### FERRIS VISITS OHIO STATE IN CCHA TOURNEY'S FIRST ROUND

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team begins Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Tournament First-Round action this weekend (March 11-13) against the nationally-ranked Ohio State University Buckeyes in a best-of-three series at Columbus, Ohio. The Bulldogs are seeded 11th while the Buckeyes are the second seed in the 12-team field.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday and Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST) & Sunday (if necessary) – TBA/Value City Arena (17,500).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is 12-20-4 overall and 7-17-4 in the CCHA to date after splitting a home-and-home league series with Western Michigan last weekend (March 4-5). The Bulldogs, who finished the regular season with a 3-3-0 mark in their last six appearances, are 7-8-2 in road encounters this season.   
 ◀ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 4-14-1 on the road.

**Ohio State**, which is 24-8-4 overall and 21-5-2 in the CCHA, closed out the regular season with a 1-0-1 mark against Miami (Ohio) last weekend (March 4-5) in a home-and-home league set. The Buckeyes skated to a 3-1 triumph over the RedHawks last Friday (March 4) at MU's Goggin Ice Arena in Oxford, Ohio, and then posted a 2-2 overtime tie in Saturday's (March 5) rematch at OSU's Value City Arena in Columbus, Ohio. OSU, which is 11-2-1 in its last 14 contests and is 13-2-1 at home this campaign, is ranked sixth nationally by *Inside College Hockey.com (INCH)* this week and seventh by both *U.S. College Hockey Online (USCHO)* and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine*.

◀ A season ago, Ohio State was 26-16-0 overall with a fourth-place 16-12-0 CCHA ledger. The Buckeyes were CCHA Super 6 Mason Cup champions last season for the first time since 1972 and went on to make their fourth overall NCAA Tournament appearance.

**BOB DANIELS:** The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering 2004-05, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 149-188-35 (.448) bench mark. He claimed his school-record 120th career victory at Western Michigan with a 7-0 triumph in the

1999-00 regular-season finale (3/4) and picked up his 200th career win this campaign with a 6-2 home victory over Western Michigan (12/4). Daniels has compiled an 8-20 (.286) all-time in CCHA Tournament play.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 207-247-40 (.459) – (15-23-2 vs. Ohio State – Away 4-13-0, Home 11-9-2; Neutral 0-1-0). **Ohio State** – **John Markell** (Bowling Green State, 1979), 10th season, 197-170-32 (.534) – (20-12-1 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT OHIO STATE:** Junior forward Rod Pelley (21-16-37) and freshman forward Tom Fritsche (7-29-36) lead 12 Buckeyes in double-digit point totals. Pelley is tied for 14th place among the national leaders in goals per game (0.60 avg.) while Fritsche is tied for 18th in assists per contest (0.81 avg.). Junior goaltender Dave Caruso (22-6-4, 2.11 GAA, .920sv%) is tied for sixth nationally in winning pct. (.750), 13th in goals against average and 18th in save percentage. OSU ranks fourth nationally in penalty-kill pct. (.873), sixth in scoring margin (1.22), tied for seventh in scoring offense (3.47 avg.), and ninth in scoring defense (2.25 avg.).

**BULLDOG BITES:** Senior left wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ontario)** has compiled 18 points (9-9-18) in his last 10 outings and is midst a six-game point string (8-5-13) . . . Senior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ontario)** has moved into ninth place on Ferris' all-time points leaders list with 153 career points (65-88-153) in 149 games following his five-point effort (2-3-5) at Western Michigan (3/5). He's amassed 18 points (7-11-18) in his last 11 contests, which includes four multi-point game performances . . . **Legue** has compiled a team-high 14 points (4-10-14) in eight CCHA Tourney outings while **Nesbitt's** 10 points (3-7-10) ranks second on the squad. Senior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alberta)** is 3-5-0 with a .902 save percentage in eight such appearances . . . Junior right wing

**Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** extended his point string to six games with an assist apiece in the Western Michigan series. Rallo has a point in nine of his last 10 games while producing nine points (4-5-9) during that span.

**NESBITT HONORED:** **Derek Nesbitt** has been chosen this week's (March 7) CCHA Offensive Player of the Week as a result of totaling six points (4-2-6) in last weekend's regular-season finale series against Western Michigan. Nesbitt recorded his first career hat trick in last Saturday at WMU to go along with two assists. The 2002-03 All-CCHA Honorable Mention honoree accounted for the Bulldogs' lone marker in Friday's contest. Nesbitt, who also received the same honor in the 2002-03 campaign, joins **Jeff Legue** as Ferris skaters to garner CCHA Offensive Player of the Week laurels this season. Nesbitt currently ranks 15th on FSU's career charts in points (139), 11th in goals (57), and 16th in assists (82) in 151 contests.

**IN THE CCHA TOURNAMENT:** Ferris State is 13-41-3 (.254) all-time in CCHA Tournament play, which includes an 11-35-3 record (.255) in first-round competition. Ferris is 5-37-0 on the road, 6-0-0 at home and 2-4-0 at neutral sites. Last season (3/5-6), the Bulldogs suffered a pair of losses (6-4 and 5-3) at Michigan State in the tourney's opening round. In the 2002-03 campaign, FSU posted a 3-1 record as the Bulldogs swept Lake Superior State in a two-game opening-round home series (3/14-15) by 6-1 scores. Ferris then advanced the CCHA Super 6 Tourney's championship game for the first time in 23 seasons as a result of skating to a 4-2 semifinal victory over Northern Michigan (3/21) at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich. The Bulldogs dropped a 5-3 decision to Michigan in the title contest (3/22).

Ferris State is 1-5-2 all-time versus Ohio State in the CCHA Tourney. The Bulldogs were swept by the Buckeyes (4-2 and 3-1) in the last postseason meetings (3/12-13/99) between the teams at Columbus. FSU's first-round series at OSU represents the fifth time the two schools will square off in league tournament play. Ferris won both the first two tourney series in both 1979-80 and 1980-81 by 12-8 and 8-6 margins as the winner was determined by total goals in the series.
