BULLDOG BITES

☛ **THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University football team continues its two-game Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) road swing by taking on the Gannon Golden Knights Saturday, Oct. 13, in Erie, Pa. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. (EDT). Tickets can be obtained by contacting the GU Athletics Office at (814) 871-7416.

☛ **MEDIA COVERAGE:** Saturday's game will be carried live locally by WYBR (102.3 FM) with Rob Bentley handling the play-by-play duties. A live audio webcast is also slated to be available via Gannon's official athletics website at www.gannon.edu/sports. Live internet statistics via "GameTracker" will also be available during the game and can be found on FSU's athletics website (www.ferris.edu/sports) or the Gannon site.

☛ **TOUGH SETBACK:** Ferris State saw its two-game winning streak come to an end last Saturday (Oct. 6) afternoon as the Bulldogs suffered a 40-12 league road setback to Michigan Tech at Sherman Field in Houghton, Mich. Turnovers, special teams play along with crucial third and fourth down conversions fueled the Huskies' triumph in a weather-delayed contest played before a MTU homecoming crowd of 2,350 fans. The opening kickoff was delayed approximately 20 minutes due to lightening from a passing storm, which made conditions sloppy throughout the game. The win was MTU's fifth-straight series' triumph and fourth win in a row over FSU at Sherman Field.

☛ **FIRST & LAST VISIT:** Saturday's contest against the Knights represents FSU's first-ever visit to Gannon University Field. The Bulldogs defeated the Knights in the first-ever series' meeting by a score of 35-14 during last year's (10/14/06) FSU homecoming contest at Top Taggart Field in Big Rapids, Mich. Saturday's game marks the final time the two teams will play before Gannon departs the GLIAC for the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) next season.

☛ **RECORD IN ERIE:** The Bulldogs have made four previous trips to Erie, Pa., to face the Knights' crosstown rival Mercyhurst. FSU has won three of its four meetings versus the Lakers at MC's Tullio Field, which includes a 28-7 victory in the most recent matchup last year (9/9/06) at Erie.

☛ **BIG DAY FOR MIKE G:** Senior receiver **Mike Guevara (Oakland, Calif./Oxnard)** caught a game-high six passes for 82 total yards and scored the Bulldogs' only two touchdowns of the contest at Michigan Tech. The 5-10 Guevara caught a 38-yard scoring pass from senior quarterback **C.J. Van Wieren (Holland/West Ottawa)** in the second quarter before hauling in a 19-yard TD pass in the fourth frame. He finished the game with a team-best 108 all-purpose yards.

GAME FACTS

☛ **THE RECORDS:** Ferris State, presently 3-3-0 overall this year and 2-3 in the GLIAC, registered a 8-3-0 overall record and placed third in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) with a 7-3-0 mark in 2006. The Bulldogs were 3-2 at home and 5-1 on the road a season ago.

Gannon currently holds a 0-6 overall and 0-5 conference mark after Saturday's (Oct. 6) 56-21 league road loss at Wayne State. The Knights have been outscored 298-65 on the year. Last season, GU compiled a 1-10-0 overall record and placed tied for 12th in the league standings with a 1-9-0 GLIAC ledger. GU was 0-5 in home outings last season and is currently 0-3 in such games this year.

☛ **THE COACHES: FERRIS STATE – Jeff Pierce** (Ferris State, 1979), 13th season, 80-58-0 (.580) – (1-0-0 vs. GU). Pierce has compiled a 38-33-0 (.535) coaching mark in road contests and is 29-22-0 (.569) in October contests to date. Pierce, who played at Ferris (defensive back) from 1974-77, is the 12th head coach in Ferris State's history.

GANNON – Jim Kiernan (St. Lawrence, 1990), 1st season, 0-6-0 (.000) – (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State). The fourth head coach in GU history, Kiernan previously spent eight seasons as the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Saginaw Valley State. He also was the offensive coordinator and coached quarterbacks along with wide receivers at NCAA-III Lakeland (Wis.) in 1998 prior to going to SVSU. Kiernan directed the offensive attack at Mercyhurst from 1995-97.

☛ **FSU vs. PENNSYLVANIA SCHOOLS:** Ferris State is 15-14-2 (.516) all-time against Pennsylvania-based colleges, which includes a 5-6-2 (.462) road ledger and a 10-8-0 (.556) home mark. The Bulldogs' most common opponent from Pennsylvania other than Gannon and fellow league member Mercyhurst is the Indiana (Pa.) Indians, who are 5-1-0 versus the Bulldogs.

