WESTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY: Glasford had a career-high 286 rushing yards and a pair of touchdowns on 36 carries in a 36-31 loss at Southwest Missouri State. He added four receptions for 82 yards and a touchdown for a total of 368 all-purpose yards.	NCAA 1-AA NATIONAL OFFENSIVE, RICKY SANTOS, FR. QB. 6'2, 195. UNIVERSITY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE: Santos established school records for passing yards (538), completions (38) and touchdown passes (six) as New Hampshire defeated Villanova, 51-40. He was 38-of-55 for 69-percent.	NCAA 1-AA MID-MAJOR NATIONAL OFFENSIVE, ED PRICOLO, JR. RB. 5'10, 210. SACRED HEART UNIVERSITY: Pricolo ran for a career-high 238 yards on 31 carries and added two touchdowns in Sacred Heart's 30-24, overtime victory against Wagner.	while rushing 22 times for 65 yards and one touchdown as Gannon was defeated by Michigan Tech 38-24.	and four touchdowns and rushed for another score to lead Albright past FDU-Florham 35-31. WESTERN KENTUCKY UNIVERSITY: Smith recorded a career-best 12 tackles, forced one fumble, recovered another and also added an interception he returned 48 yards for a touchdown to help the Hilltoppers past Youngstown State, 44-19. He was also credited with 1.5 tackles for loss and .5 sack.	NCAA 1-AA NATIONAL DEFENSIVE, SEAN TRACY, SR. LB. HARVARD UNIVERSITY: Tracy had a career-high 14 tackles (5 solo) to go with two interceptions (totaling 41 yards) and a sack in Harvard's 38-23 victory against Lafayette. His first interception set up Harvard's first score of the game, while his second pick came in the fourth quarter with the Leopards trying to close to within one score.	NCAA 1-AA MID-MAJOR NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS, MATT McCANNA, SO. WR. BUTLER UNIVERSITY: McCanna provided Butler with its margin of victory, as the Bulldogs defeated Austin Peay 21-14. In addition, Taylor returned an interception 45 yards for a touchdown and nitched four tackles for loss.	NCAA III NATIONAL DEFENSIVE, JARROD PHILLIPS, SR. LB. TRI-STATE UNIVERSITY: Phillips had 11 solo tackles, including three quarterback sacks and another three for losses. He also forced two fumbles as the Thunder won over Wisconsin Lutheran 16-14.	195. UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN AT LA CROSSE: Teeplees totaled seven tackles in UW-La Crosse victory against UW-Stevens Point 35-14. He also forced and recovered a fumble, broke up four passes and made three interceptions with 19 return yards.	NAIA NATIONAL DEFENSIVE, CORY MURPHY, FR. DB. HASKELL INDIAN NATIONS UNIVERSITY: Murphy had a solid defensive outing as Haskell defeated Southwestern Assemblies of God 44-17. He had three interceptions for two yards, a solo tackle and four assists. He also added a 70-yard punt return.
NCAA 1-AA NATIONAL DEFENSIVE, SEAN TRACY, SR. LB. HARVARD UNIVERSITY: Tracy had a career-high 14 tackles (5 solo) to go with two interceptions (totaling 41 yards) and a sack in Harvard's 38-23 victory against Lafayette. He finished with two pass breakups and also collected a tackle for loss.	NCAA II NATIONAL OFFENSIVE, DENNY BIES, JR. QB. 6'2, 205. WESTERN OREGON UNIVERSITY: Bies completed 35-of-62 passes for a GNWC season-high 399 yards and five touchdowns to lead Western Oregon to a 52-29 overtime victory over Western Washington. He set a school-record for pass completions and equaled the GNWC single-game records for passing touchdowns and two-point conversions (2).	NCAA II NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS, BEN DAVIS, SO. K. 5'8, 145. HARDING UNIVERSITY: Davis connected on 3-of-3 field goal attempts with a long of 32 yards as Harding defeated Henderson State 44-20. He also hit on all five of his point after kicks and averaged 58.9 yards on nine kickoffs with one touchback.	NCAA III NATIONAL DEFENSIVE, ROB WALSH, DB. SR. AMHERST COLLEGE: Walsh tied a school record with four interceptions in their 34-28 win over Bowdoin. He also turned in six tackles and five pass deflections.	NAIA NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS, CHRIS COLVIN, JR. WR/KR. 5'10, 180. ROCKY MOUNTAIN COLLEGE: Colvin returned one punt for 37 yards and three kickoffs for 127 yards (42.3 yards per return) at Rocky defeated Montana State-Northern, 24-12. He also caught two passes for 52 yards and one touchdown.	NAIA NATIONAL ALL-PURPOSE, COURTNEY ELESBY, JR. WR. 5'10, 175. UNION (KY) COLLEGE: Elesby returned a punt 83 yards for a touchdown in the loss to Pikeville College. He also caught seven passes for 169 yards and a touchdown.
