FERRIS CONTINUES HOMESTAND VERSUS FINDLAY THIS WEEKEND

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will continue its current five-game homestand this weekend (Jan. 23-24) as the Bulldogs host the University of Findlay Oilers in a non-league series at Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

FSU TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for 2003-04 regular-season home games are available by contacting the FSU Athletics Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (EST) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 11-11-2 overall and 7-10-1 in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) as a result of splitting a league home series against nationally-ranked Miami (Ohio) last weekend (Jan. 16-17) in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs skated to a 5-4 decision over the RedHawks last Friday (Jan. 16) before being dealt a 4-2 loss in Saturday's (Jan. 17) rematch. Ferris, which is 6-4-1 at home this campaign, currently sports a 8-3-2 in its 13 contests.

• A season ago, Ferris State enjoyed its most successful season in the program's NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

Findlay is presently 5-16-3 overall and 2-7-1 in College Hockey America (CHA) after splitting a home league series with Niagara last weekend (Jan. 16-17) at UF's Clauss Ice Arena in Findlay, Ohio. The Oilers, who are 2-10-0 in road contests this season, are 1-8-3 in their last 12 outings to date. This season will represent UF's final one with varsity status as the program will be reverting to club and intramural status.

• Findlay registered a 10-21-4 overall mark in the 2002-03 season while posting a fifth-place 3-13-4 record in the CHA.

BOB DANIELS: The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 139-164-31 (.463) league mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 12th season, 191-218-35 (.469) – (1-1-0 vs. Findlay – Home 1-1-0, Away 0-0-0). **Findlay – Pat Ford** (Wisconsin, 1990), 1st season, 5-16-3 (.271) – (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT FINDLAY: The Oilers have five individuals with double-figure points this season. Senior center Christian Olson (6-8-14) is the team's points leaders while junior right wing Kris Wiebe (11-2-13) along with junior center Mark Bastl (9-3-12) and senior defenseman Nate Markus (2-10-12) are other notable point getters. Freshman Will Hooper (4-11-2, 2.84 GAA, .907sv%) is UF's primary goaltender and is backed up by sophomore Jon Horrell (1-5-1, 3.82 GAA, .887sv%).

GAMES THIS WEEK

BULLDOG BITES: Junior defenseman **Skip Renaud (Regina, Sask.)** tallied his first collegiate goal in Saturday's game against Miami. The marker snapped a personal 50 career game non-goal scoring string . . . Sophomore right wing **Greg Rallo's (Gurnee, Ill.)** three points (1-2-3) versus Miami last Friday matched his previous career game high (2-1-3) against Northern Michigan last season (1/18). Rallo has accumulated 12 multiple-point game efforts to date in his Ferris career . . . The Bulldogs are presently 16-7-1 against College Hockey America (CHA) teams, which includes an 8-5-1 home ledger . . . Junior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ont.)** reached the century mark in career

points with a goal and an assist in Friday's outing. He has totaled 100 points (36-64-100) in 102 career contests and is 20 points shy from tying Dean Cowling (1985-89) for 21st place among the program's all-time points leaders . . . Senior defenseman **Simon Mangos (Caledon, Ont.)** scored his 21st career goal last Friday to move into a tie for eighth place with Troy Milam (1999-03) for most career tallies by a FSU defenseman. Mangos has 48 career points (21-27-48) in 139 contests to date . . . Ferris has been assessed double digits in penalties 12 games this season, including five times in its last seven encounters. The Bulldogs recorded double figures in penalties on 15 occasions a season ago . . . Senior center **Brett Smith (4-4-8)**, **Simon Mangos (1-7-8)** and junior center **Mike Kinnie (6-2-8)** are FSU's leading scorers in six non-league contests this season. **Mangos** has eight points (1-7-8) in his last three non-league outings while **Kinnie** has seven points (5-2-7) . . . Junior netminder **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** is 4-1-1 with a 2.63 goals against average (16 goals allowed) and a .908 save percentage (157 saves) in the six non-conference games this campaign . . . FSU's seven-member junior class has presently accounted for 39.5% (30-76) of the team's goal production this season . . . Head coach **Bob Daniels** is nine victories away from his 200th career win. Daniels, the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the CCHA Coach of the Year, is also the program's all-time winningest coach . . . **Brett Smith** has a career high and team-best 10 multi-point games this season.

The 2003-04 season marks the fourth year of the Perani Cup Three Stars, which is awarded following each CCHA regular-season game.
