FERRIS STATE TANGLES WITH MIAMI (OHIO) IN LEAGUE HOME ACTION

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will entertain the Miami (Ohio) University RedHawks this weekend (Jan. 16-17) in Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) action at Big Rapids, Mich. The series represents the only regular-season meetings between the two teams during the 2003-04 campaign.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (pronounced A-VAH-glave-in) (2,493).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 10-10-2 overall with a 6-9-1 record in the CCHA as a result of gaining a split in last week's (Jan. 7-8) league series at Nebraska-Omaha. The Bulldogs, who are 6-2-1 in their last nine games, skated to a 5-2 triumph over the Mavericks last Wednesday (Jan. 7) at the Qwest Center Omaha in Omaha, Neb. However, UNO rebounded the next night (Jan. 8) to garner a 6-1 victory against Ferris. FSU is listed among those teams receiving votes in this week's *U.S. College Hockey Online* poll.

☛ A season ago, Ferris State enjoyed its most successful season in the program's NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

Miami (Ohio) is 12-8-2 overall and 9-4-1 in the CCHA following a league series split with Northern Michigan last weekend (Jan. 9-10) at NMU's Berry Events Center in Marquette, Mich. The RedHawks lost a 5-2 decision to the Wildcats in the series' opener (Jan. 9) before recording a 3-2 triumph Saturday (Jan. 10). Miami, which is 9-3-0 in its last 12 outings, is 4-2-1 in road encounters this season. The RedHawks are ranked as high as 12th nationally by *Inside College Hockey.com* this week.

☛ Miami registered a 21-17-3 overall record last season, including a 13-12-3 CCHA mark (fifth-place tie).

BOB DANIELS: The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I

National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 138-163-31 (.462) league mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 12th season, 190-217-35 (.469) – (11-18-5 vs. Miami – Home 6-6-3, Away 5-11-2, Neutral 0-1-0). **Miami (Ohio)** – **Enrico Blasi** (Miami, 1994), 5th season, 78-83-12 (.486) – (6-3-1 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT MIAMI (OHIO): The RedHawks are led in scoring by senior center Derek Edwardson (12-18-30), who has a CCHA-best 22 league-points (11-11-22). Senior center Mike Kompon (6-20-26), senior right wing Greg Hogeboom (11-13-24), freshman left wing Matt Christie (14-6-20) and frosh right wing Marty Guerin (7-13-20) are other top scorers. Freshman Brandon Crawford-West (10-3-1, 2.62 GAA, .892sv%) is the top goaltender.

BULLDOG BITES: Senior right wing **Derrick McIver (Thunder Bay, Ont.)** has registered a point in nine of his last 11 contests while totaling 11 points (7-4-11) during that period . . . Sophomore center **Matt Rutkowski (Sterling Heights)** has posted six points (1-5-6) in his last six outings after being sidelined the previous 10 due to an injury. He tallied his first collegiate goal on a FSU power play in Wednesday's contest at Nebraska-Omaha . . . Ferris is averaging 36.9 shots on goal per

game (332 total shots) in its last nine contests . . . **Derrick McIver** has notched a team-high two short-handed goals this season with both occurring against Nebraska-Omaha (11/22 and 1/8) . . . FSU's top forward line of freshman left wing **Mark Bomersback (7-7-14)**, senior center **Brett Smith (10-15-25)** and **Derrick McIver (8-6-14)** have accounted for 30.5% (53-174) of the team's points output and 36.2% (25-69) of its goal-scoring production . . . **Brett Smith (Guelph, Ont.)** has compiled a team-best 13 points (6-7-13) in nine home games this season while junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** is 5-3-1 with a 2.96 goals against average (27 goals allowed) and an .897 save percentage (236 saves) during that span . . . The Bulldogs play five of their remaining six January contests at home while nine of their final 14 regular-season games are in Big Rapids . . . **Brett Smith** has totaled a team-high nine multi-point games this campaign. In his previous three seasons, the FSU assistant captain accumulated a combined three multiple-game performances . . . Senior defenseman **Simon Mangos (Caledon, Ont.)**, a 2002-03 All-CCHA Second-Team honoree, is four points shy of notching his 50th career point and has amassed 46 points (20-26-46) in 137 career outings to date. His 20 goals ranks tied for ninth with George Harrison (1977-81) and Paul Pickard (1979-81) among the Bulldogs' all-time defensemen goal-scoring leaders . . . Junior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ont.)** needs two more points to reach the century mark. The 2002-03 All-CCHA Second-Team pick has 98 career points (35-63-98) in 100 contests and is 22 points away from tying Dean Cowling's (1985-89) 120 career points for 21st place on the school's all-time points leaders chart.
