GAME 20-21 ▲ 2006-07 SEASON

THIS WEEKEND: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will resume Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) action this weekend (Jan. 5-6) as the Bulldogs travel to Michigan's Upper Peninsula for a two-game series against Northern Michigan University Wildcats at Marquette, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 8:05 p.m. (EST)/Berry Events Center (3,902).

BROADCAST INFORMATION: All of Ferris State's 2005-06 league games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the play-by-play. The contests can be accessed via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports. Live internet stats are available on the CCHA website at <http://ccha.collegesports.com> and clicking on the Games/Results section near the CCHA standings. **TELEVISION BROADCAST:** This Saturday's (Jan. 6) contest will be televised live on College Sports Television (CSTV) – (DirecTV channel 610 and Dish Network channel 152).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is presently 4-12-3 overall and 2-9-2 in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) this season. The Bulldogs are coming off a 5-2 loss to the nationally number-one ranked Minnesota Golden Gophers last Saturday (Dec. 30) in the championship game of the 16th annual Dodge Holiday Classic at UM's Mariucci Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. The Bulldogs are 1-5-1 in away encounters this season. Ferris, which is 1-4-2 in its last seven contests, advanced to the title game with a shootout win over Massachusetts in Friday's (Dec. 29) semifinal-round game as both teams skated to a 1-1 overtime tie.

◀ Last season, Ferris State was 17-15-8 overall which included a sixth place-tying 10-11-7 CCHA record. The Bulldogs were 8-6-4 at home, 8-8-3 on the road and 1-1-1 at neutral sites.

Northern Michigan is 7-12-2 overall and 4-9-1 in the CCHA to date following a pair of league road losses to nationally-ranked Notre Dame last weekend (Dec. 30-31). The Wildcats suffered a 4-3 loss to ND last Saturday (Dec. 30) at the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum in Fort Wayne, Ind. NMU then dropped a 4-2 decision to the Fighting Irish in Sunday's (Dec. 31) rematch at UND's Joyce Center in Notre Dame, Ind. The Wildcats are presently 2-7-0 in their last nine encounters. NMU is 3-5-1 at home this

season. The 'Cats are among other teams receiving votes in this week's U.S. *College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll.

◀ NMU finished 22-16-2 overall for the 2005-06 season, which included a fourth-place tying 14-12-2 CCHA mark

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 15th season, 229-276-51 (.459) – (12-18-1 vs. Northern Michigan – 7-9-0 Away, 4-9-1 Home, 1-0-0 Neutral). **Northern Michigan** – **Walt Kyle** (Northern Michigan, 1981), 5th season, 94-72-17 (.560) – (8-3-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT NORTHERN MICHIGAN: The Wildcats are led in scoring by junior forward Mike Santorelli (15-11=26) and senior forward Darin Olver (6-12=18), who are among five NMU skaters with double-digit points totals. Northern Michigan ranks 21st nationally in scoring defense (2.76 avg.). Junior forward Matt Siddall (3-10=13), sophomore forward Nick Sirota (6-4=10), and freshman defenseman T.J. Miller (1-9=10) have also compiled double-digit points totals. Senior Bill Zaniboni (6-12-2, 2.56 GAA, .908sv%) has been the regular in net for the 'Cats this season.

➤ **Favorable Results** – Ferris State advanced to the championship game of the 16th annual Dodge Holiday Classic last Saturday (12/30) against host Minnesota after winning a 3-1 shootout versus Massachusetts in the tourney's semifinal round (12/29). The two teams in a 1-1 overtime deadlock which forced a shootout. FSU received shootout goals from senior right wing **Zac Pearson (White Lake)**, senior left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** and sophomore center **Matt Frank (Billings, Mont.)**. A season ago, Ferris lost in a shootout to Boston College (12/30) at the 14th annual Wells Fargo Denver Cup as teams played to a 3-3 overtime tie.

➤ **Bomer Is Back** – **Mark Bomersback** made his first game appearance since the Bulldogs' season opener versus Union (10/6) when the assistant captain played in both outings of the Dodge Holiday Classic (12/29-30). Bomersback, the team's top returning scorer from last season with 32 points (16-16=32) in 40 games, suffered a broken leg injury in the Union contest. He presently has compiled 74 career points (31-43=74) in 119 contests. He assisted on FSU's first goal against Minnesota.

➤ **Quick Study** – Sophomore right wing **Corey Couturier (Traverse City)** wasn't little time getting into the scoring column as he tallied a power-play lamplighter against Minnesota at the Dodge Holiday Classic in only his second outing this season. Couturier, who missed the first half of this season due to a violation of team rules, placed ninth among FSU's scoring leaders last year with 15 points (8-7=15) in 35 games.

➤ **Got Shorty** – Senior left wing **Matt Verdone (Summerstown, Ontario)** tallied Ferris State's first short-handed goal this season against Massachusetts. The last FSU skater to post a short-hander was Greg Rallo versus Western Michigan (2/4/06) in a 7-2 Bulldog victory.

➤ **Firepower** – The Bulldogs have outshot their opponent in 14 contests this season, including the last four to date. Ferris is averaging 34.3 shots per game this season to its opponent's 27.1 for a 7.2 differential. In its last four outings, FSU has averaged 39.3 shots on net (157 total) a contest.

➤ **The Big Three** – Ferris State's top three scoring leaders this season, **Zac Pearson** (5-8=13), sophomore center **Dan Riedel** (3-8=11), and sophomore **Chris Zarb** (0-11=11), have accounted for 28.9% (35-121) of the team's points production this campaign. Pearson has tallied a point or more in five of FSU's last seven contests while producing seven points (2-5=7) in that period.

➤ **Dozen Plus One** – Sophomore goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almonte, Ontario)** is only 13 saves away from moving into an 11th-place tie with Phil Osaer (1998-01) among Ferris State's all-time saves leaders. O'Keefe, the 2005-06 FSU Rookie of the Year, has made 1,260 career saves in 52 appearances and has averaged 24.2 stops a game during that span.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 15th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-07 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories and 29th in winning percentage.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
