GAME 13 ▲ 2006-07 SEASON

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will skate against the Western Michigan University Broncos for the third time in the 2006-07 season this Tuesday (Nov. 21) evening in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) contest at Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Tuesday - 7:05 p.m.(EST)/Ewingleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 3-8-1 overall and 1-6-1 in the CCHA to date after suffering a pair of league losses to nationally-ranked Michigan last weekend (Nov. 17-18) at FSU's Ewingleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. Ferris State is 2-6-0 at home and 1-2-1 on the road this campaign.

➤ Last season, Ferris State was 17-15-8 overall which included a sixth place-tying 10-11-7 CCHA record. The Bulldogs were 8-6-4 at home, 8-8-3 on the road and 1-1-1 at neutral sites.

Western Michigan is presently 5-5-1 overall and 4-5-1 in the CCHA after registering a league home series split against Northern Michigan last weekend (Nov. 17-18) at WMU's Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo, Mich. The Broncos suffered a 7-2 loss to the Wildcats last Friday (Nov. 17), but then notched a 3-2 overtime triumph in Saturday's (Nov. 18) series finale. Western Michigan is 2-3-1 on the road and 3-2-0 at home this season.

➤ A season ago, Western Michigan posted a 10-24-6 overall record and placed 11th with a 7-16-5 CCHA mark. The Broncos were 7-8-2 at home, 3-15-4 on the road, and 0-1-0 at neutral sites.

THE COACHES: Ferris State - **Bob Daniels**

(Michigan State, 1982), 15th season, 228-272-49 (.459) - (22-23-2 vs. Western Michigan - 12-9-1 Home, 10-13-1 Away, 1-1-0 Neutral). **Western Michigan - Jim Culhane** (Western Michigan, 1987), 8th season, 115-142-30 (.453) - (13-15-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT WESTERN MICHIGAN: Freshman center Mark Letestu is tops among four WMU skaters in double-figure points this season with 14 total (5-9=14). Letestu, the 2005-06 Alberta Junior Hockey League (AJHL) scoring champion, ranks tied for fourth place nationally in points per game (1.27 avg.) among rookies. Junior right wing Jeff Pierce (3-9=12) along with senior center Paul Szczechura (4-7=11) and junior left wing Brian Bicek (7-3=10) are the other Broncos with double-digit points totals. In goal for WMU are freshman Riley Gill (4-1-1, 3.10 GAA, .894sv%) and junior Daniel Bellissimo (1-4-0, 4.03 GAA, .851sv%).

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 15th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-07 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories and 29th in winning percentage.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

➤ **Milestone Reached** – Senior left wing **Matt Verdone (Summerstown, Ontario)** recorded his 50th career point with an assist in Saturday's (11/18) home loss to Michigan. Verdone has 50 career points (26-24=50) in 116 contests, including a career season-high 23 points (15-8=23) in 38 outings last season.

➤ **Better At Home** – The Bulldogs are averaging 2.9 goals per game (23 total) in their eight home games this season compared to 1.8 goals a contest (seven total) in four road outings for a +1.1 goals differential.

➤ **Familial Foes** – Six of Ferris' last eight games have been against teams in its scheduling cluster (Michigan, Michigan State and Western Michigan) and the Bulldogs are 1-4-1 this season in those outings. The lone win was a 2-1 decision at Western Michigan (10/20). FSU compiled a 6-3-3 mark (15 points) in its 2005-06 CCHA cluster which included Northern Michigan, Lake Superior State and WMU.

➤ **Getting The Point** – Senior right wing **Zac Pearson (White Lake)** has a point in five of his 10 contests this season and has tallied at least a point in three of his last five outings (1-2=3) to date. Pearson had a pair of three-game point strings last season, which included five points (0-5=5) in his initial three games.

➤ **On The Shelf** – Senior left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)**, Ferris State's top returning points leader from 2005-06 with 32 points (16-16=32) in 40 games, suffered a broken leg in this season's opener against Union (10/6) and will be sidelined until mid-December.

➤ **The First Time** – Ferris State was outshot by the opposition for the first time this season in last Friday's (11/17) 3-2 loss to Michigan as the Wolverines compiled a 37-to-35 shots on goal advantage. The Bulldogs are averaging 34.9 (419 total shots) in their 12 encounters this campaign while the opposition has averaged 26.4 shots on net (317 total shots) during that 12-game span.

➤ **Stitching An 'A'** – Sophomore right wing **Matt Frank (Billings, Mont.)** and senior defenseman **Jeremy Scherlinck (Grosse Pointe)** were recently named assistant team captains. Frank received Ferris State's Most Improved Player Award last season while Scherlinck is the lone holdover from the Bulldogs' 2002-03 CCHA Championship team.

➤ **Back On The Ice** – **Jeremy Scherlinck** made his 2006-07 season debut this past weekend (11/17-18) in the Bulldogs' series against Michigan after being sidelined the first 10 games due to an injury. Scherlinck picked up his first point this season with an assist in Saturday's (11/18) game versus Michigan. Scherlinck, a 2002-03 CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention Team pick, is the lone holdover from the Bulldogs' 2002-03 CCHA Championship team.

➤ **Freshmen Production** – Ferris' freshmen forwards – **Blair Riley** (3-3=6), **Cody Chupp** (2-4=6), **Aaron Lewicki** (2-3=5), and **Casey Haines** (2-1=3) have generated 24.1% (20-83) of the Bulldogs' points output and 30.0% (9-30) of their goal-scoring production this season.

➤ **Blueliner Nearing Last Season's Total** – Sophomore defenseman **Chris Zarb (Waterford)** is within four points of reaching his 2005-06 season points total (0-10=10). Zarb, a 2004 National Hockey League (NHL) fifth-round pick of the Philadelphia Flyers, has a point (all assists) in three of his last five contests.

The 2006-07 season marks the seventh year of the Perani Cup Three Stars, which is awarded following each CCHA regular-season game. Players from each school earn points throughout the season each time they're named a "star of the game" (5 points for 1st star, 3 points for 2nd star, and 1 point for 3rd star). At season's end, the

- ◆ **OVERTIME** -- Ferris State has compiled a 2-1-5 record in such contests versus Western Michigan.
- ◆ **THE SITE** -- Ferris State is 23-24-3 at home, 16-35-3 on the road, and 1-4-0 at neutral sites against Western Michigan.
- ◆ **BOB DANIELS vs. WESTERN MICHIGAN** -- 22-23-2 overall (12-9-1 at home, 9-13-1 on the road, and 1-1-0 at neutral sites).

SERIES NOTES – Ferris State is 18-14-1 (.561) against Western Michigan in the last 33 meetings between the two teams. The Bulldogs are 9-5-1 at home, 8-8-0 on the road, and 1-1-0 at neutral sites versus the Broncos during that period.
