THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will go up against the Western Michigan University Broncos for the fourth and final time during the 2006-07 regular season this Tuesday (Jan. 23) evening in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) contest at Kalamazoo, Mich.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State improved to 7-15-3 overall and 4-11-2 in the CCHA to date with a 7-3 league victory over Nebraska-Omaha last Saturday (Jan. 20) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs dropped a 3-1 decision to the Mavericks in last Friday's (Jan. 19) weekend series opener. Ferris, which is 3-4-1 in its last eight outings, has registered a 3-7-1 road record this campaign.

➤ Last season, Ferris State was 17-15-8 overall which included a sixth place-tying 10-11-7 CCHA record. The Bulldogs were 8-6-4 at home, 8-8-3 on the road and 1-1-1 at neutral sites.

Western Michigan is currently 9-13-1 overall and 8-10-1 in CCHA play after dropping a 3-0 league decision to nationally-ranked Notre Dame last Saturday (Jan. 20) at WMU's Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo, Mich. The Broncos earned a split in the two-game CCHA series by claiming a 3-2 home victory over the Fighting Irish in last Friday's (Jan. 19) weekend series opener. WMU, which is 3-2-0 in its last five outings, sports a 5-5-0 home record this season.

➤ A season ago, Western Michigan posted a 10-24-6 overall record and placed 11th with a 7-16-5 CCHA mark. The Broncos were 7-8-2 at home, 3-15-4 on the road, and 0-1-0 at neutral sites.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 15th season, 232-279-51 (.458) – (23-23-2 vs. Western Michigan – 10-13-1 Away, 13-9-1 Home, 1-1-0 Neutral). **Western Michigan** – **Jim Culhane** (Western Michigan, 1987), 8th season, 119-150-30 (.448) – (13-16-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT WESTERN MICHIGAN: Freshman center Mark Letestu's 28 points (13-15=28) leads six WMU skaters in double-digit points and is ranked tied for third place nationally in points per game (1.22 avg.) among rookies. Junior right wing Jeff Pierce (9-15=24), sophomore left wing Jeff LoVecchio (12-10=22), and senior center Paul Szczechura (7-14=21) are also among the top scoring leaders for Western, which is presently ranked 17th nationally in scoring offense (3.17 avg.). Freshman Riley Gill (6-5-1, 3.71 GAA, .886sv%) and junior Daniel Bellissimo (3-8-0, 4.02 GAA, .861sv%) have shared goaltending duties this season for the Broncos.

GAMES THIS WEEK

➤ **Playmaker Pearson** – Senior right wing **Zac Pearson (White Lake)**, the team's leading scorer with 20 points (7-13=20) in 23 games, has recorded seven points (2-5=7) in his last five outings to date and is midst a current three-game point string (2-3=5). He turned in a three-point (2-1=3) game versus Nebraska-Omaha last Saturday (1/20), which matched his career single-game high. Pearson's 20 points this campaign is six shy of matching his career-best 26 points (6-20=26) set in 40 games last season.

➤ **Drought Ends** – Sophomore right wing **J.T. Dahlinger (Grosse Pointe Park)** picked up an assist in Saturday's win against Nebraska-Omaha to end a 16-game non-scoring streak. Dahlinger's last point was on a helper in a home win over Western Michigan (10/21). Dahlinger has posted a career-best seven points (1-6=7) in 23 contests this season, surpassing his one point (0-1=1) in 17 games a season ago.

➤ **A Happy New Year** – Junior goaltender **Derek MacIntyre (Stanwood)** picked up his third straight win in 2007 with a season-best 35-save performance in a 6-3 league victory over Nebraska-Omaha last Saturday (1/20) in Big Rapids. MacIntyre, an eighth-round selection by the San Jose Sharks in the 2004 NHL Draft, has been victorious in the net the last three Saturdays. totaled 27 saves in a 5-3 decision at Northern Michigan (1/6) and then turned aside 25 shots in a 7-3 triumph at Wayne State (1/13). MacIntyre is 3-0-0 with a 3.00 goals-against average and a .906 save percentage in three outings this month compared to producing a 0-1-0 record with a 5.00 goals-against average along with an .800 save percentage in one January 2006 appearance.

