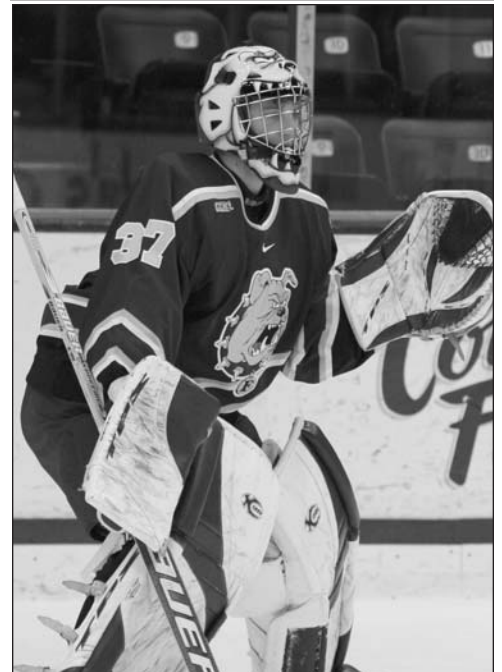

2006-07: A big, standout netminder . . . Will vie for top goaltending duties . . . Could be one of the CCHA's top netminders after playing at times last season as one . . . Technically-solid . . .