☛ **BULLDOG ODDS & ENDS:** Ferris is presently ranked 58th nationally of 148 Division II programs listed in this week's (Oct. 7) *College Sports Report* National Rankings, which can be found online at www.collegesportsreport.com Ferris' four home games during the month of September this year were the school's most in the first month of the season ever. It also represents the first time since playing four-straight games at home in October of 1937 that the Bulldogs have played four home games in a particular month of the season.

BULLDOG BITES

➤ **SUCCESS IN THE ZONE:** To date this year, the Bulldog offense has converted 18-of-20 times (.900) inside the opponents' 20-yard line. FSU has scored 14 touchdowns and made four field goals in its 18 scoring trips to the red zone this campaign. Conversely, the Bulldog defense has limited the opposition to 23 red zone scores in 33 tries (69%). Ferris ranks as the GLIAC's second-best in offensive red zone efficiency and is third in red zone defense to date this season. Ferris' offense was one for two in red zone scoring chances versus Michigan Tech.

➤ **TAKING CHARGE:** FSU's starting trio of linebackers have compiled 35% (158 of 458) of the squad's total tackles to date this season. The group, which includes junior middle linebacker **Kevin Noe (Orleans/Belding)** along with senior outside linebacker **Jordan Moore (Ada/Lowell)** and junior outside linebacker **Jeff Hollandsworth (Livonia/Stevenson)**, have also teamed up to notch 85 of the team's 265 solo stops (32%) to date this year. Moore and Noe both tallied a game-high 11 tackles each versus Michigan Tech.

➤ **THINGS TO NOTE:** FSU senior defensive tackle **Kurt Hout (Arvada, Colo./West)** played a key role in the Bulldogs' recent home victory over Northern Michigan (Sept. 29), but may have had a bigger performance following the contest. The preseason All-America selection and pro prospect proposed to his girlfriend and the two became engaged on the field following the contest Bulldog sophomore cornerback **Angelo Williams (Jackson)** registered his first career interception in Saturday's loss at Michigan Tech. Williams' pick came near the end of the first half near the FSU seven-yard line as the Huskies were threatening to score. In addition to the interception, Williams has seven pass breakups this campaign.

➤ **CURRENT NCAA STATS:** FSU senior defensive end **Erik Schumacher (Lake Isabella/Beal City)** is currently listed third (0.5 pg.) nationally in forced fumbles, according to the latest (Oct. 8) NCAA-II National Statistics. Junior kicker-punter **Jim Yates (Goshen, Ind.)** ranks 18th in made field goals (1.2 pg.), quarterback **C.J. Van Wieren** is 18th in total offense (273.0 ypg.), junior defensive back **Terrell Heggins (Lansing/Everett)** is 22nd in passes defended (1.5 pg.), and senior receiver **Robert Miller (Carson, Calif.)** ranks 40th overall nationally in all-purpose yards (142.5 ypg.). **Kevin Noe** is listed 30th in total tackles. As a team, the Bulldogs rank 16th in fumble recoveries (9.0) along with 44th in rushing offense (177.2 ypg.).

➤ **THE FINAL FIVE:** Ferris has registered a 56-28-1 (.665) record in its final five regular-season contests per season since 1990. The Bulldogs posted a 4-1 overall record in 2006 after previously compiling a 1-4 such record in the last five games of both the 2004 and 2005 campaigns. FSU's lone loss in its last five contests last year was a 28-6 home setback to West Michigan rival Grand Valley State (10/28), which went on to capture the NCAA-II National Championship.

➤ **IN OCTOBER:** The Bulldogs have compiled a 48-24-1 (.664) record in October contests since 1990. FSU is 25-14-0 (.641) on the road and 23-10-1 (.691) at home during that span in the month of October.

NOTES: Ferris State senior quarterback Ryan Kaul threw a school-record tying five TD passes as the Bulldogs celebrated their 80th Homecoming with a 35-14 decision over Gannon in what marked the first-ever meeting between the two schools. A pair of seven-yard first-quarter TD aeriels by Kaul gave the hosts a 14-7 halftime advantage. Ferris then turned in a 14-point third quarter as Kaul hooked up with junior split end Mike Guevara on a scoring pass play for the second time with a 65-yarder and junior flanker Nate Fricke hauled in a 42-yard Kaul pass to give FSU a 28-7 lead going into the fourth quarter. Ferris State's 5-2 start counting the victory represented its best since 2004 while the Homecoming triumph marked the 13th time in the last 17 in which the Bulldogs had prevailed.

