2005-06/Career highlights and honors: Ranks second in balanced scoring attack at 13.0 points and grabs team-leading 5.9 rebounds per game for nation's No. 3 team...Has led Drury to amazing 116-10 record in four seasons as a starter...Has started 125 of possible 126 games in Drury career...Had 20 points (on 8 of 10 shooting) and five rebounds to lead Lady Panthers to win over UMSL on Senior Day on Feb. 18, 2006, one day after her father, Alan, died of apparent heart attack...Was the only junior named a First Team All-America selection by the Women's Division II Bulletin last season, and was also honored by the WBCA/Kodak and Daktronics...Earned Elite 8 All-Tournament team honors for 2004 and was the South Central Regional MVP in 2004...Was the only sophomore to be a First Team Kodak after leading the Lady Panthers into the national championship game, averaging 14.3 points and 6.5 rebounds...Led Drury in scoring last season with a 14.8 per game average...Is the all-time Drury career charts in both scoring (1,663 points) and is second in rebounding (719)...Hold's the school single-season records in both categories with her 544 points and 247 rebounds as a sophomore...Had 21 rebounds in a playoff win over Missouri Western as a sophomore...Shot a career-best 89 percent (125 of 140) from the free-throw line as a junior, crediting her grandmother for philosophy that "you should never miss a free shot"...Had phenomenal 19-point, 20-rebound effort in final game of junior season, an NCAA regionals semifinal loss to Emporia State...Has registered 14 double-double games in her DU career...Was named the Heartland Conference Player of the Year last season and was a three-time All-Heartland selection.
