and had his team-high seven-game point streak snapped against Wisconsin . . . Sophomore center **Matt Rutkowski (Sterling Heights)** returned to action after missing the last 10 games due to an injury and picked up an assist in the Wisconsin contest.

BULLDOGS RECEIVE HONORS: FSU's **Simon Mangos** and **Mike Brown** were named the CCHA's Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week, respectively for their performances at the Badger Hockey Showdown last weekend. Mangos totaled four points (1-3-4) in the tourney highlighted by three assists in the semifinal contest while Brown blocked 72-of-77 shots for a .935 save percentage. Last season, Mangos was honored as the league's Defensive Player of the Week while Brown received the award a league-record six times. Brown has also been recognized as this week's *U.S. College Hockey Online's* (USCHO) Defensive Player of the Week and was among five players who garnered runner-up honors as the *Inside College.com's* (INCH) Player of the Week.

The 2003-04 season marks the fourth year of the Perani Cup Three Stars, which is awarded following each CCHA regular-season game. Players from each school earn points throughout the season each time they're named a "star of the game" (5 points for 1st star, 3 points for 2nd star, and 1 point for 3rd star).