MORE BULLDOG BITES

➤ **BREWSTER NOW A BRONCO:** The National Football League's (NFL) Denver Broncos signed former Ferris wide receiver **Carlton Brewster** (Grand Rapids/Creston) to their practice squad last Thursday (Oct. 4). Brewster (5-foot-11, 208 pounds) joins the Broncos from San Diego, which released him from its practice squad on Sept. 25. The 24-year-old entered the NFL with Cleveland as a college free agent in 2006 and also saw time on Green Bay's practice squad during his rookie season. In the spring, Brewster earned All-NFL Europa honors with the Berlin Thunder after leading the club with 37 receptions for 548 yards (14.8 avg.). He competed in Green Bay's 2007 training camp and was waived by the club on Aug. 24 before signing with San Diego's practice squad on Sept. 12. He made one reception for 10 yards and returned three kickoffs for 23 yards in three pre-season outings with the Packers. A 2005 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) All-American and an Associated Press (AP) Little All-America Second-Team selection, Brewster concluded his Bulldog career in 2005, ranking second among Ferris' all-time receiving leaders with 3,184 career yards and 25 TD's on 234 receptions in 43 games.

• **DID YOU KNOW?:** Gannon completed its move from non-scholarship football to the scholarship level in 2003 and participated in the GLIAC for the first time in 2004. The Golden Knights posted a school-best 9-1-0 overall record in 2003 while setting school marks for most victories in a season and best winning percentage since 1949 (8-0 record). Gannon recorded a 4-7-0 overall mark in its inaugural 2004 GLIAC season after being picked to finish last in the preseason conference coaches' poll.

MORE BULLDOG TIDBITS

• **TWO HOME GAMES LEFT:** The Bulldogs have two home games remaining this year at Top Taggart Field in Big Rapids, Mich. Homecoming is set for Oct. 20 when the Bulldogs host Ashland with the Senior Day activities taking place Nov. 3 during FSU's regular-season home finale against Northwood.

• **GLIAC AWARD HONOREES:** Ferris has had two GLIAC Players of the Week this season. **C.J. Van Wieren** earned the league's weekly offensive distinction after FSU's season-opener versus Kentucky State (Sept. 1) while **Jim Yates** claimed the special teams honor following his game-winning 41-yard field goal with three seconds left in FSU's 44-41 triumph over Hillsdale (Sept. 22) at Top Taggart Field.

• **UP NEXT:** FSU returns home to host the Ashland Eagles in its 67th homecoming contest Saturday, Oct. 20, at Top Taggart Field in Big Rapids, Mich. Kickoff is set for 2 p.m. (EDT). Three of Ferris' final five games this year, including Saturday's outing at Gannon, will be on the road this campaign.

• **LEADING THE LEAGUE:** The Bulldog defense has returned two fumble recoveries for a GLIAC-best two touchdowns this campaign. FSU's nine recoveries overall rank tied for second in the league to date.

• **FERRIS SPORTS UPDATE:** Ferris head coach **Jeff Pierce** will make appearances throughout the season on Ferris Sports Update, a weekly half-hour TV show promoting Bulldog Athletics. The show airs each Thursday at 6:30 p.m. (EDT) and can be found live on Charter Cable Channel 22 in the Big Rapids area along over 1.6 million households via the Comcast Local Network in Michigan, parts of Ohio and Indiana.

• **VOTE FOR PIERCE:** Bulldog fans once again have an opportunity for vote for FSU head coach **Jeff Pierce** as part of the 2007 Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award process. The award honors the college football coach who best exemplifies responsibility and excellence on and off the field. Pierce was among the top Division II vote-getters a year ago. • **PRESEASON RECOGNITION:** The Bulldogs earned preseason recognition this summer as the nation's 18th-ranked squad in the 2007 *Lindy's College Football Preview* Division II Preseason Top 25 Poll. Ferris was 8-3-0 overall in 2006, which represented the program's most single-season victories since 1996. The Bulldogs also finished the year ranked 17th in *Don Hansen's Football Gazette's* final Division II Top 40 poll and 22nd nationally in *D2Football.com's* final Top 25 poll.

