### FERRIS STATE BATTLES MICHIGAN IN A CCHA HOME-AND-HOME SERIES

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will take on the nationally-ranked University of Michigan Wolverines this weekend (Oct. 29-30) in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) home-and-home series. This Friday's (Oct. 29) contest will be held in Ann Arbor, Mich., with Saturday's (Oct. 30) rematch taking place in Big Rapids, Mich. The series represents the team's only regular-season meetings in the 2004-05 campaign. The series opener will be broadcast by Comcast Local, which is available in the Ann Arbor and metropolitan Detroit area.

**FSU TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2004-05 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is presently 1-5-0 overall and 0-2-0 in the CCHA after splitting a non-league series against the Bemidji State Beavers last weekend (Oct. 22-23) at BSU's John S. Glas Fieldhouse in Bemidji, Minn.

☛ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04.

Michigan improved to 4-1-1 overall and 2-0-0 in the CCHA with a league sweep of Lake Superior State last weekend (Oct. 21 & 23). The Wolverines, who are 4-0-1 in their last five outings to date, skated to a 4-3 victory over the Lakers last Thursday (Oct. 21) at LSSU's Taffy Abel Arena in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. UM then notched a 5-2 decision in Saturday's (Oct. 23) rematch at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich. this week, Michigan is ranked among the top five in all three college hockey national polls, including as high as third by *U.S. College Hockey Online/College Sports Television (CSTV)*.

☛ A season ago, Michigan posted a 27-14-2 overall record with a first-place 18-8-2 CCHA mark. The Wolverines not only claimed the CCHA regular-season title, but made their NCAA record 14th consecutive NCAA Championship Tournament appearance.

**BOB DANIELS:** The Spencer Penrose Award

recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering the 2004-05 season, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 142-173-31 (.455) bench mark.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels**

(Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 196-232-36 (.461) – (8-25-1 vs. Michigan – Home 5-9-0, Away 3-14-0, Neutral 0-2-1). **Michigan – Gordon "Red" Berenson** (Michigan, 1962), 21st season, 537-256-56 (.665) – (47-19-1 vs. Ferris State).

Berenson is UM's all-time winningest coach.

**ABOUT MICHIGAN:** Sophomore forward T.J. Hensick (2-7-9), a 2003-04 first-team All-CCHA pick and the CCHA's Rookie of the Year, and senior forward Milan Gajic (4-4-8) are presently the Wolverines' top points leaders this season. Junior goaltender Al Montoya (4-1-1, 2.80 GAA, .897sv%) earned both All-CCHA Second-Team and JOFA/AHCA Second-Team All-America kudos in 2003-04.

**BULLDOG BITES:** Sophomore center **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)**, who has four points (1-3-4) during a three-game point streak, has registered at least a point in all but one game (10/15 vs. Ohio State) this season . . . Senior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ontario)** is within four points of moving into a 21st-place tie with Dean Cowling (1985-89) on FSU's all-time scoring list. Legue has recorded 116 career points (44-72-116) in 119 contests while Cowling accumulated 120 points (51-69-120) in 154 outings . . . Senior left wing **Carter Thomson (Milden, Saskatchewan)** has scored a

goal in three of FSU's six games this campaign and 13 of his 29 career points have been goals. The assistant captain has totaled 13 career points (7-6-13) in 29 career non-conference games and 16 points (6-10-16) in 80 league contests . . . The Bulldogs snapped their 10-game losing skid with Saturday's 7-2 victory at Bemidji State. The streak dated back to last season (2/28) with a 4-2 home loss to Lake Superior State. All but one contest (5-2 loss at Bemidji State, 10/22/04) during that span was decided by two goals or less . . . With its series split at Bemidji State, Ferris is now 18-10-0 all-time against College Hockey America (CHA) teams and is 12-14-4 overall all-time versus Minnesota schools . . . The Bulldogs started out this season outshooting their opponent in their first two games (77-61), but have been outshot in the last four (91-107). FSU is currently averaging 22.8 shots on goal in its last four appearances . . . Sophomore center **Tim Vokey (Mississauga, Ontario)** three points (2-1-3) in as many games this campaign represents a personal career high, bettering his one-point total (1-0-1) in each of his previous two seasons . . . Seven different Bulldogs scored in Saturday's triumph at Bemidji State with all but one skater posting his second or more goal of this season . . . Ferris State held off 10 Bemidji State power-play chances last Saturday as the Beavers were one-for-11 in extra-man situations. The 10 penalty kills by FSU were the second most by an opponent in BSU's Division I era . . . Senior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alberta)**, the school's all-time winningest netminder with a 56-46-4 career record, is 202 saves away from tying Rob Hughston (1981-85; 3,044 career saves) top all-time school honors. Brown, who has 2,842 career saves, is averaging 26.3 saves per game in 108 career appearances.
