FSU RESUMES LEAGUE PLAY THIS WEEKEND AT BOWLING GREEN STATE

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team resumes Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) play this weekend (Dec. 5-6) as the Bulldogs visit the Bowling Green State University Falcons at Bowling Green, Ohio.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/BGSU Ice Arena (5,000).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State improved to 5-8-1 overall and is 3-7-0 in the CCHA after going 1-0-1 in last weekend's (Nov. 28-29) non-league series against Niagara at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. Ferris skated to a 2-2 overtime deadlock last Friday (Nov. 28) and then registered an 8-3 victory over the Purple Eagles in Saturday's (Nov. 29) rematch. The Bulldogs are currently 1-6-0 in away outings this season.

◆ A season ago, Ferris State registered its most successful season in the program's 25-year NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

Bowling Green State is 3-7-5 overall and 2-6-2 in the CCHA to date following a 7-0 league home loss to nationally-ranked Ohio State last Saturday (Nov. 29) at the BGSU Ice Arena in Bowling Green, Ohio. The Falcons, who are 2-3-2 in home outings this season, are 1-3-3 in their last seven appearances. BGSU has participated in seven overtime encounters this campaign which includes four of its last five contests.

◆ Bowling Green State finished the 2002-03 campaign at 8-25-3 overall, which included an 11th-place 5-20-3 CCHA record.

BOB DANIELS: The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time win-

ningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 135-161-30 (.460) league mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels**

(Michigan State, 1982), 12th season, 185-215-34 (.465) – (17-14-4 vs. Bowling Green State – Away 7-10-2, Home 10-4-2). **Bowling Green State** – **Scott Paluch** (Bowling Green State, 1991), 2nd season, 11-32-8 (.294) – (0-4-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT BOWLING GREEN STATE: The Falcons are paced in scoring by senior forwards Mark Wires (5-4-9) and D'Arcy McConvey (2-6-8). Sophomore forward Brett Pilkington (5-2-7) and senior defenseman Kevin Biekxa (2-5-7) are other leading point getters for BGSU. Junior goaltender Jordan Sigalet (3-7-5, 2.66 GAA, .909sv%) has been the lone Falcons' netminder this campaign. He leads the CCHA with 412 saves and is averaging 27.47 saves per contest while leading the nation with 924:56 minutes played.

BULLDOG BITES: Junior center **Mike Kinnie (Shelby Township)** recorded his first career trick in Saturday's win over Niagara which represented the first three-goal game by a Ferris skater since Brian McCullough posted one in a 5-5 overtime tie against Nebraska-Omaha (1/28/00) . . . Senior center **Brett Smith (Guelph, Ont.)** is three points shy of matching his career season-high of 17 points set in 42 games last season. Smith, who has 3-4-7 during a current four-game point streak, has compiled a team-leading 14 points (7-7-14) in as many outings this campaign. He recorded his first career three-point game in Saturday's victory with 2-1-3 . . . Ferris State's eight goals versus Niagara last Saturday were its most since scoring eight times last season in an 8-1 series finale triumph at Niagara (1/4) . . . Sophomore defenseman **Jeremy Scherlinck (Grosse Pointe)** recorded four assists in the Bulldogs' series against Niagara, including a career-high tying three assists Saturday. Scherlinck's game assist total matched his three helpers versus Lake Superior State in the 2003 CCHA Tournament First-Round series finale (3/15). The 2002-03 CCHA All-Rookie Team Honorable Mention honoree also also snapped a personal 15-game point drought with an assist in Friday's contest . . . Senior defenseman **Simon Mangos' (Caledon, Ont.)** four points (all assists) in Saturday's affair was a career high, eclipsing his seven career two-point game games. Mangos, a second-team All-CCHA pick last season, has six points (1-5-6) in his last three contests after being held point-less in his initial 11 outings this campaign . . . The Bulldogs have outshot the opposition in three of its last four games and are averaging 40.8 shots on goal (163 total) during that period . . . Senior right wing **Derrick McIver (Thunder Bay, Ont.)** has totaled 3-1-4 of his season's seven total points (4-3-7) in his last three appearances and has a current three-game point string with a goal in each contest . . . With a tie and victory against Niagara this last weekend, FSU is now 17-7-1 (.700) all-time against College Hockey America (CHA) programs . . . Ferris' top two point getters this season - **Brett Smith (7-7-14)** and junior forward **Derek Nesbitt (3-8-11)** have combined for 24.0% (25-104) of the squad's total points production . . . **Mike Kinnie** is three points shy of compiling his 50th career point and has 47 points (25-22-47) in 80 career contests . . . Junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)**, a 2002-03 First-Team All-American and All-CCHA selection, owns a 5-0-0 mark with a 1.50 goals against average and a .936 save percentage in five career appearances versus Bowling Green State.

The 2003-04 season marks the fourth year of the Perani Cup Three Stars, which is awarded following each CCHA regular-season game.
