BULLDOG BITES

☛ **SEASON OPENERS:** Ferris State will be participating in its 96th season opener since 1900 (no scores available in 1912 & 1916) and has compiled a 39-51-5 (.437 winning pct.) record. The Bulldogs have won nine of their last 17 season openers to date, which includes two of their last nine. Head coach **Jeff Pierce** has posted a 4-7-0 career mark in season-opening contests. Ferris dropped a 30-10 conference decision to 2005 NCAA Division II National Champion Grand Valley State in last season's opener (8/27) at Allendale, Mich.

☛ **ROAD OPENERS:** The Bulldogs are 14-33-3 (.310) dating back to 1920 and are 1-6-0 (.143) in their last seven encounters. The last Ferris State road victory occurred in the 2003 season (9/6) when the Bulldogs came away with a 25-20 non-league triumph at Hillsdale.

☛ **TEAM CAPTAINS:** The team captains for the 2006 season are senior quarterback **Ryan Kaul (Clarkston)** and senior fullback-H-Back **John Vandenberg (Trenton)** on offense. Another set of seniors, middle linebacker **Mike Klobucher (Grand Haven/North Muskegon)** and cornerback **Jim Skodak (Lennon/Corunna)** will be the defensive captains. All but Vandenberg served as a team captain last season.

☛ **NEW FACE ON BULLDOG SIDELINE:** **Tony Rosso** (*pronounced Rah-so*) is the only regular addition to the Ferris State coaching staff. Rosso, who has spent the last two seasons (2004-05) at Western State (Colo.), will serve as an offensive assistant and coach various units within the Bulldog offense. He will also be involved in the program's fundraising activities, developing an association with Bulldog football alumni, and coordinating efforts with the FSU Gridiron Club. A native of Midland, Mich., Rosso was an assistant coach and coordinator of football operations at Western State in Gunnison, Colo. He coached with current FSU assistant **Ted Egger** at Adams State (Colo.) for two seasons (2002-03).

☛ **PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS:** **Mike Klobucher** has been tabbed a 2006 preseason All-American by both *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* and *Consensus Draft Services*. Klobucher, a two-time (2004-05) All-GLIAC Honorable Mention pick, paced Ferris in tackles last year for the second straight season with 109 stops in 10 games. The Bulldogs' 2005 Most Valuable Player presently ranks 18th among FSU's all-time tackles leaders with 297 career stops. Sophomore defensive tackle **Jake Visser (Coopersville)** also earned *Hansen's Football Gazette* preseason All-America honors. Visser attained honorable mention all-league and FSU Most Valuable Defensive Lineman recognition in 2005 after recording a team second-place 98 tackles.

GAME FACTS

☛ **2005 RECORDS:** Ferris State registered a 3-8-0 overall record and placed tied for eighth place in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) with a 3-7-0 mark. The Bulldogs were 2-3 at home and 1-5 on the road a season ago.

Kentucky State is currently 1-0-0 overall in the 2006 season after posting a 21-7 non-conference victory over Kentucky Wesleyan last Saturday (8/26) at KWC's Steele Stadium in Owensboro, Ky. KSU, which is among teams receiving votes in this week's (8/29) American Football Coaches Association Division II Coaches' Poll, scored all of its 21 points in the third quarter to overcome a 7-0 first-quarter deficit. Last season, the Thoroughbreds compiled a 6-5-0 overall record with a fifth-place 5-4-0 mark in the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC). KSU was 1-3 at home, 4-2 on the road, and 1-0 at neutral sites last fall.

☛ **THE COACHES: FERRIS STATE** – **Jeff Pierce** (Ferris State, 1979), 12th season, 69-52-0 (.570) – (0-0-0 vs. Kentucky State). Pierce has compiled a 33-30-0 (.524) coaching mark in road encounters and is 25-19-0 (.568) in September contests to date. Pierce, who played at Ferris (defensive back) from 1974-77, is the 12th head coach in Ferris State's history.

KENTUCKY STATE – **Fred T. Farrier** (Holy Cross, 1994), 2nd season, 7-5-0 (.583) – (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State). Farrier was named the 29th head coach in KSU history March 2005 after spending 2004 at Shaw (N.C.) as the Bears' offensive coordinator and associate head coach. Farrier also served two seasons (1998-99) as a graduate assistant coach at Michigan State under coach Nick Saban and was the wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator at Saginaw Valley State in 2000.

☛ **DID YOU KNOW?:** Ferris has had a winning season in 11 of its last 17 seasons and in six of head coach **Jeff Pierce's** 11 years at FSU. The Bulldogs won five consecutive conference championship titles from 1992-96 and were league co-champions with Northwood in the 1999 season.

☛ **HISTORIC MILESTONE:** **Jeff Pierce** became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach in the 2004 season (9/4) as a result of the Bulldogs' 23-17 overtime conference win at Ashland. Pierce surpassed current Hillsdale head coach Keith Otterbein (1986-94; 60-39-3) for the program's top honor.

HEAD COACH JEFF PIERCE



Jeff Pierce starts his 12th year at Ferris State in 2006 and owns the distinction of being the Bulldogs' all-time winningest coach. He reached the milestone in 2004 (9/4) with Ferris' overtime win at Ashland.

Under Pierce, FSU has won or shared three GLIAC titles (1995-96, 99) while earning consecutive (1995-96) NCAA-II Playoffs berths, including a semifinal-round appearance in 1995.

