### BULLDOG BITES

➤ **PROVING HIS WORTH:** Redshirt freshman outside linebacker **Jeff Hollandsworth (Livonia/Stevenson)** racked up a career-high and game-best 16 tackles (five solos) against Northwood last Saturday (10/29), eclipsing his 15 stops at Hillsdale earlier this season (9/10). Hollandsworth, who presently ranks third among the squad's tackles leaders with 81 stops this season, has totaled five double-digit game efforts to date for his career.

➤ **CLOSING IN:** Senior flanker **Carlton Brewster (Grand Rapids/Creston)** is 137 yards away from tying Derek Fudge (2000-03; 5,046 yds.) for fourth place on Ferris State's all-time purpose yardage leaders list. Brewster has presently registered 4,909 career all-purpose yards in 42 games and is averaging 116.9 yards per outing.

➤ **SCORING STRING CONTINUES:** Senior split end **Brandis Bowie (Lansing/Sexton)** extended his current TD receiving streak to four games with a fourth-quarter 23-yard catch versus Northwood. Bowie has a combined five TD receptions in his last four outings, including two against Northern Michigan (10/15).

➤ **GETTING HIS KICKS:** Junior kicker **Josh Eichler (Tomball, Texas/Grand Rapids C.C.)** kicked a season-high three field goals (27, 31, and 30 yds.) all in the first half versus Northwood. His three field goals were two shy of tying the Bulldogs' single-game mark of five held by Doc Proctor against Northern Michigan (10/3/98). Eichler's seven field goals in 11 attempts (63.6%) this fall ties him for 12th place with five others on the school's all-time season leaders chart.

➤ **SOLID EFFORT:** Redshirt frosh defensive tackle **Jake Visser (Coopersville)** turned in his fourth double-digit tackle effort of the year with 13 stops against Northwood. Visser has compiled four such game efforts this season, including a pair of 14-tackle performances at Grand Valley State (8/27) and at Findlay (10/1).

➤ **LEAVING HIS MARK:** **Carlton Brewster**, who will play in his final FSU game this Saturday at SVSU, presently ranks second among the Bulldogs' all-time leaders in receiving (3,080 yds.), third in kick returns (1,181 yds.), fourth in punt returns (588 yds.), fifth in all-purpose yards (4,909 yds.), and 10th in scoring (158 pts.).

➤ **TOP DEFENDERS:** Four different players have either led or shared top FSU tackle honors in a game with junior middle linebacker **Mike Klobucher (Grand Haven/North Muskegon)** paving the way on five occasions and **Jeff Hollandsworth** having three to his credit.

### GAME FACTS

➤ **LAST GAME:** Ferris State suffered a 42-23 conference setback to nationally-ranked Northwood last Saturday (Oct. 29) in the Bulldogs' season home finale at Top Taggart Field in Big Rapids, Mich. FSU sports a 1-4-0 mark in road contests this fall. A season ago, Ferris compiled a 6-5-0 overall record with a fifth-place 6-4-0 GLIAC mark.

Saginaw Valley State, which is ranked sixth nationally this week by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), won its second straight last Saturday (Oct. 29) with a 17-10 conference decision over previously nationally-ranked Michigan Tech at SVSU's Wickes Memorial Stadium in University Center, Mich. The Cardinals are 4-0-0 at home this campaign. SVSU finished 7-3 both overall and in the GLIAC (fourth place) last season.

➤ **THE COACHES: FERRIS STATE – Jeff Pierce** (Ferris State, 1979), 11th season, 69-51-0 (.575) – (5-5-0 vs. Saginaw Valley State). Pierce has compiled a 33-29-0 (.532) coaching mark in road encounters and is 16-8-0 (.667) in November contests to date. Pierce, who played at Ferris (defensive back) from 1974-77, is the 12th head coach in Ferris State's history.

**SAGINAW VALLEY STATE – Randy Awrey** (Northern Michigan, 1978), 7th season, 60-19-0 (.759); Career – 16th season, 108-60-1 (.642) – (4-2-0 vs. Ferris State). He presently ranks second among SVSU's all-time winningest coaches and is one win shy of tying George Ihler (1983-93; 61-52-1) for the top position.

