## GAME 14-15 ▲ 2006-07 SEASON

**THIS WEEKEND:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will take to the road for the first time in about a month this weekend (Dec. 1-2) as the Bulldogs face the nationally-ranked Miami University (Ohio) RedHawks in a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series at Oxford, Ohio.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday – 7:35 p.m. & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Steve Cady Arena (4,000).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State claimed a 4-0 league win over Western Michigan last Tuesday (Nov. 21) at FSU's Ewingleben Ice Arena in its only action of last week. Ferris State, which is 4-8-1 overall and 2-6-1 in the CCHA, has compiled a 1-2-1 road ledger this campaign.  
 ● Last season, Ferris State was 17-15-8 overall which included a sixth place-tying 10-11-7 CCHA record. The Bulldogs were 8-6-4 at home, 8-8-3 on the road and 1-1-1 at neutral sites.

Miami is 11-5-0 overall, which includes a 7-3-0 CCHA mark. The RedHawks posted a 4-3 non-league win over St. Lawrence last Friday (Nov. 24) at SLU's Appleton Arena in Canton, N.Y., but then had their four-game winning streak snapped last Saturday (Nov. 25) with a 4-2 non-league loss to Clarkson at CU's Cheel Arena in Potsdam, N.Y. Miami is 8-2-0 at home and 3-3-0 on the road this season. The RedHawks are ranked fourth nationally this week by both *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine*.

● Miami finished 26-9-4 overall with a first-place 20-6-2 league record in the 2005-06 season. The RedHawks captured their second CCHA title in school history and competed in the NCAA Tournament for the second time in the last three years. MU dropped a 5-0 decision to Boston College in the tourney's opening round (March 24) at Worcester, Mass.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 15th season, 229-272-49 (.461) – (13-23-6 vs. Miami – 6-12-2 Away, 7-11-3 Home, 0-1-0 Neutral). **Miami (Ohio) – Enrico Blasi** (Miami, 1994), 8th season, 141-121-23 (.535) – (11-5-2 vs. Ferris State). Blasi was the recipient of the 2006 Spencer Penrose Award as the AHCA's Division I National Hockey Coach of the Year and is a three-time winner of the CCHA's Coach of the Year Award.

**ABOUT MIAMI (OHIO):** The RedHawks have six skaters with double-figure points totals, led by junior forwards Nathan Davis (13-17=30) and Ryan Jones (9-9=18). Sophomore defenseman Alec Martinez (6-9=15) ranks 12th among the national leaders in points per game (0.94 avg.) for defensemen. MU is presently ranked 16th nationally in scoring offense (3.44 gpg.) and 12th in scoring defense (2.38 gpg.). Sophomore goaltender Jeff Zatkoff (7-3-0, 2.21 GAA, .924sv%) is 10th nationally in save percentage and 16th in goals-against average. Miami is midst its first season of play at the \$34.8 million Steve Cady Arena at Goggin Ice Center. Fifth-year assistant coach Jeff Blashill coached and played collegiately at Ferris State (1994-98).

## HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I Coach of the



Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 15th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-07 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories and 29th in winning percentage.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

Two Receive Weekly League Honors - Junior defenseman **Jim Jorgensen (Sault Ste. Marie)** and sophomore goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almonte, Ontario)** have been chosen as this week's (11/27) CCHA's Defenseman and Goaltender of the Week, respectively. Jorgensen scored a goal and had an assist in the Bulldogs' 4-0 home win over Western Michigan last Tuesday (11/21) while O'Keefe earned his third career shutout by stopping all 24 WMU shots on net. O'Keefe earned both CCHA Goaltender of the Week (11/14) and CCHA Rookie of the Week (10/24) kudos last season.

Whitewashed - Ferris State's 4-0 home triumph over Western Michigan was the Bulldogs' first shutout since Nov. 11, 2005 when FSU blanked the Broncos, 6-0. With the win, Ferris has captured seven of the last eight meetings with Western while averaging 4.5 goals per game (36 total) during that span.

Puck Stopper - **Mitch O'Keefe** racked up his third career shutout with last Tuesday's shutout win versus Western Michigan, which moved him into fourth place among the school's all-time shutout leaders. O'Keefe, the 2005-06 FSU Rookie of the Year, is three shutouts away from moving into a second-place tie with Vince Owen (1997-01) and Phil Osaer (1998-01). Each compiled six shutouts in their careers.

Penalty-Kill Consistency - Ferris is operating at 84.6% (77-91) efficiency on the penalty kill this year in its initial 13 outings. A season ago in their first 13 contests, the Bulldogs performed at an 85.1% (80-94) success rate in penalty-killing situations.

Career Best - **Jim Jorgensen's** three goals this season in 12 games marks a career high, bettering his two-goal output in 34 contests for the 2004-05 campaign. His six points (3-3=6) this season already equals his production in 2004-05 as a freshman (2-4=6). Jorgensen was Ferris' top-scoring defenseman last season with 16 points (1-15=16) in 32 games.

Scoring Leaders - The Bulldogs' top three scoring leaders to date in **Matt Verdone (3-5=8)**, **Zac Pearson (4-4=8)** and **Dan Riedel (2-6=8)** have combined for 25.5% (24-94) of the squad's points production and 26.5% (9-34) of the team's goal-scoring output.

On The Shelf - Senior left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)**, Ferris State's top returning points leader from 2005-06 with 32 points (16-16=32) in 40 games, suffered a broken leg in this season's opener against Union (10/6) and will be sidelined until mid-December at the earliest.

Freshmen Production - Ferris' freshmen forwards - **Blair Riley (3-3=6)**, **Cody Chupp (2-4=6)**, **Aaron Lewicki (2-3=5)**, and **Casey Haines (2-1=3)** have combined to account for 21.3% (20-94) of the Bulldogs' points output this season.

Warming Up - Senior left wing **Matt Verdone (Summerstown, Ontario)** has four points (1-3=4) in his last three games and is midst a current three-game point string. Verdone, who has 52 career points (26-26=52) in 117 contests, went scoreless in seven straight games before tallying a goal against Michigan (11/17). He notched two helpers versus Western Michigan (11/21) in his most recent action.

On The Road - The Bulldogs take to the road this weekend (12/1-2) for the first time in about a month. FSU is averaging 1.75 goals a game (seven total) and 28.8 shots on goal (115 total) in its four road games this season. FSU is at 07.4% (2-27) on the power play and 93.1% (27-29) in penalty-kill situations.

## SERIES NOTES

- ◆ Ferris State and Miami (Ohio) will meet for 88th and 89th times this weekend in a series which started in the 1979-80 season. Miami has posted a 39-36-12 all-time series lead to date.
- ◆ **OVERTIME** -- Ferris has a 3-5-12 record in such contests against Miami.
- ◆ **SHUTOUTS** -- There has been eight shutouts with Miami winning five contests. Ferris won the first two, 6-0 at home (11/17/79) and 4-0 on the road (10/21/83). MU recorded three home shutouts, 4-0 (2/19/88), 1-0 (12/19/92 & 1/11/02). The RedHawks claimed a 1-0 win at FSU (1/13/01) before Ferris recorded a 2-0 win at Miami (1/12/02). MU posted a 5-0 victory at Ferris State last season (1/28).
- ◆ **THE SITE** -- FSU is 19-19-4 on the road, 17-18-8 at home, and 0-2-0 at neutral sites versus Miami.
- ◆ **BOB DANIELS vs. Miami (Ohio)** -- 13-23-6 overall (6-11-3 road, 7-11-3 home, and 0-1-0 neutral).
