### FERRIS STATE VENTURES TO NORTHERN MICHIGAN FOR FIRST 2006 ACTION

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team, which was idle last weekend (Jan. 6-7), starts off the New Year this weekend (Jan. 13-14) as the nationally-ranked Bulldogs battle the Northern Michigan University Wildcats in a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) set at Marquette, Mich.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday & Saturday – 7:35 p.m. (EST)/Berry Events Center (3,902).

**BROADCAST INFORMATION:** All of Ferris State's 2005-06 league games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the play-by-play. Those contests can also be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at [www.ferris.edu/sports](http://www.ferris.edu/sports). Live internet stats are available by going to the CCHA website at <http://ccha.collegesports.com> and clicking on the Games/Results section near the CCHA standings.

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State sports a 9-6-5 overall mark and is 4-4-4 in the CCHA to date. The Bulldogs claimed third place at the 14th annual Wells Fargo Denver Cup (Dec. 20-31) in Denver, Colo., with a 3-2 victory over nationally-ranked and host Denver. FSU is ranked 19th this week in both the *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* and *U.S. College Hockey Online/College Sports Television (CSTV)* polls. Ferris is listed among other teams receiving votes in this week's *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* poll.  
● Last season, Ferris State was 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites.

**Northern Michigan** is 11-10-1 overall and 7-8-1 in the CCHA after gaining a split in a league series against nationally-ranked Miami (Ohio) last weekend (Jan. 6-7) at MU's Goggin Ice Arena in Oxford, Ohio. The Wildcats posted a 2-1 win in last Friday's (Jan. 6) opener but then suffered a 6-3 loss to the RedHawks in Saturday's (Jan. 7) series finale. NMU, which is among other teams receiving votes in this week's *U.S. College Hockey Online/College Sports Television (CSTV)* poll, is 4-2-1 in its last seven outings.

● The Wildcats were 22-11-7 overall, which included a third-place 17-7-4 CCHA mark last season. NMU has won 20 or more games in a season for four years in a row and six of the past seven seasons.

**ABOUT NORTHERN MICHIGAN:** The Wildcats are paced offensively by senior forward Dirk Southern (6-13-19), who's among seven Wildcat skaters with double-figure point totals. Sophomore forward Mike Santorelli (8-9-17), junior forward Darin Oliver (7-10-17), junior forward Pat Bateman (6-11-17), and senior forward Andrew Contois (6-11-17) are all tied for second place in team scoring. Senior forward Jamie Milam (5-11-16), brother of former Ferris State defenseman Troy Milam (1999-03), and senior defenseman Nathan Oystriek (5-9-14) have also totaled double digits in points this season. Sophomore goaltender Bill Zaniboni (8-7-1, 2.47 GAA, .913sv%) is the Wildcats' primary netminder this campaign and is coming off a season-best 43-save effort versus Miami (Ohio) last Friday. He's backed up in the net by freshman Derek Janzen (3-3-0, 3.19 GAA, .887sv%).

➤ **Nearing The Century Mark**— Senior center-right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** is six points away from attaining his 100th career point. Rallo has totaled 94 career points (41-53-94) in 132 contests to date. Rallo, who was Ferris State's lone representative on the Wells Fargo Denver Cup All-Tournament Team, has registered a team-high 25 points (12-13-25) in 20 games this season compared to seven points (3-4-7) in 14 contests at this time a season ago for an 18-point improvement.

➤ **So Far, So Good** – Ferris State's 12 league points in 12 CCHA games this season is six shy of matching its entire 18 points league total (7-17-4 record) for the 2004-05 campaign.

➤ **January's Top Scorer** – Junior left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** is the Bulldogs' top returning scorer in January outings last season. Bomersback tallied six points (3-3-6) in nine games as Ferris State went 2-6-1 (.278). He has at least a point in 10 of his last 12 contests while producing 17 points (8-9-17) in the 12-game span.

➤ **Road Warrior** – **Greg Rallo** has recorded a squad-leading and career season-best 13 points (6-7-13) in eight road games this season. In 61 career road outings, Rallo has amassed 44 points (19-25-44) which accounts for 46.8% (44-94) of his career points production.

➤ **Fit To Be Tied** – All of Ferris State's five overtime contests this season have resulted in a tie. The last time FSU started out a campaign with ties in its initial five extra-session outings was in the 1998-99 season as the Bulldogs went on to record a 0-1-6 mark while finishing the season at 14-16-6 overall.

➤ **CCHA "Cluster" Play** – Ferris State is 3-1-2 in CCHA "cluster" play and has outscored the opposition 22-13 this season. **Greg Rallo's** 10 points (3-7-10) in six games leads the way while freshman center **Dan Riedel** (1-7-8) and **Mark Bomersback** (4-2-6) are also among the squad's top producers. Northern Michigan and Lake Superior State along with rivalry partner Western Michigan comprise the Bulldogs' league scheduling cluster this season.

➤ **Productive On The Blue Line** – Sophomore defenseman **Jim Jorgensen (Sault Ste. Marie)** is making the most of his second season in a FSU uniform with a career-high 11 points (1-10-11) in 18 games, which is the highest points total among the Bulldogs' blueliners. He generated six points (2-4-6) in 34 contests for the 2004-05 campaign.

➤ **Coming Around** – Freshman defenseman **Chris Zarb (Waterford)** has compiled four points (0-4-4) in his last four games after notching two (0-2-2) in his prior 10 outings. Zarb, who was tabbed 11th among the nation's top incoming freshmen defenders by *Inside College Hockey* and is a 2004 NHL fifth-round draft pick by the Philadelphia Flyers, had a pair of helpers in the win at Denver (12/31). He accumulated a combined five points (0-5-5) in his initial 13 contests this season.

➤ **Comings and Goings** – **Dan Riedel (Rochester Hills)** returns to the ice this weekend after being sidelined the last six games due to an illness. Riedel, who was selected by *Inside College Hockey* as the nation's seventh-best incoming freshman forward, ranks third in team scoring with 16 points (3-13-16) in 14 outings. Sophomore left wing **Chad Haacke (Melville, Saskatchewan)** is no longer with the team after signing a pro contract in the Quebec Superior League this past week. He went scoreless in eight games this season.

➤ **Did You Know?** – Six of Ferris' last seven games have been decided by two goals or less with the Bulldogs sporting a 3-2-1 record. FSU has claimed a 5-4-5 mark in those encounters this season.

## HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
