FERRIS STATE BEGINS CCHA PLAY AT HOME AGAINST OHIO STATE

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team starts Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) play this weekend (Oct. 15-16) versus The Ohio State University Buckeyes in Big Rapids, Mich. The two-game set marks the first of two regular-season series between the teams for the 2004-05 campaign.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EDT) & Saturday – 5:05 p.m. (EDT)/R.L. Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) Ice Arena (2,493).

FSU TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2004-05 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is presently 0-2-0 overall this season following a pair of home non-conference losses to the Colgate Raiders last weekend (Oct. 8-9) in Big Rapids.

☛ A season ago, FSU posted a 15-20-3 overall record with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in the 2003-04 campaign.

Ohio State dropped to 0-2-0 to date this season with a pair of setbacks at the eighth annual Ice Breaker Tournament in Durham, N.H. The Buckeyes, who are among teams receiving votes in this week's *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine's* Poll, lost a 5-1 decision to nationally-ranked New Hampshire last Saturday (Oct. 9) and then suffered a 3-1 defeat to St. Cloud State in the tourney's third-place game Sunday (Oct. 10).

☛ Ohio State turned in a 26-16-0 overall mark in 2003-04, which included a fourth-place 16-12-0 CCHA record. OSU was 12-6-0 at home, 9-7-0 on the road and 5-3-0 at neutral sites a season ago. The Buckeyes were the CCHA Mason Cup champions last season for the first time since 1972 which is awarded to the champion of the CCHA's Super Six Tournament. Ohio State made its second consecutive and fourth overall NCAA Tournament appearance last winter as the Buckeyes fell in overtime to Wisconsin, 1-0, in the semifinal round (3/26) of the NCAA East Regional at Albany, N.Y.

BOB DANIELS: The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I 2002-03 National

Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering the 2004-05 season, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins also with a 142-171-31 (.472) league bench mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – Bob Daniels (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 195-229-36 (.463) – (14-20-2 vs. Ohio State – Home 11-7-2, Away 3-12-0, Neutral 0-1-0). **Ohio State – John Markell** (Bowling Green State, 1979), 10th season, 173-164-28 (.512) – (17-11-1 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT OHIO STATE: The Buckeyes return 15 letterwinners from last season, led by junior forward Dan Knapp (13-17-30). Sophomore forward Andrew Schembri (11-12-23) and junior forward Rod Pelley (10-12-22) are other top returning scorers. Junior Nate Guenin (2-15-17) and sophomore Sean Collins (3-13-16) are OSU's top blueliners. In goal, Dave Caruso (9-3-0, 1.97 GAA, .924sv%) returns for his junior season.

BULLDOG BITES: Junior center **Nick Scheible's (Big Rapids)** three points (2-1-3) in Ferris' season-opening series versus Colgate is just three points shy of matching his career-high six-point total (4-2-6) set last season in 35 games. Three of his seven career goals have been on power plays . . .

Despite dropping both games to Colgate, the Bulldogs outshot the Raiders by a 77-61 margin and were 14-of-16 (.875) in penalty kill situations. FSU was 11-8-2 (.571) when outshooting the opposition last season . . .

Sophomore left wing **Matt Verdone (Summerstown, Ontario)** tallied his first goal of the year in Friday's season opener. Last season, he didn't register a goal until his 13th game with a tally at Nebraska-Omaha (1/7) . . .

Sophomore defenseman **Joe Van Culin (Monticello, Minn.)** is within a point of equalling last season's points output. Van Culin picked up a pair of assists in the Colgate series and had three points (1-2-3) in 20 outings a season ago . . .

The Bulldogs' underclassmen accounted for 61.1% (11-18) of the squad's scoring production against Colgate with freshman right wing **Matt Stefanishion's (Daysland, Alberta)** three points (1-2-3) leading the way . . .

Senior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)**, who ranks second among FSU's all-time penalty minutes leaders, has totaled 299 career penalty minutes on 116 penalties in 99 games. The team captain is 46 minutes away from tying Tim Corkery (1986-90) for top all-time honors.

Corkery racked up 345 minutes on 156 penalties in 135 career contests.

CCHA OPENERS: Ferris State is 9-14-2 (.400) in CCHA opening contests dating back to the 1979-80 season, which includes a 5-5-2 (.500) home mark. The Bulldogs are 17-30-3 (.370) in league series openers since that span, including 10-16-3 (.397) at home.