• **PRESEASON HONORS:** FSU senior guard **Bill Bourdlais (Newberry)** and junior defensive tackle **Jake Visser (Coopersville)** were both named to the 2007 *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* NCAA-II Preseason All-America Team. A total of 153 players representing four geographic regions were named to the annual preseason listing.

• **MORE PRESEASON HONORS:** Defensive tackles **Kurt Hout** and **Jake Visser** were chosen as preseason All-Americans by *D2football.com*. Hout was recognized as one of 12 first-team defensive selections while Visser earned second-team preseason laurels. Visser also was tabbed as both a 2007 *Street & Smith's* Division II Preseason All-America First Team selection along with being named to the 2007 *Lindy's College Football Preview* All-Division II Preseason All-America Second Team.

• **PRO HOPEFULS:** Defensive tackle **Kurt Hout** was regarded as one of the top 15 NCAA Division II players being considered by National Football League scouts, according to the 2007 *D2football.com* Pro Hopefuls List. The Pro Hopefuls List, which was put together by *D2football.com* Pro Prospects correspondent Josh Buchanan, listed the top 15 prospects overall. In addition, 35 other players were ranked behind them with offensive guard **Bill Bourdlais** found as the 35th-best D2 prospect coming out this year. Buchanan also posted a 53-man team roster of Division II prospective players and the list included Hout, Bourdlais and Bulldog senior safety **Patrick Wells (Miamisburg, Ohio)**.

• **PRESEASON RANKINGS:** Ferris was listed 28th in the 2007 *College Sports Report* Division II preseason rankings (www.collegesportsreport.com). Ferris placed fourth among the GLIAC schools featured in the *College Sports Report* rankings *D2football.com* columnist Tony Nicolette, who is covering the GLIAC for the online service this fall, had the Bulldogs picked second in his preseason league listing this year behind Grand Valley State FSU was not ranked, but was listed among other schools receiving votes in the 2007 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division II poll.

• **NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** FSU's **C.J. Van Wieren** was named the *D2Football.com* Co-National Offensive Player of the Week in addition to being the GLIAC Offensive Player of the Week after helping account for five of the Bulldogs' six touchdowns in a 42-19 season-opening home win over Kentucky State (Sept. 1). Van Wieren completed seven-of-eight passes for a personal career-high 294 yards and two touchdowns. He also added a team-best 118 rushing yards on 17 carries along with three TD's running the ball. He ran for two scores and threw for two more as the Bulldogs scored four consecutive touchdowns in the second and third quarters.

• **MILLER EARNS NATIONAL HONOR:** Senior receiver **Robert Miller** was chosen as a *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* National Player of the Week (Sept. 26) after his all-purpose performance in FSU's thrilling 44-41 Bulldog victory over Hillsdale (Sept. 22) at Top Taggart Field. The 5-8 Miller was among 11 NCAA Division II players to earn national recognition and one of only two selected in the all-purpose category. Miller had a productive all-around game against the Chargers in league action with 127 rushing yards, 31 receiving yards and 60 return yards. He carried the ball 17 times for 127 yards and two scores while adding 31 receiving yards on a team-best two catches. Miller also returned three kickoffs for 60 total yards, tallied 218 all-purpose yards and averaged 7.5 yards per rush. He carried the ball twice for 19 yards on FSU's final six-play drive, which set up a game-winning 41-yard field goal by **Jim Yates** with only three seconds left to play.

Van Wieren carried the ball 19 times for a team-best 99 yards and added all 213 passing yards on 16-of-27 completions and a TD pass. Nate Fricke led the Bulldog receiving corps with seven catches for 121 yards.

Turnovers, special teams play along with several key conversions fueled the Huskies' triumph in a weather-delayed contest played before a MTU homecoming crowd of 2,350 fans. The opening kickoff was delayed approximately 20 minutes due to lightening from a passing storm, which made conditions sloppy throughout the game. The Huskies forced six Bulldog turnovers in the contest as they picked up two fumbles and had four interceptions. Ferris held a 18-13 edge in first downs and threw for 180 yards to only 86 for Michigan Tech. However, the Huskies compiled 217 yards on the ground and limited the Bulldog rushing attack to 101 yards as MTU posted a 303-281 edge in total offense. Michigan Tech also converted three-of-five fourth down opportunities and scored four times in its five trips to the red zone.
