Founded in 1972, the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) continues to be a leader in the development and promotion of intercollegiate athletics for men and women.



The charter members of the conference were Grand Valley State University, Lake Superior State University, Northwood University and Saginaw Valley State University.

Ferris State University followed soon afterward when they joined the conference along with Oakland University in 1972. The conference continued to expand until it reached its current number of 13 member institutions. This past summer (2008), both Gannon and Mercyhurst left the league with Tiffin being added. The GLIAC's current members are—Ashland University, Ferris State University, The University of Findlay, Grand Valley State University, Hillsdale College, Lake Superior State University, Michigan Technological University, Northern Michigan University, Northwood University, Saginaw Valley State University, Tiffin University and Wayne State University.

The GLIAC entered a new era in 1995-96. Previously its members were all institutions located in Michigan. On December 13, 1994, membership was offered to three institutions located in Ohio and Pennsylvania. The expansion members were Ashland, Gannon and Mercyhurst. All three began their conference membership July 1, 1995. The University of Findlay (Ohio) was later added to the conference in July of 1997. Mercyhurst and Gannon left the league after the 2007-08 season with Tiffin (Ohio) joining the GLIAC this year.

All 12 member institutions compete in men's and women's basketball. The GLIAC has crowned champions in men's basketball since 1972-73 and in women's basketball since 1974-75. The 1990-91 season marked the conference's first ever post-season basketball tournament. This season, the men's and women's GLIAC tournaments will be held on campus sites for the seventh consecutive season after previously being held for three years at the DeltaPlex in Grand Rapids, Mich. This year's men's championship contest is slated for Saturday, March 7.

The 2008-09 campaign marks the 13th season of divisional play. The North Division includes Ferris State, Grand Valley State, Lake Superior State, Michigan Tech, Northern Michigan and Saginaw Valley State. The South tier includes Ashland, Findlay, Hillsdale, Northwood, Tiffin and Wayne State.

Eight teams qualify for the GLIAC Tournament. The winner of the tournament receives an automatic bid into the NCAA Division II National Tournament.

Overall the GLIAC conducts championships in 21 sports, 11 for men and 10 for women. Men's championship sports are baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis, wrestling, indoor track and outdoor track. Women's sports include basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor track, outdoor track and volleyball.
