### BULLDOGS WRAP UP REGULAR SEASON AT NORTHERN MICHIGAN

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team concludes the regular season portion of its 2003-04 campaign this weekend (March 5-6) with a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series versus the Northern Michigan University Wildcats in Marquette, Mich.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday & Saturday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) /Berry Events Center (3,902).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is 15-16-3 overall and 10-15-1 in the CCHA after splitting its league regular-season home finale series against the Lake Superior State Lakers last weekend (Feb. 27-28) at FSU's Ewigeleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs, who are 2-4-0 in their last six games, are 4-10-1 in away outings this campaign.

• A season ago, Ferris State turned in its most successful season in the program's NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

Northern Michigan is 16-14-4 overall and 11-13-2 in the CCHA as a result of suffering a 2-1 loss and then skating to a 2-2 overtime tie at Bowling Green State last weekend (Feb. 27-28) in a two-game league set at the BGSU Ice Arena in Bowling Green, Ohio. The Wildcats, who are 10-4-0 at home this season, are 6-3-3 in their last 12 contests but are winless in the last four outings (0-2-2).

• Northern Michigan posted a 22-17-2 overall mark with a fifth-place tying 14-13-1 CCHA record last season.

**BOB DANIELS:** The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 142-169-31 (.461) league mark.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – Bob Daniels (Michigan State, 1982), 12th season, 195-223-36 (.469) – (11-11-1 vs. Northern Michigan – Away 7-5-0, Home 3-6-1, Neutral 1-0-0).

**Northern Michigan – Walt Kyle** (Northern Michigan, 1981), 2nd season, 38-31-6 (.547) – (1-2-0 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT NORTHERN MICHIGAN:** The Wildcats, who have 11 skaters with double-figure point total, are led in scoring by freshman forward Darin Olver (11-19-30), sophomore defenseman Nathan Oystriick (6-20-26) and sophomore forward Dirk Southern (9-13-22), a CCHA All-Rookie Team honoree last season.

Sophomore defenseman Jamie Milam (8-13-21) and junior forward Kevin Gardner (7-11-18) are other top NMU point getters. Senior Craig Kowalski (16-14-4, 2.74 GAA, .918sv%), who's currently ranked 17th nationally in save percentage, is the Wildcats' top goaltender and is backed up by junior Tuomas Tarkki (0-0-0, 4.00 GAA, .808sv%). NMU is listed seventh in the nation for penalty-kill percentage (.871) this week.

**BULLDOG BITES:** Ferris State is 20-25-3 (.448) all-time in its final two regular-season contests, which includes a 13-17-2 (.438) road mark . . . Junior left wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ont.)** is one point away from registering his 100th career point. He has compiled 99 career points (40-59-99) in 112 contests . . . Junior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ont.)**, who posted three points (1-2-3) in the Lake Superior State series, has totaled 13 career points (4-9-13) in eight career appearances versus the Lakers . . . **Nesbitt** (4-6-10) and senior center **Brett Smith** (3-7-10) are the Bulldogs' road scoring leaders this campaign in 15 away outings . . . Junior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)** produced three points (all assists) against Lake Superior State after missing the previous 10 games

due to an injury suffered at Nebraska-Omaha (1/8) . . . Sophomore center **Tim Vokey (Mississauga, Ont.)** tallied his first point this season with a goal in last Friday's series opener versus LSSU. Prior to that contest, Vokey hadn't netted a marker since last season (10/19) against Bowling Green State which represented his lone point of the campaign in eight games . . . Ferris exceeded the 20 league point plateau for the sixth consecutive season following Friday's victory. The last time FSU recorded below 20 league points in a season was in 1996-97 with a ninth-place 7-18-2 CCHA mark . . . Junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** moved into second place on Ferris' all-time saves leaders list this last weekend and has 2,670 career saves in 100 games to date. He surpassed Mike Williams' (1986-90) 2,656 save total and now trails Rob Hughston (1981-85) for first place by 374 saves . . . **Jeff Legue** has at least a point in five of his last six contests while notching eight points (5-3-8) during that span. He's 10 points shy of tying Dean Cowling's (1985-89) 21st place 120 career points on the Bulldogs' all-time scoring chart . . . Former FSU head coach and current Edmonton Oilers scout **Bob Mancini**, who coached the Bulldogs from 1990-92, was recently named general manager of the Ontario Hockey League's Saginaw Spirit. Mancini will join the club July 1 following his scouting commitment at the 2004 NHL Draft . . . **Jeff Legue** picked up his 69th career assist Saturday to tie Dean Cowling and Val Passarelli (1992-96) for 18th place among the school's all-time leaders. He now trails Tom Rudrud (1979-83) for 17th place by five assists . . . **Legue** (4-12-16, 13 GP) and **Derek Nesbitt** (9-7-16, 13 GP) are the team's points leaders in all-time March contests. A season ago, Nesbitt finished second on the squad to Chris Kunitz's 18 points (7-11-18) with 15 points (9-6-15) in nine contests while Legue's 14 points (4-10-14) in nine outings was third best . . . Senior defenseman **Simon Mangos (Caledon, Ont.)** needs a goal to tie Ron Andrzejewski (1976-80) for fifth place on FSU's all-time scoring defensemen list. Mangos has 24
