NATIONALLY-RANKED FERRIS STATE TRAVELS TO NEBRASKA-OMAHA

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team resumes Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) play this weekend (Dec. 2 & 4) as the nationally-ranked Bulldogs square off against the University of Nebraska-Omaha Mavericks in Omaha, Neb.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 8:05 p.m. (EST) & Sunday – 3:05 p.m. (EST)/Qwest Center Omaha (14,700).

TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2005-06 Ferris State Hockey home games is available by contacting the Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (EST) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (EST).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State improved to 7-3-4 overall and remained at 3-1-4 in the CCHA following a non-league series over the Mercyhurst Lakers last weekend (Nov. 25-26) at the Mercyhurst Ice Center in Erie, Pa. FSU, which is currently 5-1-2 in its last eight outings, is ranked 19th nationally this week (Nov. 28) by both *Inside College Hockey* and *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV*. The Bulldogs were also among teams receiving votes in the *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* poll this week.

● Last season, Ferris State was 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites.

Nebraska-Omaha is 7-6-0 overall and 3-5-0 in the CCHA to date. The Mavericks won the 55th annual Rensselaer/Bank of America Holiday Hockey Tournament with a 6-1 win over Holy Cross in last Saturday's (Nov. 26) championship game at the Houston Field House in Troy, N.Y. UNO posted a 4-2 decision against Providence in last Friday's (Nov. 25) tourney semifinal round. The Mavericks are among teams receiving votes in both the *Inside College Hockey* and the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* polls.

● Last season, Nebraska-Omaha finished 19-16-4 overall with a fourth-place 13-11-4 mark in the CCHA.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 215-252-44 (.464) – (5-9-2 vs. Nebraska-Omaha – 2-4-0 Away, 3-5-2 Home). Nebraska-Omaha – **Mike Kemp** (Gustavus Adolphus, 1975), 9th season, 131-162-31 (.452) – (9-5-2 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT NEBRASKA-OMAHA: The Mavericks have five individuals with double-figure points led by junior forward Scott Parse (7-15-22) and sophomore forward Bill Thomas (8-8-16). Parse ranks tied for fourth place nationally in points per game (1.69 avg.) and is tied for second place among the CCHA overall scoring leaders to date. Parse and Thomas earned CCHA First and Second-Team honors last season, respectively. Sophomore forward Bryan Marshall (4-7-11) and freshman forward Tomas Klempa (3-8-11) are other top point getters for the Mavericks. UNO currently is tied for eighth place among the national leaders in scoring offense (3.77 gpg.). Freshman Jared Kaufmann (4-2-0, 2.69 GAA, .901sv%) is the Mavericks' primary goaltender while frosh Greg Barrett (2-3-0, 4.53 GAA, .832sv%) and sophomore Eric Aarnio (1-1-0, 2.51 GAA, .872sv%) has also received action this season.

☛ **Warm Spell**— Ferris State is 5-1-1 in its seven outings to date. In that span, the Bulldogs have outscored the opposition by 16 goals (33-17) and are outshooting their opponents by 78 shots (273-195). FSU is operating at 23.7% (14-59) efficiency on power plays and 90.9% (40-44) on the penalty kill. Senior right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** has a team-best 14 points (7-7-14) during that period while junior left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** and freshman center **Dan Riedel (Rochester Hills)** each have compiled 12 points apiece. Bomersback (5-7-12) and Riedel (2-10-12) along with Rallo have all registered plus four efficiency ratings.

☛ **Twice As Nice** — **Greg Rallo** has been honored for the second time as the CCHA's Offensive Player of the Week this week (Nov. 28) for his three-goal, two-assists performance at Mercyhurst last weekend. He accounted for the game-winning tally in last Saturday's (11/26) win and also scored a short-handed marker in the contest. The assistant captain also received the same honor two weeks ago (11/14).

☛ **A Fine Start** — Ferris State's 10 league points in eight CCHA games this season is eight shy of matching its entire 18 points league total in 2004-05. The Bulldogs were 7-17-4 in 28 league encounters a season ago.

☛ **Top Line Producing** — The Bulldogs' top forward line of **Greg Rallo** (8-11-19), **Mark Bomersback** (6-8-14) and **Dan Riedel** (3-13-16) have currently combined to generate 36.3% (49-135) of the squad's scoring production this campaign.

☛ **It's Been A Long Time** — Junior defenseman **Jeremy Scherlinck (Grosse Pointe)** tallied his first goal of the season in last Friday's victory at Mercyhurst with a second-period lamplighter. Scherlinck, who missed the entire 2004-05 season due to an injury, had gone 77 games without a goal. The 2002-03 CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention pick tallied his first collegiate marker versus Bowling Green State (10/18/02) with the game-winning tally.

☛ **December Scorers** — **Greg Rallo** is the Bulldogs' top returning points leader from a season ago in December outings with five points (3-2-5) in as many games. **Mark Bomersback** netted four points (1-3-4) in five contests during the month last season.

☛ **A Game-Winning First** — Redshirt freshman center **Matt Frank (Billings, Montana)** scored his first collegiate goal against Mercyhurst last Friday, which was not only a short-handed unassisted marker in the third period but also the game winner.

☛ **On The Road** — **Greg Rallo** has notched a team-best 10 points (4-6-10) in five away games this year while **Dan Riedel's** nine points (2-7-9) is second highest on the squad. Freshman goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almont, Ontario)** is 2-0-2 with a 2.88 goals-against average (12 goals allowed) and a .882 save percentage (90 saves) in four appearances.

☛ **Impressive Frosh Class** — Ferris State's incoming freshmen class for the 2005-06 season is ranked 10th best among the nation's top 15 recruiting classes according to *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) 2005 Recruiting Rankings.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
