### FERRIS STATE HEADS TO NOTRE DAME THIS WEEK IN CCHA ACTION

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will travel to Notre Dame, Ind., this weekend (Feb. 11-12) for a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series against the University of Notre Dame Fighting Irish. The two-game league set represents the only regular-season meetings between the teams during the 2004-05 campaign.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Joyce Center (2,713).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is presently 9-17-4 overall and 4-14-1 in the CCHA after going 0-1-1 in a home league series against Bowling Green State last weekend (Feb. 4-5) at FSU's Ewingleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs, who are midst an eight-game non-winning string (0-6-2), are 3-8-2 in road outings this season.

☛ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04. Ferris was 2-4-0 (.333) in February encounters last season.

**Notre Dame** is 5-19-6 overall with a 3-14-5 CCHA record to date after posting a 0-1-1 league series mark versus Nebraska-Omaha last weekend (Feb. 4-5) at ND's Joyce Athletic Center in Notre Dame, Ind. The Fighting Irish skated to a 1-1 overtime tie with the Mavericks last Friday (Feb. 4) before suffering a 6-3 loss in Saturday's (Feb. 5) finale. ND, which currently has an 11-game non-winning streak (0-9-2), has compiled a 3-9-4 home ledger this campaign.

☛ Notre Dame compiled a 20-15-4 overall record with a fifth-place 14-11-3 CCHA mark for the 2003-04 season. The Irish made their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in the program's 36-year history last season and dropped a 5-2 decision to Minnesota at the NCAA Midwest Regional (Mar. 27) in Grand Rapids, Mich. ND, which registered a 14-2-2 home record, also won 20 games for the first time since the 1987-88 campaign and finished the season ranked 12th in the national polls.

**BOB DANIELS:** The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering 2004-05, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops

among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 146-185-35 (.447) bench mark. He claimed his school-record 120th career victory at Western Michigan with a 7-0 triumph in the 1999-00 regular-season finale (3/4) and picked up his 200th career win this campaign with a 6-2 home victory over Western Michigan (12/4).

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 204-244-40 (.459) – (20-12-4 vs. Notre Dame – Away 12-8-3, Home 6-4-1; Neutral 2-0-0). **Notre Dame** – **Dave Poulin** (Notre Dame, 1982), 10th season, 139-189-50 (.434) – (8-15-4 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT NOTRE DAME:** Senior right wing Cory McLean (4-12-16) is the Irish's top scorer to date while sophomore Wes O'Neill (6-9-15), a 2003-04 CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention honoree, and junior right wing Tim Wallace (3-8-11) are the other ND skaters with double-figure points totals. Senior goaltender Morgan Cey (3-12-5, 2.70 GAA, .917sv%) has received action in a team-high 22 outings while sophomore David Brown (2-7-1, 4.00 GAA, .878sv%) has appeared in 11 contests this season. Brown was also tabbed as a CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention Team member for the 2003-04 campaign.

### GAMES THIS WEEK

Friday, February 11

**BULLDOG BITES:** Ferris State had its nine-game series unbeaten string (7-0-2) against Bowling Green snapped with last Saturday's 4-2 setback. The Bulldogs also had their seven-game home series unbeaten streak (5-0-2) with the Falcons come to an end . . . Ten of Ferris' last 11 contests have been determined by two goals or less with the Bulldogs posting a 2-6-2 record in those 10 outings . . . Freshman right wing **Matt Stefanishion (Daysland, Alberta)** tallied his first career hat trick versus Bowling Green last Friday. Prior to Stefanishion's feat, senior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ontario)** was the last FSU skater to score three goals which came last season (2/6) in a 5-2 home-ice win over Ohio State . . . Sophomore defenseman **Eric Vesely (Woodstock, Ill.)** has three points in his last two games after not registering a point in his previous 21 appearances this campaign . . . **Jeff**

**Legue** leads all Bulldog players in scoring on the road this campaign with 13 points (10-3-13) in 14 away contests. Senior left wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ontario)** is second with 11 points (3-8-11) in 14 outings followed by sophomore center **Mark Bomersback's (Rochester, Alberta)** 10 points (2-8-10) in 14 appearances . . . **Jeff Legue** moved into 13th place among FSU's all-time points leaders with an assist in Saturday's Bowling Green contest. Legue has 141 career points (60-81-141) in 143 games and surpassed Tim Christian (1991-95), who registered 65-72-140 in 148 outings . . . Junior left wing **Matt Rutkowski (Sterling Heights)** snapped a 15-game non-goal string with a power-play tally last Saturday. Rutkowski's previous marker this season was at Lake Superior State (11/19). His 10 points (3-7-10) in 26 contests this campaign represents a career high, eclipsing his nine points (1-8-9) in 19 appearances a season ago . . . The Bulldogs have recorded at least 30 shots or more on goal in 19 of its 30 games to date this campaign. Ferris has outshot its opposition by 102 shots this season (975-873), which includes 73 (330-257) in the third period . . . **Jeff Legue**, who has a team-leading 28 points (17-11-28) in as many games this season, is one point shy of matching last season's 29-points total (13-16-29) in 37 contests. The forward also has a current five-game point streak (2-4-6) . . . **Legue** is Ferris State's leading points getter in February affairs with 26 career points (10-16-26) in 21 outings. Senior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)** is tops among Bulldog defensemen with 18 career points (6-12-18) in 17 total appearances this particular month . . . FSU's eight overtime encounters this season (2-2-4 record) represents its most since 2000-01 when the Bulldogs also competed in eight extra-session contests (1-2-5). The school record is 12 overtime games which occurred in the 1990-91 campaign (4-3-5).