➤ **Frosh Group** – Ferris' six-member freshmen class has combined for 20.7% (36-1748) of the team's points production and 26.2% (17-65) of the goal-scoring output this season. Centers **Cody Chupp** (7-6=13) and **Aaron Lewicki** (5-4=9) are the top points producers.

➤ **First One** – Sophomore defenseman **Evan Case (Grosse Pointe Woods)** recorded his first career point at Ferris State with an assist in last Friday's loss to Nebraska-Omaha. Case has competed in 18 career outings to date and went scoreless in four contests last season.

➤ **CCHA Scorer** – **Zac Pearson** has totaled a team-leading 15 points (5-10=15) in 17 CCHA encounters this season. In 95 career league games, Pearson has generated 47 points (12-35=47) which represents 66.2% (47-71) of his career points output.

➤ **Off To The Pros** – Sophomore center **Dan Riedel (Rochester Hills)** has departed the FSU hockey program to pursue a professional career. Riedel, a 2005-06 CCHA All-Rookie Team selection, had 12 points (3-9=12) in 19 games this season. Riedel has signed with the Phoenix RoadRunners of the East Coast Hockey League (ECHL) and will make his professional debut this Friday (1/26) at Fresno.

➤ **Streaks** – Senior defenseman **Jeremy Scherlinck (Grosse Pointe)** and **Aaron Lewicki** have posted at least a point in the Bulldogs' last three road games. Scherlinck has five points (1-4=5) and Lewicki has notched four points (3-1=4).

➤ **Did You Know?** – Sophomore left wing **Brendan Connolly's (Canmore, Alberta)** last five points have all occurred as the result of goals scored. Connolly, who has produced a career-high 12 points (7-5=12) in 24 contests this campaign, notched a lamplighter versus Nebraska-Omaha last Saturday (1/20). He tallied a pair of second-period markers at Northern Michigan (1/6) and scored a goal in back-to-back outings at Miami (12/2) and versus Lake Superior State (12/8).

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 15th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-07 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories and 29th in winning percentage.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

- ◆ Ferris State and Western Michigan will meet for the 111th time this Tuesday evening in a series which dates back to the 1977-78 season. The Broncos presently have a 63-41-6 lead over the Bulldogs in the all-time series.
- ◆ **OVERTIME** -- Ferris State has compiled a 2-1-5 record in such contests versus Western Michigan.
- ◆ **THE SITE** -- Ferris State is 16-35-3 on the road, 24-24-3 at home, and 1-4-0 at neutral sites against Western Michigan.
- ◆ **BOB DANIELS vs. WESTERN MICHIGAN** -- 23-23-2 overall (9-13-1 on the road, 13-9-1 at home, and 1-1-0 at neutral sites).

SERIES NOTES – Ferris State is 19-14-1 (.574) against Western Michigan in the last 34 meetings between the two teams. The Bulldogs are 8-8-0 on the road, 10-5-1 at home, and 1-1-0 at neutral sites versus the Broncos during that period.

- ◆ 53 of the 110 meetings have been determined by two goals or less, which includes six of the last 12 meetings to date. In those 53 games, the Bulldogs have registered a 14-33-6 (.321) overall record – 8-15-3 on the road, 6-15-3 at home, and 0-3-0 at neutral sites.
- ◆ Ferris State is averaging 3.54 goals per game (389 total) in the all-time series while Western Michigan has averaged 4.24 goals an outing (466 total) for a 0.70 goals differential.
- ◆ Ferris State is 27-30-0 (.464) in games decided by three goals or more – 8-20-0 on the road and 18-9-0 at home.
- ◆ The Bulldogs are 14-33-6 (.321) in contests decided by two goals or less – 8-15-3 on the road, 6-15-3 at home, and 0-3-0 at neutral sites.
