THIS WEEKEND: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will put its two-game winning streak up against the nationally-ranked Michigan State University Spartans this Friday (Feb. 9) evening in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) matchup at East Lansing, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST)/Munn Ice Arena (6,470).

THE BROADCAST: All of Ferris State's 2006-07 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports. **TELEVISION BROADCAST:** This Friday's (Feb. 9) contest will be televised live on FSN Detroit (DirecTV channel 636 and Dish Network channel 430). Ken Daniels will call the action with Fred Pletsch serving as analyst. Shireen Saski is the rinkside reporter.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State improved to 9-18-3 overall and 6-14-2 in the CCHA as a result of a two-game league series sweep of Ohio State this last weekend (Feb. 2-3) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs, who are 3-3-0 in their last six encounters, have compiled a 3-10-1 mark in road outings this campaign.

➤ Last season, Ferris State was 17-15-8 overall which included a sixth place-tying 10-11-7 CCHA record. The Bulldogs were 8-6-4 at home, 8-8-3 on the road and 1-1-1 at neutral sites.

Michigan State is 17-8-2 overall and 13-6-2 in the CCHA after posting a 1-0-1 mark against Nebraska-Omaha last weekend (Feb. 2-3) in a two-game league series at the Qwest Center Omaha in Omaha, Neb. The Spartans recorded a 5-1 victory over the Mavericks in last Friday's (Feb. 2) series opener and then skated to a 3-3 overtime tie in Saturday's (Feb. 3) finale. MSU ranks fifth nationally this week in *Inside College Hockey.com's* poll (INCH) while the Spartans are listed sixth in both the *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* and *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* polls. MSU is 10-1-1 at home this season and the Spartans are midst a seven-game unbeaten streak (6-0-1).

➤ A season ago, Michigan State posted a 25-12-8 overall record which included a second-place 14-7-7 CCHA mark. The Spartans captured Mason Cup with a 2-1 win over top-seeded Miami (Ohio) in the 25th anniversary CCHA

Championship game at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich., and claimed its CCHA-record 11th tourney title.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 15th season, 234-282-51 (.458) – (9-30-7 vs. Michigan State – 7-17-1 Away, 1-12-5 Home, 1-1-1 Neutral). **Michigan State** – **Rick Comley** (Lake Superior State, 1972), 5th season, 108-68-18 (.603); Career: 705-543-89 (.547) – (6-2-2 vs. Ferris State at MSU and 43-15-4 vs. FSU all time).

ABOUT MICHIGAN STATE: The Spartans are ranked 12th nationally in scoring offense (3.37 avg.) and 14th in scoring defense (2.44 avg.). Junior forward Bryan Lerg (18-11=29), this week's CCHA Offensive Player of the Week, is tops among nine MSU skaters in double-digit points totals. Sophomore forward Tim Kennedy (13-14=27) is second in team scoring. Sophomore Jeff Lerg (17-8-2, 2.46 GAA, .909sv%) has been the Spartans' primary goaltender this season.

GAMES THIS WEEK

➤ **Congrats!** – Freshman defenseman **Matt Case (Plymouth, Minn.)** has been named this week's CCHA Rookie of the Week for his career-best two-goals performance in last Friday's (2/2) win over Ohio State in which he garnered first star honors. He blocked four shots and helped Ferris kill off 10 power-play chances in Saturday's (2/3) 6-2 triumph versus OSU. He joins junior **Jim Jorgensen (Sault Ste. Marie)** and sophomore goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almonte, Ontario)** as FSU players to receive weekly league recognition this season. The pair were selected the CCHA's Defenseman and Goaltender of the Week, respectively earlier this campaign (11/27).

➤ **Count'em Nine** – Senior left wing **Matt Verdone's (Summerstown, Ontario)** point streak was extended to a career-high nine games as he posted a three-point game (2-1=3) last Saturday's (2/3) against Ohio State. Verdone has racked up 12 points (5-7=12) in his last nine contests.

➤ **First One** – Sophomore defenseman **Evan Case (Grosse Pointe Woods)** tallied his first collegiate goal with Saturday's (2/3) initial marker early in the first period. Case, who appeared in four games a season ago, has totaled two points (1-1=2) in 19 outings this season to go with a +6 efficiency rating.

➤ **Milestone Reached** – Ferris State's 6-2 victory over Ohio State last Saturday (2/3) represented the Bulldogs' 250th win at the Ewigleben Ice Arena since the 1979-80 season. The Bulldogs, who started playing in the facility in 1979-80, are currently 250-206-49 (.544) all-time in that arena. FSU's best home mark was in the 1979-80 campaign as the Bulldogs posted a 16-5-0 ledger. Ferris has attained double-digit home victories in a season 12 times with the most recent occurring in the 2003-04 campaign (10-6-2). FSU registered an 8-6-4 home ledger last season.

➤ **Season High** – **Mitch O'Keefe's** 35 saves in last Friday's (2/2) contest against Ohio State represented a season best, bettering his 34 stops vs. Michigan (11/17). The 2005-06 FSU Rookie of the Year's career high is 44 saves versus Ohio State last season (3/3/06) in a CCHA Tourney First-Round series-clinching game. O'Keefe currently ranks fourth among FSU's all-time leaders in goals-against average (2.88), fifth in save percentage (.895), ninth in minutes played (3,398), and 11th in saves (1,395).

➤ **Our Month** – Senior center **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** generated a team-best tying eight points (3-5=8) in eight February 2006 contests while junior center **Adam Miller (Livonia)** garnered seven points (2-5=7) in eight games a year ago. Miller has accumulated 16 points (4-12=16) in 16 career February encounters while Bomersback has 12 points (4-8=12) in 21 career February appearances. **Matt Verdone** (6-6=12) and senior right wing **Zac Pearson** (2-10=12) have also been productive in February throughout their career.

➤ **Powering Up** – Ferris State is operating at 26.3% (10-38) efficiency on its power play the last six outings after producing a 14.7% (5-34) rate on the man advantage in its previous six contests. The Bulldogs are at 17.4% (32-184) in their initial 30 games this season compared to 17.8% (38-213) at this time last season.

➤ **Vote For Joe** – Senior defenseman **Joe Van Culin (Monticello, Minn.)** has been selected as finalist for the Pontiac Frozen Four Skills Challenge on April 6 at the 2007 NCAA Men's Ice Hockey Frozen Four in St. Louis, Mo. Van Culin, who has nine points (4-5=9) in 29 contests this season, was among 89 hockey student-athletes chosen by the selection committee. Voting is presently underway through Feb. 12 and fan votes will be used to help the committee decide the 32 skills challenge participants (16 male and 16 female). Ferris State fans can vote online at www.ncaasports.com. Van Culin, FSU's 2004-05 CCHA Scholar-Athlete of the Year honoree, has matched his career season-high with 11 points (4-7=11) in 30 games this season to equal his 11 points (3-8=11) in 39 outings as a sophomore in the 2004-05 season.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 15th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-07 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories and 29th in winning percentage.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
