

## BULLDOG STAFF/COACHING HISTORY



### DAVE SCHLUMP Volunteer Assistant Coach

**D**ave Schlump enters his first season as a volunteer assistant coach at Ferris State following a successful prep coaching career in West Michigan.

The 45-year old

Schlump will assist with the Bulldogs' on-court instruction and skill development.

A Ferris State alumnus, Schlump currently serves as an alternative education principal for the Cedar Springs (Mich.) Public School district. He served as the Red Hawks' varsity boys basketball coach for 13 seasons and led CSHS to a 22-1 overall record and the program's fifth district crown in the last six seasons during the 2003-04 campaign. Schlump also directed the Red Hawks to both their first unbeaten regular season along with first conference title (OK White) since 1977 in his final season a year ago.

While at Cedar Springs, Schlump guided the

Red Hawks to five district championships along with one regional crown. His 2002-03 squad, which included current Bulldog freshmen basketball players Tyler Wolfe and Adam Veltkamp, compiled an 18-7 overall mark and reached the regional finals.

Schlump, who was named the *Grand Rapids Press* Coach of the Year in 2003-04, previously spent four seasons as the boys basketball coach at Kent City (Mich.) High School. He also coached football for three years at Kent City where one of his players included current FSU assistant coach Cory Anderson.

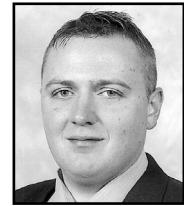
A native of Toledo, Ohio, Schlump participated in football, basketball and baseball during his prep career at Ida (Mich.) High School. He earned a degree in social work from FSU in 1982 after graduating from IHS in 1977.

Schlump presently resides in Cedar Springs along with his wife, Teresea, and children Josh (18), Elyse (15) and Dan (9). His son, Josh, is presently pursuing a degree in Professional Golf Management at Ferris State.

### THE FERRIS STATE "BULLDOG"

The "Bulldogs" have been Ferris State University's official mascot since 1930, when the name was applied to the Ferris Institute basketball team.

At the time, an unknown sportswriter became impressed by the way coach Bill McElwain's chargers were winning close games with defense (even recording a shutout once). He described the stingy defense as "hanging on like a bulldog." During an eight-game winning streak for the 1930 squad, Ferris held the opposition to an average of 17.1 points per game. Then he began referring to the team as the "Bulldogs." The nickname stuck and has been used ever since.

The logo was re-designed in 1979 by former FSU graphic artist Terry Davenport, son of former Bulldog Athletics Director Dean Davenport.

### LIONS CLUB HOLIDAY CLASSIC

Ferris State, in conjunction with the Big Rapids (Mich.) chapter of the Lions Club International, will host the first-ever Lions Club Holiday Basketball Classic this season. The inaugural event is slated for Monday and Tuesday, Dec. 20-21, at FSU's Jim Wink Arena in Big Rapids, Mich.

The classic will feature four contests involving two schools apiece from both the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) and the Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC). In addition to the host Bulldogs, the field also includes Southern Indiana and Indianapolis of the GLVC along with GLIAC member Wayne State. WSU and Indianapolis will tangle in Monday's (Dec. 20) tournament opener at 5:30 p.m. (EST) while FSU battles USI in the 7:30 p.m. (EST) nightcap. Tuesday's (Dec. 21) opening game between WSU and USI tips off at 5:30 p.m. (EST) with Ferris and Indianapolis squaring off in the 7:30 p.m. (EST) finale.

Wayne State, Indianapolis and Southern Indiana all reached the NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament in 2003-04.
