FERRIS STATE FACES NORTHERN MICHIGAN IN LEAGUE HOME SET

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team hopes to continue on the winning path this weekend (Feb. 25-26) as the Bulldogs host the nationally-ranked Northern Michigan University Wildcats in a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series at Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewigleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493). **FSU TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2004-05 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State, which was idle last weekend, is presently 11-17-4 overall and 6-14-4 in the CCHA. The Bulldogs registered a league road sweep of Notre Dame two weeks ago (Feb. 11-12) at UND's Joyce Center in Notre Dame, Ind., winning 4-3 in the series' opener (Feb. 11) and 4-2 in the finale (Feb. 12). Ferris is 4-9-2 at home this campaign.

➤ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04. Ferris was 2-4-0 (.333) in February contests last season.

Northern Michigan is currently 16-9-7 overall and 13-7-4 in the CCHA. The Wildcats went 1-0-1 against Michigan Tech last weekend (Feb. 17 and 19) in a non-league home-and-home series. NMU skated to a 3-3 overtime tie with the Huskies last Thursday (Feb. 17) at NMU's Berry Events Center in Marquette, Mich., and then registered a 5-3 triumph last Saturday (Feb. 19) at MTUs' John MacInnes Student Ice Arena in Houghton, Mich. The Wildcats, who are 3-1-2 in their last six outings, sport a 5-8-3 away mark this season. NMU is ranked 15th in this week's *USCHO.com/CSTV* national poll.

➤ Last season, Northern Michigan compiled a 21-16-4 overall record with a seventh-place 13-13-2 CCHA mark.

BOB DANIELS: The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering 2004-05, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories

with a 148-185-35 (.449) bench mark. He claimed his school-record 120th career victory at Western Michigan with a 7-0 triumph in the 1999-00 regular-season finale (3/4) and picked up his 200th career win this campaign with a 6-2 home victory over Western Michigan (12/4).

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 206-244-40 (.461) – (11-13-1 vs. Northern Michigan – Home 3-6-1, Away 7-7-0; Neutral 1-0-0). **Northern Michigan – Walt Kyle** (Northern Michigan, 1981), 3rd season, 59-42-13 (.575) – (3-2-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT NORTHERN MICHIGAN: The Wildcats feature eight players in double-figure points, led by sophomore forward Darin Olver (7-25-32) and junior forward Andrew Contois (13-14-27). Olver ranks 18th nationally in assists (0.78 avg.) to date. Freshman forward Mike Santorelli (14-10-24), sophomore forward Pat Bateman (9-13-22) and junior forward Dirk Southern (9-13-22) are other top NMU point getters. Senior goaltender Tuomas Tarkki (14-6-5, 1.97 GAA, .931sv%) ranks fifth among this week's national leaders in save percentage, ninth in goals against average and tied for 16th in goalie winning percentage. NMU is tied for seventh nationally in scoring defense (2.22 gpg), 12th in penalty-killing (.861), tied for 16th in winning pct. (.609) and 18th in scoring margin (0.59).

BULLDOG BITES: Senior center **Jeff Legue's (Cornwall, Ontario)** 31 points (19-12-31) in 30 outings this season surpasses his 29-points total (13-16-29) in 37 contests a season ago . . . The Bulldogs have outshot their opponents in 17 of the last 21 games to date. Ferris is averaging 37.3 shots on net (783 total) during the 21-game span while the opposition has averaged 28.7 shots (603 total) . . . Ferris State's last eight contests have been determined by two goals or less with the Bulldogs owning a 2-5-1 ledger in those encounters. For the season, 24 of FSU's 32 games have been decided by two goals or less, including 12 of the last 13 with the lone exception being a 4-1 home setback to Nebraska-Omaha (1/15) . . . Senior left wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ontario)** has compiled nine points (3-6-9) in his last six games, which includes three multiple-point game performances. He recorded a season-best three points (1-2-3) at Notre Dame (2/12) . . . Ferris' nine short-handed goals

this season equals last season's nine shorties in 38 contests and is two shy of matching the 2001-02 squad's 11 lamp-lighters in 36 appearances, which represents the most since the 1983-84 campaign . . . Freshman defenseman **Jim Jorgensen (Sault Ste. Marie)** snapped a 19-game goal-scoring drought with a lamp-lighter at Notre Dame (2/11). His first collegiate marker came in a home victory over Connecticut (11/12) . . . The Bulldogs' top four points leaders this season – **Jeff Legue** (19-12-31), **Derek Nesbitt** (11-17-28), sophomore center **Mark Bomersback** (7-14-21) and freshman right wing **Matt Stefanishion** (11-9-20) have combined to account for 43.3% (100-231) of the team's points and 50.0% (48-96) of the squad's goals output . . . Ferris has posted a double-digit win total at home in each of its last three seasons and are a combined 35-16-3 (.676) during that period. This season, the Bulldogs sport a 4-9-2 home record . . . Junior right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** has notched a point in five of last six contests (3-2-5). In his nine previous outings, he had only two points (1-1-2) . . . Senior defenseman **Matt York's (Woodhaven)** 74 career points (15-59-74) in 126 games ranks 10th highest among FSU's all-time defensemen in career points and the team captain is one shy of tying Daryl Filipek's (1989-93) ninth-place 75-career assists total . . . Ferris is 21-32-3 (.402) in its final four regular-season outings of a campaign since the 1990-91 season, which includes a 7-16-2 home record . . . Sophomore left wing **Matt Verdone (Summerstown, Ontario)** tallied his team-leading third game-winning goal in the Bulldogs' 4-3 win at Notre Dame (2/11). Verdone's 15 points (7-8-15) in 32 outings this season is a career best, bettering his six points (1-5-6) in 27 appearances the previous campaign.

SENIORS TO BE HONORED: Ferris will acknowledge its six senior member class prior to this Saturday's (Feb. 26) contest. The group consists of **Jeff Legue, Derek Nesbitt, Matt York**, left wing **Carter Thomson (Milden, Saskatchewan)**, goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alberta)** and defenseman **Skip Renaud (Regina, Saskatchewan)**.
