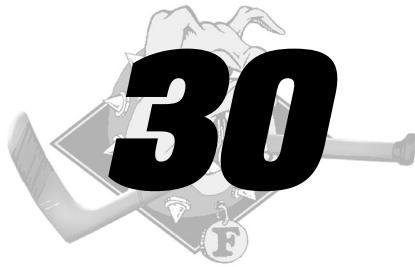


THE 2003-04 BULLDOGS

2003-04: A preseason All-America candidate . . . Displays a tremendous amount of composure in pressure situations . . . Has proven to be one of the nation's elite.

2002-03: Both an AHCA All-America and All-CCHA First Team performer . . . CCHA Perani Cup Three-Star Champion and was selected the CCHA's Defensive Player of the Week a league-record six times . . . A NCAA West Regional All-Tourney Team member . . .

Set a Ferris single-season record for victories and saves while his four shutouts tied a school mark . . . Ranks tops among FSU all-time leaders in save pct. and second in both victories and goals against average . . . Placed third nationally in save pct., fifth in winning pct., and 10th in goals against average . . .

Had a career-best 11-game winning streak (2/1-3/21) and an eight-game victory string (10/12-11/8) . . . Posted 15 30-save or more game performances, including 44-save efforts vs. Nebraska-Omaha (3/1) and North Dakota (3/28).

2001-02: All-CCHA Rookie Team pick and FSU's Rookie of the Year . . . Placed second among FSU's season leaders in save pct. (.911) and fourth in goals against average (2.66) . . . Selected CCHA Rookie of the Week (1/12) . . . Had seven 30-plus save games . . . Ranked 23rd nationally in save pct. (.911) and 24th in GAA (.266) . . . Had 26 saves and an assist versus Michigan State (3/1).

HIGH SCHOOL/JUNIOR: Spent 2000-01 with the Crowsnest Pass (Alberta) Timberwolves of the Alberta Junior Hockey League . . . Coached by Dan Olsen . . . Went 20-12-3 with a 3.77 goals against average and a .894 saves pct. en route to being named '00-01 team MVP . . . Played 1998-00 for the Ft. McMurray Oil Barons . . . Was 28-4-2 with a 2.51 GAA and a .916 saves pct. with 1999-00 AJHL Champion Ft. McMurray . . . Achieved top AJHL goaltender laurels as the Oil Barons captured the Royal Bank Cup (national champions) . . . A 2001 graduate of Henry Wise Wood High School in Calgary, Alberta.

2003-04: A fine all-around forward . . . Should receive considerable ice time this season . . . Has the size and strength to be an impact player . . . Could be another offensive sparkplug once he settles into his niche . . . Strong skater . . . Plays well at both ends of the rink.

2002-03: Competed in 18 games before suffering a season-ending injury at Lake Superior State (2/7) . . . Twice found the net, including the game-winning tally, in series opening 5-0 victory at Alaska Fairbanks (11/1) . . . Garnered two points (1-1-2) in a 6-3 series home finale triumph against St. Cloud State (10/12) . . . Picked up an assist at Niagara (1/4) . . . Saw action in 10 of team's initial 11 contests.

HIGH SCHOOL/JUNIOR: A three-year (1999-02) member of Central Junior A Hockey League's Nepean (Ontario) Raiders . . . Coached by Chris Byrne . . . Attained first-team All-CJHL accolades for the 2001-02 season as a result of totaling 87 points (50-37-87) in 50 contests . . . Placed tied for fourth among the CJHL's top point getters in 2001-02 and helped the Raiders capture the Yzerman Division Trophy . . . Tied the Nepean record twice for most single-game goals scored with five markers . . . Honored as the team's three-star award recipient in 2001-02 . . . Three-time (2001-02) CJHL All-Star Game participant and also competed in the 1998 CJHL Rookie All-Star Contest . . . Scored 30 goals and had 33 assists for 63 points in 2000-01 after compiling 57 points with 30 goals and 27 assists in 52 appearances for the 1999-00 campaign . . . A 2000 graduate of St. Pius X High in Ottawa, Ontario.