BULLDOG BITES

- **ON THE ROAD:** Ferris averaged 19.3 points (116 pts.) in its six road games last season to the opposition's 35.5 points average (213 pts.). The Bulldogs averaged 65.3 yards rushing, 234.7 yards passing and 300.0 yards in total offense in those contests.
- **MULTI-TALENTED:** **Ryan Kaul**, a 2005 All-GLIAC Honorable Mention selection, returns for his third year as the Bulldogs' starting quarterback in 2006. Kaul passed for a career-high 1,924 yards and 14 TD's in nine games last season. He also was second in team rushing with 280 yards and four TD's on 119 carries en route to garnering team Most Improved Offensive Player accolades. Kaul is presently sixth on FSU's all-time passing leaders list with 3,484 career yards and 24 TD's in 30 contests.
- **TOP CORNER:** **Jim Skodak**, a three-time (2003-05) honorable mention All-GLIAC pick, is Ferris' top returnee in the secondary. Skodak shared the team lead in interceptions for the second year in a row with three pass thefts last fall to go along with a squad 11th-best 28 tackles in 11 games. He paced the 2005 squad in punt returns with 16 for 175 yards and totaled 199 yards on 15 kickoff returns. Skodak, the 2005 co-winner of FSU's Rich Currie E.P.E.P. (*Every Player, Every Play*) Award, has 116 career tackles with seven interceptions for 26 yards in 36 contests. He's eighth among the school's all-time punt return leaders with 19 returns for 211 yards (11.1 ypr.) and is listed 10th in kickoff returns with 38 for 702 yards (18.5 ypr.).
- **CLASSROOM STANDOUT:** **Mike Klobucher** is a two-time (2004-05) GLIAC All-Academic Award winner and was the 2005 football team's recipient of the FSU President's Academic Award for having the highest gpa on the squad. Klobucher, a 2005 *ESPN The Magazine* Academic District IV First-Team pick, has been nominated for a 2006 national scholar-athlete post-graduate scholarship award sponsored by The National Football Foundation.
- **TOUT HOUT:** Junior defensive tackle-end **Kurt Hout (Arvada, Colo.)** is one of several transfers expected to make an immediate impact this season. Hout earned All-Great West Football Conference Honorable Mention kudos last season at NCAA-IAA Northern Colorado. He had 46 tackles (21 solos) which included 10 tackles for a loss of 49 yards as an 11-game 2005 starter.
- **IN THE NFL:** Former Ferris All-America flanker **Carlton Brewster** is currently in camp with the Green Bay Packers after being acquired from the Cleveland Browns on Aug. 22. He had three catches for 21 yards in 2006 preseason action with Cleveland, which inked him to a rookie free-agent. He finished second in FSU receiving with 3,184 career yards and 25 TD's.

NOTES: Ferris turned in one of its most productive offensive performances of the season in the 2005 regular-season finale against the nationally-ranked Cardinals. FSU, which trailed by 18 points (28-10) late in the second quarter, came back to claim a 32-31 lead with 14:20 left in the contest. However, SVSU would score 3:13 later as the hosts marched 66 yards on eight plays. Strong safety Chris Machalak had a team-high 11 tackles for the Bulldogs.

MORE BULLDOG BITES

- **THE TOP THREE:** The Bulldogs' top three 2005 tackles leaders – **Mike Klobucher**, **Jake Visser**, and sophomore outside linebacker **Jeff Hollandsworth (Livonia/Stevenson)** combined for 33.5% (298-890) of the team's tackles output last season. Klobucher had a team-high 109 stops while Visser and Hollandsworth posted 98 and 91 tackles, respectively. The trio are among FSU's top five returning tackles leaders from last year.
- **A NEW LOOK:** Ferris will be donning new uniforms, both home and away, this season. The home maroon jerseys have the word "Bulldogs" on the front while the white road jerseys display "Ferris State". The jerseys, manufactured by Russell Athletic, replace the ones worn since 2003.
- **NON-CONFERENCE MATCHUPS:** Ferris is 5-7-0 (.417) in non-league games dating back to 1990 and has won two of its last four outings, both against Hillsdale – 25-20 at HC (9/6/03) and 33-21 at home (9/7/02). Since 1990, the Bulldogs are 4-6-0 (.400) on the road as nine of their last 10 non-conference games have been away from Big Rapids.
- **NEW RULES TO WATCH:** Coaches, players and fans will have to keep a closer eye on the clock this season. The first major change is that the clock will start on a free kick when the ball is put in play rather than when it's touched by the receiving team. The second change will more than likely have the biggest impact. Following a first down, the clock will be started on the referee's ready for play signal. Under the old rule, the clock didn't start until the offense snapped the ball.
- **FSU AMONG 2005 NCAA DIVISION II LEADERS:** Ferris ranked among the top 100 NCAA-II teams in five statistical categories last season – 46th in pass offense (231.2 ypg.), 64th in turnover margin (0.2 avg.), 74th in total offense (350.0 ypg.), 81st in punt returns (8.65 avg.), and 84th in scoring offense (23.5 ppg.). Individually, **Mike Klobucher** was 14th in total tackles (10.9 avg.) and 45th in solo stops (4.9 avg.). **Jake Visser** placed 47th in forced fumbles (0.27 avg.) and 64th in total tackles (8.9 avg.). **Jim Skodak** was 38th in punt returns (10.9 ypr.) while **Josh Eichler** was 45th in field goals (0.8 avg.). **Ryan Kaul** finished 33rd in total offense (244.9 ypg.) and 39th in passing efficiency (133.0 rating pts.).