➤ **SEASON FINALES:** The Bulldogs are 14-7-0 (.667) in regular-season finale contests dating back to 1985, which includes a 9-6-0 (.600) mark since 1990. FSU has dropped its last three season finales to date – 17-14 at Indianapolis (11/16/02) and 35-20 to Indianapolis (11/15/03), and 47-14 against Saginaw Valley State (11/6/04). Ferris is 8-2-0 (.800) on the road in these outings since 1985 and 5-2-0 (.714) since 1990.

➤ **HISTORIC MILESTONE:** Head coach **Jeff Pierce** became Ferris' all-time winningest coach last season (9/4) with the Bulldogs' 23-17 overtime win at Ashland. Pierce surpassed current Hillsdale head coach Keith Otterbein (1986-94; 60-39-3) for the program's top honor.

## HEAD COACH JEFF PIERCE



Jeff Pierce is in his 11th year at Ferris State and owns the distinction of being the Bulldogs' all-time winningest coach. He reached the milestone a season ago (9/4) in Ferris' overtime win at Ashland. Under Pierce, FSU has won or shared three GLIAC titles (1995-96, 99) while earning consecutive (1995-96) NCAA-II Playoffs berths, including a semifinal-round appearance in 1995.

### ALL-TIME SERIES INFORMATION

- Saginaw Valley State has won four of the last five meetings and has a current two-game winning streak.
- Twenty-two of the 30 meetings have been determined by 15 points or less with Ferris State sporting a 9-12-1 (.432) in those games – (5-6-0 at home and 4-6-1 on the road).
- Five of the last seven contests have been decided by 13 points or more, including three of the last four outings.
- In the last five meetings, Ferris State is averaging 25.0 points per game (125 pts.) to Saginaw Valley State's 32.0 points a contest (160 pts.) for a +7.0 points margin.
- Ferris State is 9-8-1 in contests decided by 10 points or less (5-5-0 home and 4-3-1 away) and 6-6-0 in games decided between 11 or more points (2-3-0 home and 4-3-0 away).
- The Bulldogs are averaging 32.6 points a game (163 pts.) in their last five appearances at SVSU while the Cardinals have scored an average of 26.0 points (130 pts.) an outing for a +6.6 points differential.
- FSU is averaging 329.3 yards in total offense in the last three meetings compared to SVSU's 406.7 yards average. The Bulldogs have averaged 98.3 yards rushing and 231.0 yards passing in that period.

**NOTES:** Saginaw Valley State outgained Ferris State by only 64 yards in total offense, but more importantly controlled the scoreboard with a 38-point first-half output. The Bulldogs were forced to play catch-up in their season finale but couldn't overcome the insurmountable deficit. Flanker Carlton Brewster caught a pair of second-half TD passes to lead the offense. Outside linebacker Kevin Myers recorded a team-high 12 tackles in his final appearance.

