### FERRIS HOSTS LAKE SUPERIOR IN LAST REGULAR-SEASON HOME SERIES

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team, which was idle last weekend, hosts the Lake Superior State University Lakers this weekend (Feb. 27-28) in a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series at Big Rapids, Mich. The series marks FSU's final regular-season home contests for the 2003-04 campaign.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is 14-15-3 overall and 9-14-1 after losing a pair of CCHA games to Notre Dame two weeks ago (Feb. 13-14) at UND's Joyce Center in Notre Dame, Ind. The Bulldogs are 5-6-1 in their last 12 appearances and are midst a three-game losing string. Ferris sports a 9-5-2 home record this season.

• A season ago, Ferris State turned in its most successful season in the program's NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

**Lake Superior State** improved to 7-16-7 overall and 5-14-5 in the CCHA following a win and tie versus Northern Michigan in last weekend's (Feb. 20-21) home-and-home series. The Lakers claimed a 5-2 win over the Wildcats last Friday (Feb. 20) at NMU's Berry Events Center in Marquette, Mich. The next night (Feb. 21), the two teams skated to a 2-2 overtime tie at LSSU's Taffy Abel Arena in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. LSSU, which is 3-8-3 on the road this season, is 1-0-2 in its last three appearances after going winless in its previous nine contests.

• LSSU posted a 6-28-4 overall record with a 12th-place 3-24-1 CCHA mark last season.

**BOB DANIELS:** The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among

active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 141-168-31 (.460) league mark.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 12th season, 194-222-36 (.469) – (12-19-3 vs. Lake Superior State – Home 6-9-2, Away 6-9-1, Neutral 0-1-0). **Lake Superior State – Frank Anzalone** (SUNY-Buffalo, 1978), 11th season, 212-179-35 (.539) – (20-17-3 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT LAKE SUPERIOR STATE:** Freshman forward Dominic Osman (10-9-19) is tops among seven Lakers in double-figure points this season. Junior forward Bo Cheesman (11-7-18) and frosh forward Trent Campbell (3-13-16) are other leading scorers. Freshman Jeff Jakaitis (3-6-4, 2.16 GAA, .930sv%) and junior Matt Violin (4-10-3, 3.43 GAA, .883sv%) have shared LSSU's goaltending duties. Jakaitis presently ranks fourth nationally in save percentage and 11th in goals against average. Second-year assistant coach Tim Christian played at Ferris State (1991-95).

#### February 27

Lake Superior State at Ferris State\*, 7:35 p.m.

**BULLDOG BITES:** Junior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ont.)** has produced a team-leading 21 points (9-12-21) in 17 career February contests . . . The Bulldogs are averaging 3.44 goals (55 total) in 16 home dates this season compared to 2.13 (32 total) in 15 away outings for a 1.31 differential . . . Ferris State is 18-26-4 (.417) all-time in its final two regular-season home encounters, which includes an 8-17-3 (.339) record since 1990 . . . Junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** needs 25 saves to move into a second-place tie with Mike Williams (1986-90) on FSU's all-time saves leaders chart. Brown has accumulated 2,631 career saves in 98 games while Williams totaled 2,656 saves in 103 career appearances . . . The Bulldogs haven't scored a power play goal in their last 22 opportunities. FSU hasn't tallied a power play marker in 19 contests this campaign after going without one in 14 games last season . . . Senior right wing **Derrick McIver (Thunder Bay, Ont.)** is four points shy of matching his career high of 22 points (11-11-22) set in 42 contests during the 2001-02 season. McIver has recorded 19 points (10-9-19) in 32 outings this season.

McIver's 10 goals this campaign equals his career-best output in '01-02 . . . Prior to this Saturday's regular-season home finale, Ferris will recognize its five-member senior class – **McIver**, center **Brett Smith (Guelph, Ont.)**, center **Trevor Large (Brampton, Ont.)**, defenseman **Simon Mangos (Caldeon, Ont.)** and goaltender **Matt Swanson (Clinton Township) . . . Simon Mangos** is presently tied for ninth place in career games played as Ferris defenseman with 147 total. Mangos (23-29-52), who's tied with Jim Dube (1997-01) and Scott Lewis (1997-01), is eight contests away from tying John Gruden (1990-94) and Troy Milam (1999-03) for the top position . . . Sophomore netminder **Tom Mueller (Cadillac)**, who was required to sit out last season after transferring from NCAA Division III Minnesota-Crookston, made his FSU debut in the series finale (2/14) at Notre Dame after starter **Mike Brown** was forced to leave the contest early in the second period due to an injury. **Mueller** stopped 15 total shots in the game, including 11 in the third period . . . Junior left wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ont.)**, who has 17 points (8-9-17) in 18 February games, is three points shy of registering his 100th career point. Nesbitt has 39-58-97 in 110 career contests . . . **Trevor Large** tallied his fourth point this season with a goal at Notre Dame (2/13) as all of his points this campaign have occurred on goals . . . Junior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)**, who has been sidelined the last 10 outings as a result of an injury, is expected back in the lineup this weekend. York has tallied 14 points (6-8-14) in as many career February games . . . Ferris has produced a 2.94 goals a game average (94 total) in 32 outings this campaign after generating an average of 4.47 markers (143 total) during the same period last season. The Bulldogs have also allowed 3.28 goals per contest (105 total) this year compared to 2.41 (77 total) in the 2002-03 campaign.
