GAME 16-17 ▲ 2006-07 SEASON

THIS WEEKEND: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will wrap up Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) play for the 2006 calendar year this weekend (Dec. 8-9) as the Bulldogs host the Lake Superior State University Lakers in a two-game set at Big Rapids, Mich.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State dropped to 4-10-1 overall and 2-8-1 in the CCHA as a result of suffering a pair of league losses to nationally-ranked Miami (Ohio) last weekend (Dec. 1-2) at MU's new Steve Cady Arena in Oxford, Ohio. The Bulldogs sport a 3-6-0 home record to date this campaign.

☛ Last season, Ferris State was 17-15-8 overall which included a sixth place-tying 10-11-7 CCHA record. The Bulldogs were 8-6-4 at home, 8-8-3 on the road and 1-1-1 at neutral sites.

Lake Superior State improved to 10-5-1 overall and 5-4-1 in the CCHA last weekend (Dec. 1-2) with a CCHA home-and-home series sweep of Upper Peninsula rival Northern Michigan. The Lakers posted a 2-0 victory in last Friday's (Dec. 1) series opener at LSSU's Taffy Abel Arena in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. Lake Superior State then claimed a 5-2 triumph over the Wildcats in Saturday's (Dec. 2) rematch at NMU's Berry Events Center in Marquette, Mich. LSSU, which is 4-1-1 in its last six outings, is 4-4-1 in away encounters this season. The Lakers are ranked 20th this week in both the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* and the *Inside College Hockey.com* (INCH) polls.

☛ Lake Superior State posted a 15-14-7 record overall for the 2005-06 season, which included a sixth-place tying 11-12-5 mark in the CCHA. The Lakers were 5-8-2 on the road last season.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 15th season, 229-274-49 (.459) – (14-21-7 vs. Lake Superior State – 8-10-3 Home, 6-10-4 Away, 0-1-0 Neutral). Lake Superior State – **Jim Roque** (Lake Superior State, 1987), 2nd season, 25-19-8 (.558) – (0-1-3 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT LAKE SUPERIOR STATE: The Lakers feature five individuals with double-figure points totals, led by senior forward Trent Campbell (7-9=16) and junior defenseman Derek A. Smith (3-11=14). Freshman forward Nathan Perkovich (8-4=12), sophomore forward Troy Schwab (2-10=12), and senior forward Jeff Jakaitis (6-4=10). Schwab as a CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention pick last season with 24 points (8-16=24), second to Campbell's 26 points (14-12=26). Senior goaltender Jeff Jakaitis (6-4-1, 1.70 GAA, .949sv%) currently leads the CCHA in save percentage and is second in goals-against average. He ranks second and fourth in the nation, respectively, in those two categories. Jakaitis was a 2005-06 All-CCHA First-Team selection and was the Lakers' CCHA Scholar-Athlete of the Year. LSSU ranks eighth nationally in scoring defense (2.19 avg.) this week.

GAMES THIS WEEK

- **Teddy Bear Toss** – The annual Teddy Bear Toss for Toys For Tots will be held this Saturday (12/9) in conjunction with Ferris State's game versus Lake Superior State. Fans are encouraged to bring a teddy bear and throw onto the ice between the first and second periods. The teddy bears collected on the ice will be picked up by the Marines Toys For Tots and distributed to needy children in the local area for the Christmas Holiday.
- **Time Change** – The starting time for Ferris State's CCHA series contest against Northern Michigan on Saturday, Jan. 6, has been changed from 7:35 p.m. to 8:05 p.m. (EST) in order to accommodate live coverage of the game by College Sports Television (CSTV). CSTV will also televise the Bulldogs' Jan. 26th league tilt at Michigan.
- **No Place Like Home** – Senior left wing **Matt Verdone (Summerstown, Ontario)** has produced a team-best eight points (3-5=8) in nine home outings this season. In comparison, he has been scoreless in six away encounters. Verdone posted a team-high four points (3-1=4) in last season's four-game series versus Lake Superior State.
- **Forward Switch** – Senior defenseman **Joe Van Culin's (Monticello, Minn.)** last three game appearances have been as a member on a forward line. Three of his season's six points (3-3=6) are the result of goals, which included his most recent lamplighter last Friday (12/1) at Miami (Ohio). His current points total this campaign already equals his 2005-06 season's production of six points (1-5=6) in 36 games.
- **The Soo Connection** – A pair of Bulldogs, junior defenseman **Jim Jorgensen (Sault Ste. Marie)** and junior goaltender **Derek MacIntyre (Stanwood)** both played juniors (2002-04) for the Soo Kewadin Indians of the North American Hockey League (NAHL). Associate head coach **Drew Famulak**, who's in his 14th season at FSU, lettered two years at Lake Superior State (1986-88) and was inducted into the Lakers' Athletics Hall of Fame as a member of the LSSU 1987-88 national championship team on Oct. 22, 2005.
- **Streak Extended** – **Jim Jorgensen** extended his current scoring streak to three with an assist in last Friday's (12/1) game at Miami (Ohio) and then added two more helpers in Saturday's (12/2) rematch against the RedHawks. Jorgensen has also tallied three lamplighters in 14 outings this campaign, which already represents a personal career single-season high. He scored two goals in 34 games as a freshman in the 2004-05 season.
- **On Ice Improvement** – Sophomore left wing **Brendan Connolly's (Canmore, Alberta)** eight points (3-5=8) in 14 contests this season marks a personal career best, bettering his seven points (1-6=7) in 36 outings a campaign ago. His power-play goal in last Saturday's (12/2) game at Miami (Ohio) snapped an 10-game goal-scoring drought.
- **Double-Digit Scorers** – Senior right wing **Zac Pearson (White Lake)** and sophomore center **Dan Riedel (Rochester Hills)**, the Bulldogs' two skaters with double-digit points to date this season, have combined to generate 19.3% (21-109) of the squad's present points production. Riedel (11-20=31) and Pearson (6-20=26) finished third and fourth in 2005-06 team scoring, respectively.
- **Pearson's Points** – **Zac Pearson**, who had a goal and an assist in last Friday's (12/1) Miami game to go with another helper in Saturday's (12/2) affair, has produced five points (2-3=5) during his current three-game point string. He has totaled at least a point in eight of 13 contests this campaign.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 15th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-07 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories and 29th in winning percentage.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

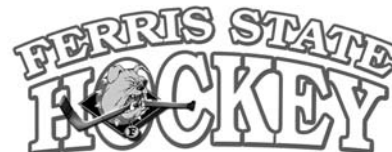
