

## **Logan Leads Daktronics Great Lakes Region Team**

Indianapolis guard David Logan is accustomed to drawing a crowd. That's true on and off the court.

On the court, Logan gets extra attention because he's a prolific scorer. Off the court, he's a popular fellow as well. The Indianapolis star is the 2004-05 Daktronics Great Lakes Region player of the year.

Logan received the most votes of any player in balloting for this year's all-region team. The Greyhounds guard is also this season's Great Lakes Valley Conference player of the year and a first team All-GLVC choice for the third consecutive season. The senior is the career scoring leader at Indianapolis and in the GLVC.

Joining Logan on this year's Daktronics Great Lakes Region first team are Ferris State guard Carlton Epps and three forwards – Josh Buettner of Michigan Tech, Geoff Husted of Gannon and Randy Holbrook of Southern Indiana.

The all-region second team consists of Findlay guard Dustin Pfeifer, Wayne State guard Morris Hall, forwards Ricky Volcy of Northern Michigan and Sullivan Sykes of Saint Joseph's and Grand Valley State center Callistus Eziukwu.

All the players on the all-region first team will now advance to the Daktronics national ballot.

Logan has helped Indianapolis go 19-9 and secure a spot in the NCAA playoffs. The Indianapolis native has been tabbed as the GLVC player of the week six times this season. This is the second straight season he's been a first team all-region pick. Logan leads all of NCAA Division II in scoring at 28.9 ppg.

Epps has been the engine behind a 22-6 Ferris State team that's headed to the NCAA playoffs. The 6-2 senior is fifth in the country in steals and is FSU's career leader in that department. Epps has been a first team All-Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference choice for two consecutive seasons and has been on the conference's all-defensive team both years. Epps is averaging 19.3 ppg., and has scored over 1,000 points in his career.

Husted is the anchor for a Gannon team that will compete in the NCAA playoffs. The 6-11 senior is second in the GLIAC in rebounding (8.9 rpg.) and sixth in scoring (16.3 ppg.). Husted ranks fifth in career points for the Golden Knights and is sixth in career rebounds and blocked shots. A native of Canton, OH, Husted has 12 double-doubles this season for Gannon, which enters the playoffs with an 18-10 mark.

Buettner is the GLIAC player of the year for the second consecutive season. Tech ended the season with an 18-10 record and during the 6-9 senior forward's career, the Huskies have gone 95-22. This season, Buettner averaged 19.7 ppg., 6.2 rpg., and scored over 30 points three times. Buettner, who's second in the GLIAC in scoring, has scored over 2,000 points in his career. He was a Daktronics first team All-America last season.

The 6-9 Holbrook is playing his best basketball at the most crucial part of the season. Last weekend, he helped lead Southern Indiana to the GLVC Tournament championship by averaging 19.3 ppg., and 7.3 rpg. The senior was named the most outstanding player at the tournament. On the year, he's averaging 16.3 ppg., 6.5 rpg., and shooting 64 percent from the field. Holbrook was cited as the Division II Bulletin player of the month for January. The Screaming Eagles are 26-4 and back in their usual position – in the NCAA playoffs.