### MORE BULLDOG BITES

- **ONE FINAL TIME:** Nine seniors will be making the final appearance of their Ferris State careers this Saturday at Saginaw Valley State – **Brandis Bowie**, center **Jamie Bretl (Elmhurst, Ill./York)**, **Carlton Brewster**, split end **Larry Burton (Lansing/Eastern)**, tight end-tackle **Ryan Fritz (Elkton/Pigeon Laker)**, kicker **Justin Rudy (Saginaw/Heritage)**, tackle **Phil Teeple (Bancroft/Durand)**, guard **Jeff Williams (West Branch/Ogemaw Heights)**, and tight end **Nate Wruble (Harbor Beach)**.
- **GOING UP:** **Brandis Bowie**, who has compiled 1,324 career receiving yards on 116 catches in 41 games, is 43 yards shy of tying Pat Pettit (1989-92) for ninth place on Ferris' all-time receiving leaders list. Pettit amassed 1,367 career yards on 98 receptions.
- **THE TOP THREE:** The Bulldogs' top three tackles leaders – **Mike Klobucher**, **Jake Visser**, and **Jeff Hollandsworth** have combined for 34.8% (280-805) of the team's total tackles output this campaign. Klobucher has a team-high 109 stops while Visser and Hollandsworth have posted 90 and 81 tackles, respectively.
- **ON THE ROAD:** Ferris is averaging 16.8 points in its five road games this season to the opposition's 34.8 points average. The Bulldogs have also averaged 67.8 yards rushing, 217.6 yards passing and 285.4 yards in total offense during those five away contests.
- **NCAA DIVISION II LEADERS:** Among this week's (Oct. 29) NCAA-II leaders, Ferris is 55th in pass offense (222.3 ypg.), 63rd in turnover margin (0.2 avg.), 70th in punt returns (9.3 avg.), 79th in total offense (347.7 ypg.), 88th in scoring offense (22.6 avg.), 101st in rush offense (125.4 ypg.), 118th in scoring defense (31.6 ppg.), total defense (407.2 ypg.) net punting (27.9 avg.) and pass efficiency defense (137.2 ypg.). Individually, **Mike Klobucher** is 16th in total tackles (10.9) and 43rd in solo stops (4.9 avg.). **Jake Visser** is 42nd in forced fumbles (0.3 avg.) and **Jim Skodak** ranks 30th in punt returns (12.3 ypr.). Offensively, **Carlton Brewster** is 41st in receiving yards (81.7 ypg.) while **Ryan Kaul** is 40th in total offense (230.9 ypg.) and 41st in passing efficiency (134.5 rating pts.).

A 23-yard field goal by Eichler early in the third quarter capped off

an eight-play, 57-yard Ferris scoring drive.

Unlike a season ago when Ferris State was shutout (45-0) by UND in the first-ever meeting between the two teams, the Bulldogs actually were the first to score as the visitors took the ball to start the contest and marched 74 yards on seven plays. The drive culminated in a 23-yard TD pass play from quarterback Ryan Kaul to split end Brandis Bowie. The FSU first-quarter TD marked the first time all season UND has trailed at home. The Bulldogs hoped to increase their lead after recovering a fumble on the Sioux's 12-yard line, but the UND defense blocked a field goal attempt and the momentum swung in its favor the remainder of the game.

**NOTES:** Michigan Tech's Lee Marana was virtually a one-person wrecking crew as the junior halfback not only scored four rushing TD's, but also set two MTU single-game records for yards rushing (333) and rush attempts (51). Ferris State opened the scoring after its biggest play of the game – a 58-yard pass from quarterback Ryan Kaul to flanker Carlton Brewster to set up fullback John Vandenberg's one-yard plunge. But the 25th-ranked Huskies would eventually hit paydirt with two second-quarter scores as quarterback Drew Schaft's TD just before halftime gave MTU the lead for good. A 43-yard Jim Skodak punt return in the final frame put the Bulldogs at the Tech seven yard line and Ferris capitalized as Kaul tossed a six-yard TD pass to senior split end Brandis Bowie to get Ferris back within reach at 21-13. The Huskies, behind Marana, wasted no time in answering the Bulldogs' score with a 15-yard run at the 7:22 mark and then tallied again with 3:41 left from four yards out. He had 156 rushing yards in the fourth quarter.

**NOTES:** Nationally-ranked Northwood spoiled Ferris State's season home finale as the win represented the Timberwolves' first in Big Rapids since the 1984 season and ended a seven-game series losing streak at Top Taggart Field. Junior kicker Josh Eichler accounted for all of Ferris' first-half points by kicking three field goals, including two in the second quarter, as the Bulldogs faced a 14-9 halftime deficit. Northwood would break the contest open in the third quarter, scoring 21 unanswered points to take a 35-9 lead going into the final frame. FSU would get within 19 points on two occasions in the fourth thanks to a pair of receiving TD's. Northwood's rushing attack was the story as the Timberwolves finished with a season-high 582 yards, which represented the second most in their school history. Northwood also had four players with at least 100 yards rushing led by running back Chris Gruse's 170 yards on five carries. Redshirt frosh outside linebacker Jeff Hollandsworth notched a season-high 16 tackles for the Bulldogs.