NCAA 1-AA NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS, PAUL ERNSTER, SR. P. 6'0, 217. NORTHERN ARIZONA UNIVERSITY: Ernster averaged 50.5 yards on six punts in the Lumberjacks' 26-0 win against Sacramento State. He had a long of 64 yards and pinned the Hornets inside their own 20-yard line four times. He also kicked a 39-yard field goal. Ernster leads the nation in punting at 47.9 yards per punt.	NCAA 1-AA NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS, RAVON SIMS, SO. KR. 5'11, 175. UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE AT MARTIN: Sims returned five punts for 186 yards (37.2 yards per return), including one 97 yards for a touchdown in a loss to Tennessee Tech. Sims also contributed on defense with seven tackles, an interception and two pass deflections.	NCAA II NATIONAL OFFENSIVE, UYL JOYNER, SR. QB. 6'3, 198. ALBANY STATE UNIVERSITY: Joyner led ASU to a 33-29 victory over Tuskegee. He passed for three touchdowns for 325 yards, including the 52-yard 'hail Mary' pass with eight seconds on the clock. Joyner rushed for 89 yards on 22 carries and scored one touchdown.	NCAA III NATIONAL OFFENSIVE, BRANDON HOLTSLAG, JR. QB. HAMILTON COLLEGE: Holtslag rushed for a career-high 179 yards and two touchdowns on 26 carries in their 41-35 loss to Wesleyan. He also completed 13-of-37 passes for 234 yards and three more scores.	NCAA III NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS, DAN EGGERTSSON, SR. P/PK. FRANKLIN AND MARSHALL COLLEGE: Eggertsson punted 11 times for 471 yards, an average of 42.8 yards with a long 62 yards and four punts inside the 20 yard line. He also tacked on a 38-yard field goal to aid in a 15-10 win over Muhlenberg.	NAIA NATIONAL ALL-PURPOSE, AARON KNOWLES, JR. WR. NORTHWESTERN OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY: Knowles scored three times in the Rangers 59-0 victory over Peru State. He scored on an 18-yard run, 92-yard pass reception and a 52-yard punt return. He total two receptions for the game with 97 yards.	NCCAA NATIONAL OFFENSIVE, MATT BREMER, FR. QB. CROWN COLLEGE: Bremer completed 11-of-20 passes for 221 yards and three touchdowns as Crown defeated Trinity Bible, 74-20. He also had 13 carries for 170 yards and two more touchdowns.
NCAA 1-AA NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS, RAVON SIMS, SO. KR. 5'11, 175. UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE AT MARTIN: Sims returned five punts for 186 yards (37.2 yards per return), including one 97 yards for a touchdown in a loss to Tennessee Tech. Sims also contributed on defense with seven tackles, an interception and two pass deflections.	NCAA II NATIONAL OFFENSIVE, ANDREW TERRY, SR. RB. 5'8, 196. He had 26 carries for 158 yards and completed 12-of-20 passes for 137 yards.	NCAA III NATIONAL OFFENSIVE, JOHN PORT, JR. QB. ALBRIGHT COLLEGE: Port threw for 464 yards	NCAA III NATIONAL ALL-PURPOSE, NEIL SUCKOW, FR. RB. 5'11, 175. COE COLLEGE: Suckow made 38 carries for 112 yards and caught five passes for 156 yards and two touchdowns as Coe defeated Central College 16-13. He also returned three punts for 25 yards.
