## GAMES 9-10 ▲ 2006-07 SEASON

**THIS WEEKEND:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will take on the nationally-ranked Michigan State University Spartans this week in a home-and-home Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series. Ferris visits Michigan State this Tuesday (Nov. 7) in East Lansing, Mich., before hosting the Spartans this Friday (Nov. 10) in the series finale at Big Rapids, Mich.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Tuesday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Munn Ice Arena (6,470) & Friday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewigleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

**BROADCAST INFORMATION:** All of Ferris State's 2006-07 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at [www.ferris.edu/sports](http://www.ferris.edu/sports). Live internet stats are available by going to <http://ccha.cstv.com> and click on the Schedules headline box directly to the right of the Standings headline box.

**TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2006-07 Ferris State Hockey home games are available by contacting the Ferris State Athletics Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State, which was idle last week, dropped a pair of league decisions to the Alaska Nanooks two weeks ago (Oct. 27-28) at UA's Carlson Center in Fairbanks, Alaska. The Bulldogs are 1-2-0 on the road and 2-3-0 at home this season to date.

➤ Last season, Ferris State compiled a 17-15-8 overall mark which included a sixth place-tying 10-11-7 CCHA record. The Bulldogs were 8-6-4 at home, 8-8-3 on the road and 1-1-1 at neutral sites for the 2005-06 campaign.

**Michigan State** is 4-2-0 overall and 2-2-0 in the CCHA following a home-and-home CCHA series split against archrival Michigan last weekend (Nov. 3-4). The Spartans claimed a 7-4 home win in last Friday's (Nov. 3) series opener at East Lansing, Mich. The Wolverines garnered a 6-2 victory over MSU in Saturday's (Nov. 4) rematch at UM's Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich. MSU is 4-0-0 at home and 0-2-0 in away encounters this season. The Spartans are ranked fourth this week by *Inside College Hockey.com* (INCH) while being listed fifth in the *USA Today/USA Hockey*

*Magazine* poll and sixth in the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll.

➤ A season ago, Michigan State posted a 25-12-8 overall record which included a second-place 14-7-7 CCHA mark. The Spartans captured Mason Cup with a 2-1 win over top-seeded Miami (Ohio) in the 25th anniversary CCHA Championship game at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich., and claimed its CCHA-record 11th tourney title.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 15th season, 228-269-48 (.462) – (9-29-6 vs. Michigan State – 7-17-0 Away, 1-11-5 Home, 1-1-1 Neutral). **Michigan State** – **Rick Comley** (Lake Superior State, 1972), 5th season, 95-62-16 (.595); Career: 692-538-87 (.558) – (5-2-1 vs. Ferris State at MSU and 42-15-3 vs. FSU all time).

**ABOUT MICHIGAN STATE:** The Spartans are ranked fifth nationally this week in scoring offense (4.50 gpg.). Freshman forward Jay Sprague (1-6=7), the team's top scorer, is tied for 10th among rookies in points per game (1.17 ppg.) on the national level. Sophomore Jeff Lerg (4-2-0, 3.90 GAA, .818sv%) is the regular in goal for the Spartans.

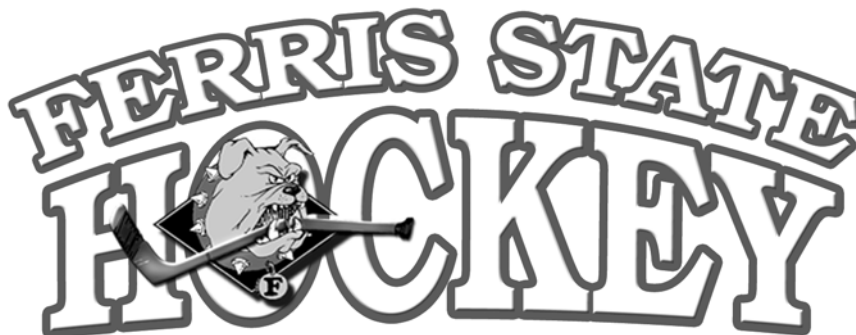
## SERIES NOTES

- ◆ Ferris State and Michigan State will meet for the 98th and 99th times in a series which started in the 1979-80 season. The Spartans have a 60-24-13 series lead over the Bulldogs.
- ◆ **OVERTIME** -- Ferris State is 4-2-13 against Michigan State in such outings.
- ◆ **SHUTOUTS** -- Six occasions - 3-0 road loss (12/16/88), 7-0 home loss (1/17/98), 0-0 home tie (12/8/00), 2-0 road loss (10/20/01), 2-0 road loss (3/2/02), and an 8-0 road loss (10/31/03).
- ◆ **THE SITE** -- FSU is 14-36-4 on the road, 9-23-8 at home, and 1-1-1 at neutral sites.
- ◆ **BOB DANIELS vs. Michigan State** -- 9-29-6 overall (7-17-0 on the road, 1-11-5 at home, and 1-1-1 at neutral sites).

**SERIES NOTES** - In the last 15 meetings, Ferris State is averaging 1.9 goals per game (29 total) while Michigan State has scored an average of 3.8 goals a contest (57 total) for a +1.9 goals differential. The Bulldogs are 3-11-1 versus the Spartans during the 15-game span.

- ◆ 56 of the 97 meetings have been determined by two goals or less, including 11 of the last 14. In those 56 games, the Bulldogs sport a 19-24-13 record (.455).
- ◆ Ferris State is 5-36-0 (.122) in games decided by three goals or more - 3-24-0 on the road, 2-11-0 at home, and 0-1-0 at neutral sites.
- ◆ The Bulldogs are 19-24-13 (.455) in contests decided by two goals or less - 11-12-4 on the road, 7-12-8 at home, and 1-0-1 at neutral sites.
