2003-04: A strong defender . . . Solid decision-maker . . . Will compete for ice time . . . Possesses a good shot . . . Shows good composure on the ice . . . Must continue to increase his speed to match game's tempo . . . A stay-at-home defender . . . Carries two seasons of college experience into this campaign.

2002-03: Skated in 12 games . . . Notched a season-high two assists against Bowling Green State (10/18) . . . Compiled four points (0-4-4) in Ferris State's first four season contests . . . Produced an assist and was +2 against St. Cloud State (10/12) . . . Added a helper in league series finale versus Bowling Green State (10/19) . . . Turned in a +1 effort in CCHA Tourney First-Round series against Lake Superior State (3/14).

2001-02: Appeared in 18 contests but didn't register a point . . . Played in the final 14 games of the season after being sidelined the previous 19 of 22 contests . . . Had four shots on goal during the campaign, which included one apiece at Michigan State (10/20), versus Bemidji State (1/25), at Northern Michigan (2/1) and against Michigan State (3/1) . . . Registered a +1 rating against Miami, Ohio (10/27), at Northern Michigan (2/2) and at Western Michigan (2/22).

HIGH SCHOOL/JUNIOR: Competed two seasons (1999-01) for the Ft. McMurray Oil Barons of the Alberta Junior Hockey League . . . Played under coach Fran Gow and Kevin Higo . . . Netted 38 points on 10 goals and 28 assists in the 2000-01 season as the Oil Barons were 37-22-5 overall . . . Selected Ft. McMurray's Top Defenseman for the 2000-01 campaign . . . Chosen a first-team all-star (top two defenseman in division) and played in the AJHL All-Star Game . . . Had two goals and 13 assists for 15 points with Ft. McMurray in 1999-00 . . . Helped lead the Oil Barons to their first-ever Royal Bank Cup and Canadian National Junior A Hockey Championship title . . . A 2000 Robert Usher Collegiate High School graduate in Regina, Saskatchewan.

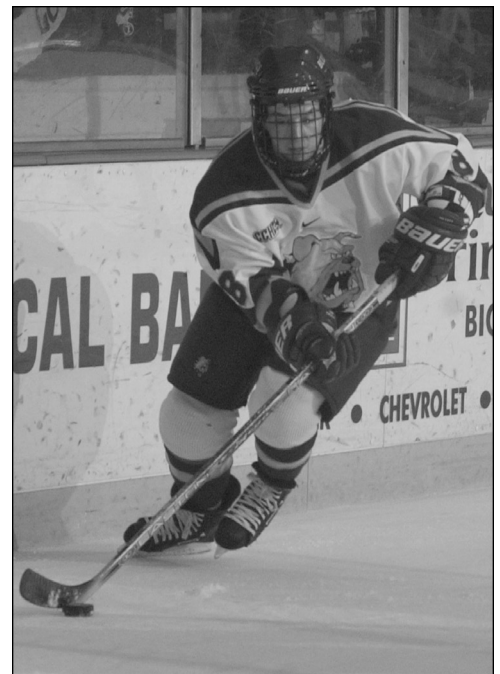

Registered 43 points on 25 goals and 18 assists in 2000-01 . . . Two-time team captain and team MVP . . . Posted 33 goals and added 25 assists for a team-leading 58 points along with three hat tricks in the 1999-00 campaign en route to attaining team Rookie-of-the-Year honors . . . Named to MWHJL All-Star Team . . . Compiled 68 points with 38 goals and 30 assists in 29 games in guiding Big Rapids High School to a 20-7-2 overall record during his senior year . . .

Prepped by former FSU standout Jim Baker . . . Tallied 42 goals and picked up 30 assists for 72 points in junior season as the Cardinals notched a 25-2-1 mark . . . Racked up a combined 10 hat tricks in prep career, including six as a junior in 1997-98 . . . Two-year all-state honoree and team MVP in hockey . . . A 1999 graduate of Big Rapids High School . . . Competed four years in football and three in baseball . . . Academic all-state pick and team MVP in football . . . All-area and all-region selection in baseball . . . Served in Student Government.

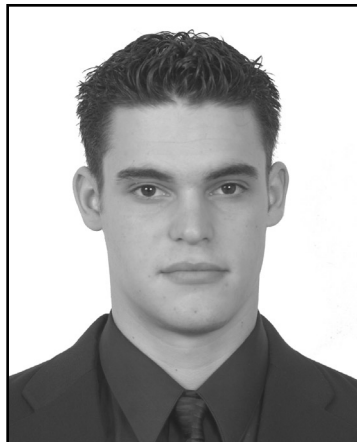

2003-04: A solid blue line performer . . . Tall and rangy . . . Displays great poise with the puck and is an intelligent decision maker . . . Excellent passer who has good vision on the ice . . . Skates well for his size . . . Should continue action in penalty-kill situations.

2002-03: A Bauer/CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention Team pick . . . Placed 10th in team scoring with 18 points in all 42 games . . . Netted seven points (0-7-7) during a five-game point string . . . Posted five points (0-5-5) in a three-game span (3/14-21), which included an assist in FSU's 4-2 win against Northern Michigan in the semifinal round (3/21) of the CCHA Super 6 Championship . . . Compiled four multi-point games (ninth highest on team), including a season-best three points (all assists) against Lake Superior State in first-round CCHA Tourney series finale (3/15) . . . His initial collegiate goal represented the game winner in a 10-1 home triumph over Bowling Green State (10/18) . . . Notched two assists in three home occasions – versus Bowling Green State (10/19), Wayne State (11/8), and Western Michigan (11/15) . . . Finished fifth on squad in game-winning assists with five total.

HIGH SCHOOL/JUNIOR: A two-year (2000-02) member of the North American Hockey League's Capital Centre Pride in Lansing, Mich. . . Coached by Jeff Blum . . . Posted 30 points (tied for eighth on team) with 10 goals and 20 assists in 45 games in 2001-02 . . . Totaled nine goals (eight power-play markers) with 15 assists for 24 points in 27 outings with the Pride in the 2000-01 season . . . Produced 35 points on 10 goals and 25 assists with the Metro AA Jets in 1999-00 as squad was 38-5-2 overall . . . Competed for Belle Tire Bantam A Team in 1998-99, scoring 11 goals with 20 assists for 31 points as team notched a 24-1-0 overall ledge . . . Graduated in 2001 from Grosse Point North High School in Grosse Pointe Woods, Mich.