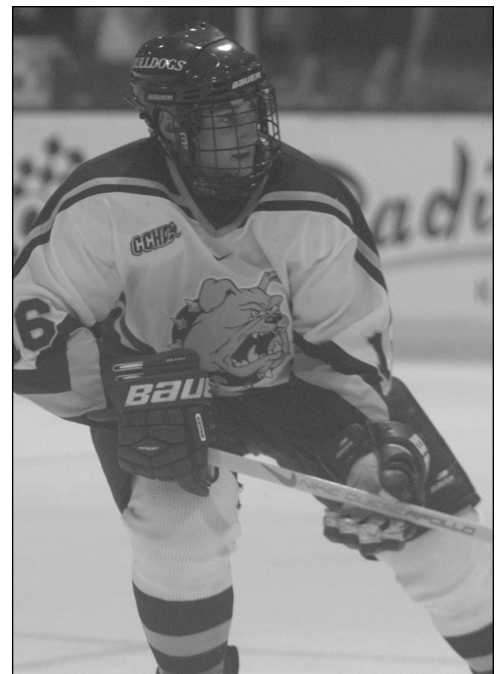

2003-04: Gifted offensive player . . . Possesses a knack for scoring and is emerging as one of the league's top goal scorers . . . Nifty and fluid skater with exciting offensive abilities . . . Equipped with excellent hands and has a solid shot . . . Starting to come into his own particularly in the offensive zone . . . Handles the puck well.

2002-03: Placed sixth in team scoring with career-best 30 points . . . Ranked 34th among CCHA's overall points leaders and tied for 37th in league scoring . . . 2001-02: Ranked 11th among team's top points leaders . . . Posted season-best two points (1-1-2) on as many occasions – at Nebraska-Omaha (11/23) and against Bemidji State (1/26) . . .

Tallied a goal apiece versus Miami, Ohio (10/26), Lake Superior State (11/3) and at Notre Dame (11/9) . . . Picked up an assist at Minnesota (12/28) in the opening-round game of the Dodge Mariucci Classic . . . Turned in a season-high three points (1-2-3) in home series versus Bemidji State (1/25-26) . . . Recorded a season-high +3 rating at Nebraska-Omaha (11/23).

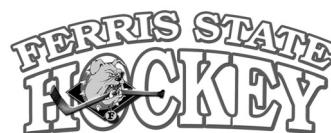

2003-04: Dependable two-way forward . . . Could receive action on specialty teams . . . Hard worker . . . Possesses an excellent shot and is a capable goal scorer . . . Plays well in the defensive end and be looked upon for added offensive production.

2002-03: Tied for 13th among squad's points leaders . . . Received playing time in 36 of FSU's 42 games . . . Tallied single-goal efforts at Michigan (1/31), Western Michigan (2/16) and against Lake Superior State (3/14) in CCHA Tourney play . . . Compiled two multi-point games – 0-2-2 versus Notre Dame (1/10) and 1-1-2 (empty netter) against North Dakota (3/28) in NCAA Tournament West Regional opener . . . Scored a goal apiece in back-to-back games at Alaska Fairbanks (11/1-2) as part of personal season-high three-game point streak (2-1-3).

2001-02: Played in all 36 games and ranked ninth in team scoring . . . Named the Steve Banonis FSU Most Improved Player . . . Turned in a pair of two-point (2-0-2) games against Bemidji State (1/26) and at Alaska Fairbanks (3/8) in CCHA Tourney opening round . . . Had a three-game point streak (2/22-3/1) with an assist in each outing . . . Compiled three points (2-1-3) in home series against Bemidji State (1/25-26).

2000-01: Totaled three points . . . Tallied a goal apiece versus Michigan (11/11) and against Air Force (12/30) in the third-place game of the Wells Fargo Denver Cup Tournament . . . Credited with an assist against Findlay (12/15).
