FERRIS STATE VISITS MERCYHURST OVER THANKSGIVING WEEKEND

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will continue its non-league play this weekend (Nov. 25-26) as the Bulldogs square off against the Mercyhurst College Lakers in Erie, Pa.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Mercyhurst Ice Center (1,500).

BROADCAST INFORMATION: All of Ferris State's 2005-06 league games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the play-by-play. TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2005-06 Ferris State Hockey home games is available by contacting the Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (EST) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (EST).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 5-3-4 overall and 3-1-4 in the CCHA after splitting a non-league series with nationally-ranked Bemidji (Minn.) State last weekend (Nov. 18-19) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. FSU, which is 3-1-2 in its last six appearances, is ranked 20th nationally by *Inside College Hockey* this week (Nov. 20). The Bulldogs were among other teams receiving votes in the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll this week.

☛ Last season, Ferris State was 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites.

Mercyhurst sports a 7-4-0 overall record and is 6-2-0 in Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA) to date after suffering a 6-3 non-league loss to Yale last Tuesday (Nov. 22) at YU's Ingalls Rink in New Haven, Conn. The Lakers dropped a 4-2 conference decision to Sacred Heart in last Friday's (Nov. 18) weekend series opener at the Mercyhurst Ice Center in Erie, Pa. However, Mercyhurst rallied to claim a 3-1 win over Sacred Heart in Saturday's (Nov. 19) series finale. MC is 2-3-0 in its last five outings after winning six of its first seven encounters this season. Mercyhurst is presently among other teams receiving votes in both the *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine*

poll and the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll.

☛ Last season, Mercyhurst posted an 18-16-4 overall record which included a second-place tying 14-7-3 AHA mark. The Lakers won the conference tournament title for the third time in the last five years and captured the AHA crown in just the second year of the league's existence. Mercyhurst would earn a NCAA Championship Tournament berth and suffered a 5-4 loss to Boston College in the opening round at the NCAA East Regional in Worcester, Mass.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 213-252-44 (.462) – (0-0-0 vs. Mercyhurst – 0-0-0 Away, 0-0-0 Home). **Mercyhurst – Rick Gotkin** (Brockport State, 1982), 18th season, 323-189-32 (.623) – (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT MERCYHURST: The Lakers have four individuals with double-digit points totals as junior forward Scott Champagne (7-12-19) and junior defenseman Jamie Hunt (4-15-19) are the top scoring leaders. Sophomore forward Ben Cottreau (5-6-11) along with a pair of senior forwards in Dave Borrelli (4-6-10) and Scott Reynolds (4-6-10) also rank among the Lakers' leading point getters. MC has utilized a three-man committee in goal with junior Mike Ella (3-2-0, 3.23 GAA, .895sv%), freshman Tyler Small (3-1-0, 3.01 GAA, .912sv%), and junior Jordan Wakefield (1-1-0, 5.43 GAA, .847sv%) all receiving action between the posts this season. The Lakers feature the nation's second-best scoring offense (4.30 gpg.). Champagne ranks second nationally in points per game (1.80 ppg.) and Hunt is tied for fourth place (1.70 ppg.).

FSU vs. THE AHA: Ferris State is 4-0-0 all-time against teams from the seven-member Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA). FSU is 3-0-0 versus Connecticut and 1-0-0 against Army.

☛ **Bomber Hits 50**— Junior left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** has registered seven points (4-3-7) in his last four games to date. He notched his 50th career point (20-30-50) with an assist in last Saturday's (11/19) game with Bemidji State.

☛ **On The Road**— Senior right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** and freshman center **Dan Riedel (Rochester Hills)** have both compiled a team-best five points in three road games this season. Rallo and Riedel (1-4-5) have combined to generate 35.7% (10-28) of the squad's points on the road. FSU is averaging 3.33 goals (10 total goals) and is 26.3% (5-19) on the power play in those away encounters.

☛ **Off To A Fine Start**— Ferris State's 10 league points in eight CCHA games this season is eight shy of matching its entire 18 points league total in 2004-05. The Bulldogs were 7-17-4 in 28 league encounters a season ago.

☛ **"Power" Playing**— Ferris State has tallied at least a power-play lamplighter in all but two of its 12 games this season— at Lake Superior State (10/22) and versus Bowling Green State (10/29). The Bulldogs went three consecutive games with three power-play markers apiece before scoring twice in those opportunities in last Saturday's (11/19) series finale against Bemidji State. FSU scored three goals in both ends of the Western Michigan series (11/11-12) and had three more in last Friday's (11/18) contest with Bemidji State.

☛ **Scoring Leaders**— The Bulldogs' top three leading scorers— **Greg Rallo (5-9-14)**, **Dan Riedel (2-10-12)**, and junior left wing **Matt Verdone (7-4-11)** have generated 33.3% (37-111) of the squad's total points production this season to date.

☛ **Top Non-League Performer**— **Greg Rallo** has compiled 22 career points (9-13-22) in 37 non-league contests to pace the Bulldogs in that statistical category. Rallo has currently compiled nine points (4-5-7) in his last four contests.

☛ **Freshman Coming Around**— Freshman right wing **Corey Couturier (Traverse City)** totaled three points (2-1-3) in last weekend's series against Bemidji State. Prior to the two-game set, Couturier had one point in his initial five appearances this year with an assist at Lake Superior State (10/22).

☛ **Senior Sets Career High**— Senior defenseman **Andrew Winnik's (Mississauga, Ontario)** four points (0-4-4) in 12 outings this season represents a career high, bettering his three points in each of his initial two campaigns (2002-03 and 2003-04). His younger brother (Dan) plays for New Hampshire.

☛ **Did You Know?**— Eight of Ferris State's 12 contests this campaign have been decided by two goals or less and the Bulldogs are 2-2-4 in those encounters.

☛ **Impressive Frosh Class**— Ferris State's incoming freshmen class for the 2005-06 season is ranked 10th best among the nation's top 15 recruiting classes according to *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) 2005 Recruiting Rankings. Besides O'Keefe, **Dan Riedel** was listed seventh on INCH's Top 20 Incoming Forward Rankings while frosh defenseman **Chris Zarb (Waterford)** landed into 11th place on the top 15 incoming defensemen chart.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
